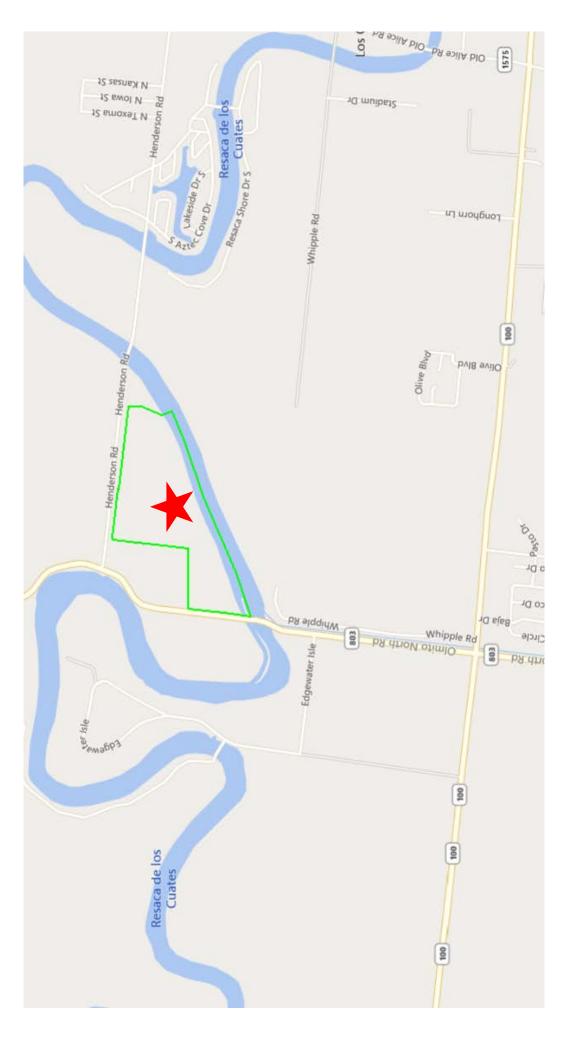

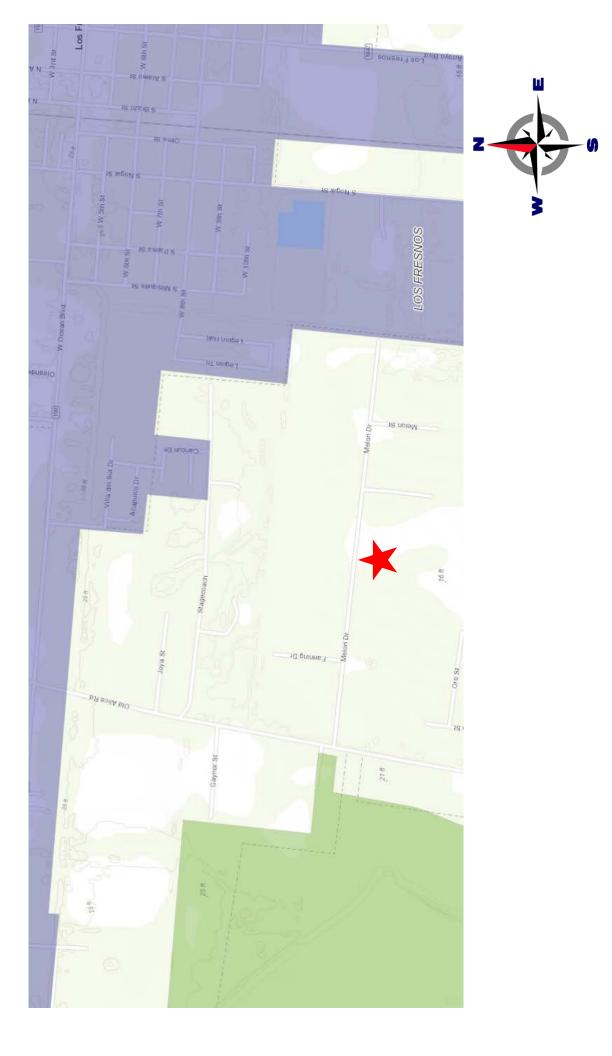

# How some Texas cities and retailers are using a tax loophole to snatch sales tax revenue from other communities

By Glenn Hegar

Nobody likes paying taxes, but at least in the case of local sales taxes, you expect that the money is going to address the needs of your community. Those taxes should help ease traffic congestion, remove graffiti or fix the potholes that threaten your car's suspension.

Wherever you thought that money was going, I'll bet you never imagined that your taxes were being shipped off to another community to fix their potholes, lower their property taxes or even provide a rebate of the local tax dollars you've paid back to a single business in a community far away. But in some cases, that's exactly what's happening in Texas.

In fact, some cities and businesses have cut deals to source local sales tax on sales made over the internet solely to particular cities. In exchange, a business may be rebated those tax dollars in some cases 75% — money that taxpayers across Texas expect to stay in their own communities. Instead, the money is going to a handful of cities and businesses who have these arrangements to fund their budgets and bottom lines.

In my ongoing work to clarify sales tax policy in the online era, some of these arrangements came to light. My staff continues to analyze which and how many cities are using this loophole to capture tax revenue that ought to go elsewhere.

I don't fault businesses for trying to boost their bottom line, and I don't fault cities that enter into these economic development agreements, but my duty is ultimately to the taxpayers. Taxpayers do not pay local sales tax on internet purchases with the expectation that the revenue is then being distributed to businesses and cities nowhere near their communities.

Here is how these agreements may work: a business may establish a single facility, like a "customer service center," and claim that facility receives internet orders, even though the internet orders are handled and shipped from a separate fulfillment center that may not even be in Texas. Under this arrangement, all the local online sales tax revenue from across the state ends up in the community with the "customer service center," regardless of where the item is delivered or picked up in Texas.

On top of that, the city with the "customer service center," as part of the economic development agreement, may give most of the money back to the business. That means you and all the other taxpayers who thought they were supporting local needs are actually subsidizing a business that may only have a minor footprint somewhere far from your schools and roads and parks.

As a result, cities that aren't party to these deals — which is the large majority of Texas cities — are losing revenue they need

to provide services to the taxpayers who actually made the purchases. More importantly, the taxpayers who expect these local sales tax dollars to stay in their communities are sending them elsewhere.

That's why my office has proposed a change to Rule 3.334 to clarify that local sales tax is tied to the place of business from which internet orders are fulfilled or the location to which items are shipped or delivered.

The tax code's current definition makes it clear that a "place of business" is an actual location operated by the retailer for the purpose of receiving orders. It's a place a customer can visit or call to place an order. This definition, or a version of it, has been in state law since before 1980. We don't need to change the law, we just need some clarity in its interpretation.

Internet orders are placed through a website or software application, neither of which meet the definition of a place of business in the way a traditional business does: You can't call the internet. You can't walk into the internet.

This clarification would ensure that Texas' 1,600-plus cities and other local government entities receive the local tax revenue from online purchases to which they're entitled. It's not a small issue; in January, \$763.8 million in monthly sales tax revenue was distributed to Texas local governments, of which 1,200-plus cities received \$488.7 million.

Even with our rule change, there will be numerous instances in which the local sales tax is sourced to the place where the order is fulfilled rather than the customer's location. This rule just makes it much more difficult for businesses and cities to manipulate local sales taxes to their own benefit at the expense of other cities.

My office isn't going to pull the rug out without giving cities with these agreements fair warning. There will be a grace period to help ease the transition.

Recent trends show that internet sales are not only growing but accelerating at an eye-popping rate. We must act now before this gets out of control. If we do not, local sales tax revenue will continue to be shifted away from its intended beneficiaries.

This loophole doesn't represent truth in taxation. Instead, it's the worst possible combination for taxpayers: You're still paying the tax, but you're getting no benefit. And your roads will still have potholes that need to be fixed.

This Interlocal Cooperation Contract (Contract) is entered into between the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas (DPS), an agency of the State of Texas and the <u>Municipal</u> Court of the [City or County] of <u>Los Fresnos</u> (Court), a political subdivision of the State of Texas, referred to collectively in this Contract as the Parties, under the authority granted in Tex. Transp. Code Chapter 706 and Tex. Gov't Code Chapter 791 (the Interlocal Cooperation Act).

### II. BACKGROUND

As permitted under Tex. Transp. Code § 706.008, DPS contracts with a private vendor (Vendor) to provide and establish an automated FTA system that accurately stores information regarding violators subject to the provisions of Tex. Transp. Code Chapter 706. DPS uses the FTA system to properly deny renewal of a driver license to a person who is the subject of an FTA system entry.

### III. PURPOSE

This Contract applies to each FTA Report submitted by the Court to DPS or its Vendor and accepted by DPS or its Vendor.

Court will supply information to DPS, through its Vendor, that is necessary to deny renewal of the driver license of a person who fails to appear for a complaint or citation or fails to pay or satisfy a judgment ordering payment of a fine and cost in the manner ordered by the Court in a matter involving any offense that Court has jurisdiction of under Tex. Code Crim. Proc. Chapter 4.

### IV. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

This Contract will be effective on the date of execution and will automatically renew on the anniversary date of execution for up to three additional years unless terminated earlier.

### V. COURT RESPONSIBILITIES

### A. Written warnings

A peace officer authorized to issue citations within the jurisdiction of the Court must issue a written warning to each person to whom the officer issues a citation for a traffic law violation. This warning must be provided in addition to any other warnings required by law. The warning must state in substance that if the person fails to appear in court for the prosecution of the offense or if the person fails to pay or satisfy a judgment ordering the payment of a fine and cost in the manner ordered by the Court, the person may be denied

renewal of the person's driver license. The written warning may be printed on the citation or on a separate instrument.

### B. FTA Report

An FTA Report is a notice sent by Court requesting a person be denied renewal in accordance with this Contract. The Court may submit an FTA Report to Vendor if a person fails to appear or fails to pay or satisfy a judgment as required by law. There is no requirement that a criminal warrant be issued in response to the person's failure to appear. The Court must make reasonable efforts to ensure that all FTA Reports are accurate, complete, and non-duplicative. The FTA Report must include the following information:

- 1. the jurisdiction in which the alleged offense occurred;
- 2. the name of the court submitting the report;
- 3. the name, date of birth, and Texas driver license number of the person who failed to appear or failed to pay or satisfy a judgment;
- 4. the date of the alleged violation;
- 5. a brief description of the alleged violation;
- 6. a statement that the person failed to appear or failed to pay or satisfy a judgment as required by law;
- 7. the date that the person failed to appear or failed to pay or satisfy a judgment; and
- 8. any other information required by DPS.

### C. Clearance Reports

The Court that files the FTA Report has a continuing obligation to review the FTA Report and promptly submit appropriate additional information or reports to the Vendor. The clearance report must identify the person, state whether or not a fee was required, and advise DPS to lift the denial of renewal and state the grounds for the action. All clearance reports must be submitted immediately, but no later than two business days, from the time and date that the Court receives appropriate payment or other information that satisfies the person's obligation to that Court.

To the extent that a Court uses the FTA system by submitting an FTA Report, the Court must collect the statutorily required \$10.00 reimbursement fee. If the person is acquitted of the underlying offense for which the original FTA Report was filed, the Court will not require payment of the reimbursement fee.

Court must submit a clearance report for the following circumstances:

- 1. the perfection of an appeal of the case for which the warrant of arrest was issued or judgment arose;
- 2. the dismissal of the charge for which the warrant of arrest was issued or judgment arose;
- 3. the posting of a bond or the giving of other security to reinstate the charge for which the warrant was issued;
- 4. the payment or discharge of the fine and cost owed on an outstanding judgment of the Court; or

5. other suitable arrangement to pay the fine and cost within the Court's discretion.

DPS will not continue to deny renewal of the person's driver license after receiving notice from the Court that the FTA Report was submitted in error or has been destroyed in accordance with the Court's record retention policy.

### D. Quarterly Reports and Audits

Court must submit quarterly reports to DPS in a format established by DPS.

Court is subject to audit and inspection at any time during normal business hours and at a mutually agreed upon location by the state auditor, DPS, and any other department or agency, responsible for determining that the Parties have complied with the applicable laws. Court must provide all reasonable facilities and assistance for the safe and convenient performance of any audit or inspection.

Court must correct any non-conforming transactions performed by the Court, at its own cost, until acceptable to DPS.

Court must keep all records and documents regarding this Contract for the term of this Contract and for seven years after the termination of this Contract.

### E. Accounting Procedures

Court must keep separate, accurate, and complete records of the funds collected and disbursed and must deposit the funds in the appropriate municipal or county treasury. Court may deposit such fees in an interest-bearing account and retain the interest earned on such accounts for the Court.

Court will allocate \$6.00 of each \$10.00 reimbursement fee received for payment to the Vendor and \$4.00 for credit to the general fund of the municipal or county treasury.

### F. Non-Waiver of Fees

Court will not waive the \$10.00 reimbursement fee for any person that has been submitted on an FTA Report, unless the person is deemed to be indigent, or the person is acquitted of the charges for which the person failed to appear.

Failure to comply with this section will result in: (i) termination of this Contract for cause; and (ii) the removal of all outstanding entries of the Court in the FTA Report, resulting in the lifting of any denied driver license renewal status from DPS.

### G. Litigation Notice

The Court must make a good-faith attempt to immediately notify DPS in the event that the Court becomes aware of litigation in which this Contract or Tex. Transp. Code Chapter 706 is subject to constitutional, statutory, or common-law challenge, or is struck down by judicial decision.

### VI. PAYMENTS TO VENDOR

Court must pay the Vendor a fee of \$6.00 per person for each violation which has been reported to the Vendor and for which the Court has subsequently collected the statutorily required \$10.00 reimbursement fee. In the event that the person has been acquitted of the underlying charge or is indigent, no payment will be made to the Vendor or required of the Court.

Court agrees that payment will be made to the Vendor no later than the last day of the month following the close of the calendar quarter in which the payment was received by the Court.

DPS will not pay Vendor for any fees collected by Court.

### VII. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. Compliance with Law. The Court understands and agrees that it will comply with all local, state, and federal laws in the performance of this Contract, including administrative rules adopted by DPS.
- **B. Contract Amendment.** DPS and Court may amend this Contract through a written amendment signed by an authorized signatory on behalf of the respective party.
- C. Notice. The respective party will send the other party notice as noted in this section.

D. Termination. Either party may terminate this Contract with 30 days' written notice. DPS may also terminate this Contract for cause if Court doesn't comply with Section V.F., Non-Waiver of Fees. After termination, the Court has a continuing obligation to report dispositions and collect fees for all violators in the FTA system at the time of termination. Failure to comply with the continuing obligation to report will result in the removal of all

outstanding entries of the Court in the FTA Report, resulting in the lifting of any denied driver license renewal status from DPS.

### VIII. CERTIFICATIONS

The Parties certify that (1) the Contract is authorized by the governing body of each party; (2) the purpose, terms, rights, and duties of the Parties are stated within the Contract; and (3) each party will make payments for the performance of governmental functions or services from current revenues available to the paying party.

- 10. Increase the effectiveness of directed action missions based upon intelligence and analysis to ensure they target the most serious threats and are conducted in high pay-off areas.
- 11. Increase the number and quality of analytical intelligence products developed at the Unified Command and state levels.

# **Eligible Activities and Costs**

#### 1. PERSONNEL - OVERTIME

- a) Overtime for increased patrol and/or investigative capacity for certified peace officers.
- b) Overtime for law enforcement support personnel. These costs may include overtime for personnel necessary to support officers that are on patrol and participating in border security operations, such as Jailer overtime, or Communications Officer/Dispatcher overtime, necessary to maintain a safe Officer to Dispatcher ratio.
- c) Overtime for non-exempt administrative personnel supporting border security grants.
- d) Overtime for law enforcement support and administrative personnel should be limited and anything greater than 10% may not be funded or may require significant additional data and justification.
- e) Applicants must provide a copy of the local overtime policy as approved by its governing board. This policy will be considered the official policy for grant purposes and must be used throughout the grant period. The policy must:
  - i. Clearly describe how overtime will be calculated;
  - ii. Be consistent with the agency's local overtime policy;
  - iii. Treat overtime for grant-paid personnel the same as non-grant paid personnel.
- f) Project Overtime (OT) shall be reimbursed following the grantee's overtime policy and the requirements as stated below:
  - i. OT is time actually worked that exceeds the required number of hours during an employee's designated work period, as per grantee's policies and procedures.
  - ii. OT must be worked to support border security operations.
  - iii. The project OT rate shall be no more than one-and-one-half (1.5) times the employee's regular pay rate.
  - iv. Exempt salaried employees working border security operations may be reimbursed for overtime only if the grantee's overtime policy specifically allows for this.
  - v. HSGD will only reimburse the grantee for OT that does not exceed a total of 16 hours worked (regular plus OT) during any 24-hour period.

#### 2. PERSONNEL - REGULAR or STRAIGHT-TIME

- a) Augmentees: Personnel costs for law enforcement personnel who are not regular employees of a funded agency, but are brought on as needed to specifically cover border security operations so that there can be a force multiplier during a period of "surge."
- b) Regular time for law enforcement personnel working border operations. Grant funds must be used to supplement existing funds and not supplant funds that have been budgeted for the same purpose.
- c) Part-time to Full-Time: Personnel costs for part-time law enforcement personnel in order to bring them to temporary full-time status.



d) Regular time for administrative personnel supporting border security grant activities.

3. **EQUIPMENT**: Costs for equipment, or the rental of equipment, which will benefit the border security mission and will be routinely utilized during border security operations.

4. **SUPPLIES and DIRECT OPERATING EXPENSE**: Certain operational costs are also allowable, such as vehicle operating costs or costs for minor emergency repairs as described below, or for other services pre-approved by the HSGD that are critical to success of the program.

- a) The cost of fuel, lubricants, and minor emergency repairs or maintenance for vehicles, aircraft, boats, generators, and similar equipment used during the hours in which grant-funded staff are working.
- b) Only actual expenses supported by invoiced gas, oil, and repair or maintenance receipts may be reimbursed under this grant.
- c) Maintenance costs must be prorated to show the usage of vehicles or equipment for regular law enforcement duties as compared to usage while officers are working grant-paid patrols.
- d) The cost of minor emergency repairs, such as tire repair or fan belt replacement, to vehicles or equipment used in program operations is allowable.

# **Program-Specific Requirements**

- 1. Eligible applicants must agree to perform the following activities:
  - Participate in operational planning and coordination meetings, information/intelligence sharing meetings, and After Action Reviews (AARs) established by the Texas Department of Public Safety's (DPS) Joint Operations and Intelligence Centers (JOIC).
  - b) Participate weekly on the JOIC Unified Command conference calls or meetings as required by the JOIC.
  - c) Report significant border-related events that occur during each 24-hour period.
  - d) Conduct enhanced law enforcement patrolling activities.
  - e) Recognize and react to information/intelligence to adjust times and locations of enhanced patrol activities.
  - f) Identify significant border-related trends or areas of interest that may be developed into focus areas for future operations.
  - g) Conduct surveillance, interdictions, investigations, and collect and disseminate information within its jurisdiction or cross-jurisdiction lines as required.
  - h) Conduct Steady State operations and respond to calls for service.
  - i) Integrate air, ground, marine, and remote operations.
- 2. Eligible applicants must agree to submit the daily Border Incident Assessment Report (BIAR).

The grantee shall report all border-related events to the JOIC using the BIAR. BIAR reporting shall include events that occur during Enhanced Operation activities AND events that occur during Steady State activities. Enhanced (Surge) Operations originate out of the use of LBSP funds when the local agency chooses to increase the hours of patrol or the number of investigative bodies. Steady State activities are defined as normal patrol or investigative duties that do not use grant funds, but directly impact the overall LBSP mission, such as organized crime arrests, terroristic activities, weapons trafficking arrests, kidnappings, human trafficking, human smuggling, home invasions with a border or organized crime nexus, illegal immigration, border-related murders, gang-related murders, vehicle thefts, or drug trafficking.

The BIAR is the primary incident and information-reporting tool for the grantee in local border security operations. The grantee shall ensure all BIARs conform to the respective standards outlined by the JOIC and are submitted within 24 hours of the end of shift and/or the timeframes established by the JOIC.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Entities receiving funds from HSGD must be located in a county that has an average of 90% or above on both adult and juvenile dispositions entered into the computerized criminal history database maintained by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) as directed in the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Chapter 66. This disposition completeness percentage is defined as the percentage of arrest charges a county reports to DPS for which a disposition has been subsequently reported and entered into the computerized criminal history system.
- 2. Beginning January 1, 2020, counties applying for grant awards from the Office of the Governor must commit that the county will report at least 90 percent of convictions within seven business days to the Criminal Justice Information System at the Department of Public Safety. By January 1, 2021, such reporting must take place within five business days.
- 3. Eligible applicants operating a law enforcement agency must be current on reporting Part I violent crime data to the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) for inclusion in the annual Uniform Crime Report (UCR). To be considered eligible for funding, applicants must have submitted a full twelve months of accurate data to DPS for the most recent calendar year.
- 4. The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) has established a goal set by the Texas Legislature for all local law enforcement agencies to implement and report crime statistics data by using the requirements of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Additionally, the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) will collect required crime statistics solely through the NIBRS starting January 1, 2021. Due to the upcoming federal deadline, grantees are advised that eligibility for future grant funding may be tied to compliance with NIBRS. Financial grant assistance for transitioning to NIBRS may be available for your jurisdiction from the Public Safety Office.
- 5. Local units of government, including cities, counties and other general purpose political subdivisions, as appropriate, and institutions of higher education that operate a law enforcement agency, must comply with all aspects of the programs and procedures utilized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") to: (1) notify DHS of all information requested by DHS related to illegal aliens in Agency's custody; and (2) detain such illegal aliens in accordance with requests by DHS. Additionally, counties and municipalities may NOT have in effect, purport to have in effect, or make themselves subject to or bound by, any law, rule, policy, or practice (written or unwritten) that would: (1) require or authorize the public disclosure of federal law enforcement information in order to conceal, harbor, or shield from detection fugitives from justice or aliens illegally in the United States; or (2) impede federal officers from exercising authority under 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a), § 1226(c), § 1231(a), § 1357(a), § 1366(1), or § 1366(3). Lastly, eligible applicants must comply with all provisions, policies, and penalties found in Chapter 752, Subchapter C of the Texas Government Code.

Each local unit of government, and institution of higher education that operates a law enforcement agency, must download, complete and then upload into eGrants the <u>CEO/Law</u> <u>Enforcement Certifications and Assurances Form</u> certifying compliance with federal and state immigration enforcement requirements. This Form is required for each application submitted to OOG and is active until August 31, 2021 or the end of the grant period, whichever is later.



- Eligible applicants must have a DUNS (Data Universal Numbering System) number assigned to its agency (to request a DUNS number, go to <u>http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform/displayHomePage.do</u>).
- 7. Eligible applicants must be registered in the federal System for Award Management (SAM) database located at <a href="https://sam.gov/">https://sam.gov/</a>.

Failure to comply with program eligibility requirements may cause funds to be withheld and/or suspension or termination of grant funds.

### **Prohibitions**

Grant funds may **not** be used to support the unallowable costs listed in the <u>Guide to Grants</u> or any of the following unallowable costs:

- 1. inherently religious activities such as prayer, worship, religious instruction, or proselytization;
- 2. lobbying;
- 3. any portion of the salary of, or any other compensation for, an elected or appointed government official;
- 4. backfill costs for personnel participating in operations;
- 5. vehicles or equipment for government agencies that are for general agency use;
- 6. weapons, ammunition, tasers, or explosives;
- 7. admission fees or tickets to any amusement park, recreational activity or sporting event;
- 8. promotional gifts;
- 9. food, meals, beverages, or other refreshments, except for eligible per diem associated with grant-related travel;
- 10. membership dues for individuals;
- 11. any expense or service that is readily available at no cost to the grant project;
- 12. any use of grant funds to replace (supplant) funds that have been budgeted for the same purpose through non-grant sources;
- 13. fundraising;
- 14. construction;
- 15. medical services;
- 16. legal services for adult offenders; and
- 17. any other prohibition imposed by federal, state, or local law.

# **Selection Process**

**Application Screening:** HSGD will screen all applications to ensure that they meet the requirements included in the funding announcement. HSGD will make all final funding decisions as described below.

**Peer/Merit Review:** Applications will be reviewed by HSGD staff in consultation with DPS Regional JOIC representatives. Funding decisions will be based on eligibility and operational content, which includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1. Compliance Past compliance with grant requirements, reporting, and information sharing.
- Performance Impact and effectiveness of the Applicant's participation in previous border security operations or activities, and effectiveness in using grant funds awarded for border security.



- 3. Risk The Applicant's need as indicated by data available on border-related criminal activity, population, number of officers, and other factors.
- 4. Other Funding The Applicant's history of applying for, receiving, and/or effectively utilizing other sources of funding available to support border security activities (e.g. Operation Stonegarden).

**Final Decisions – All Projects:** The Executive Director will consider rankings along with other factors and make all final funding decisions. Other factors may include cost effectiveness, overall funds availability, HSGD or state government priorities and strategies.

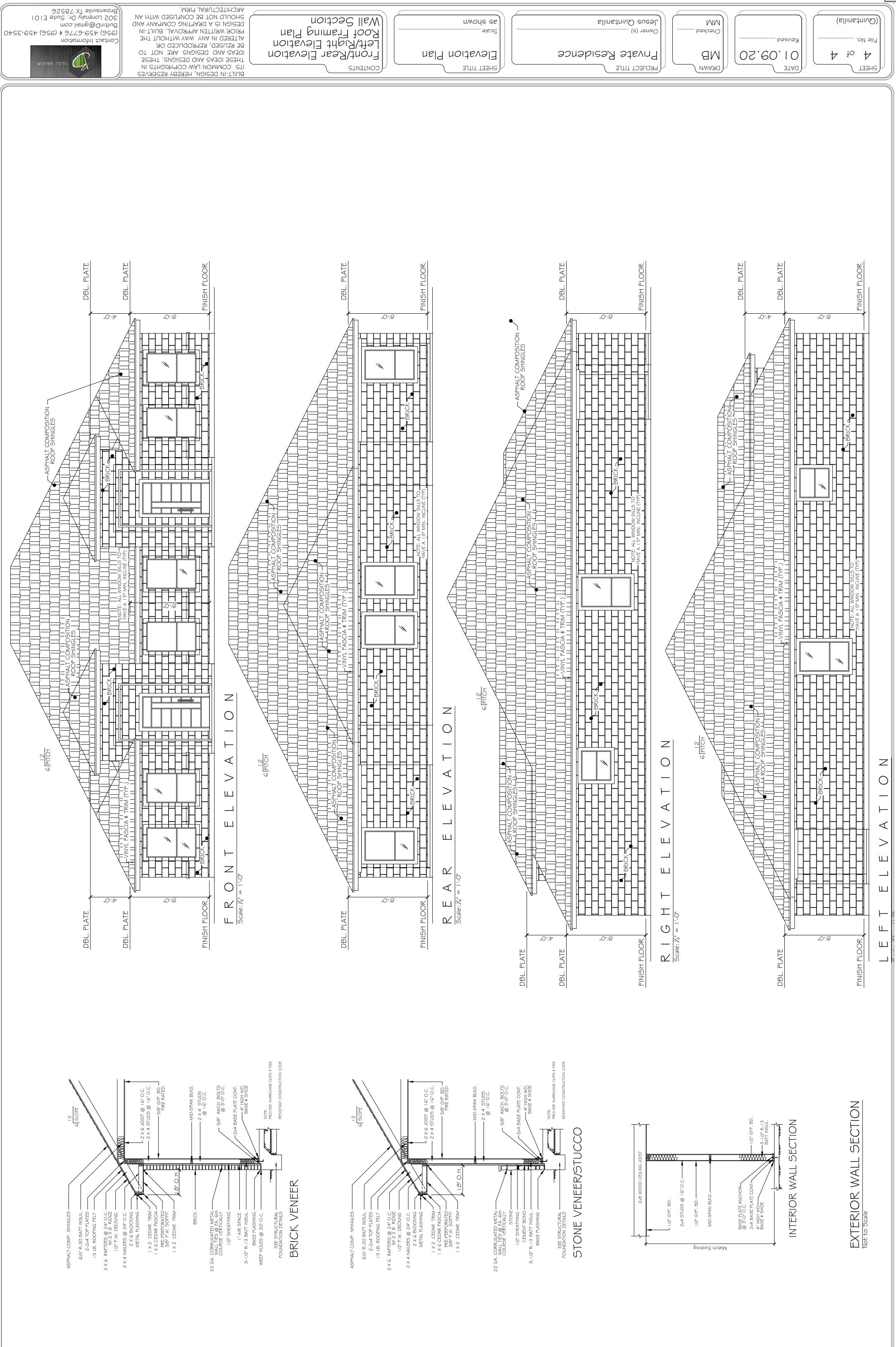

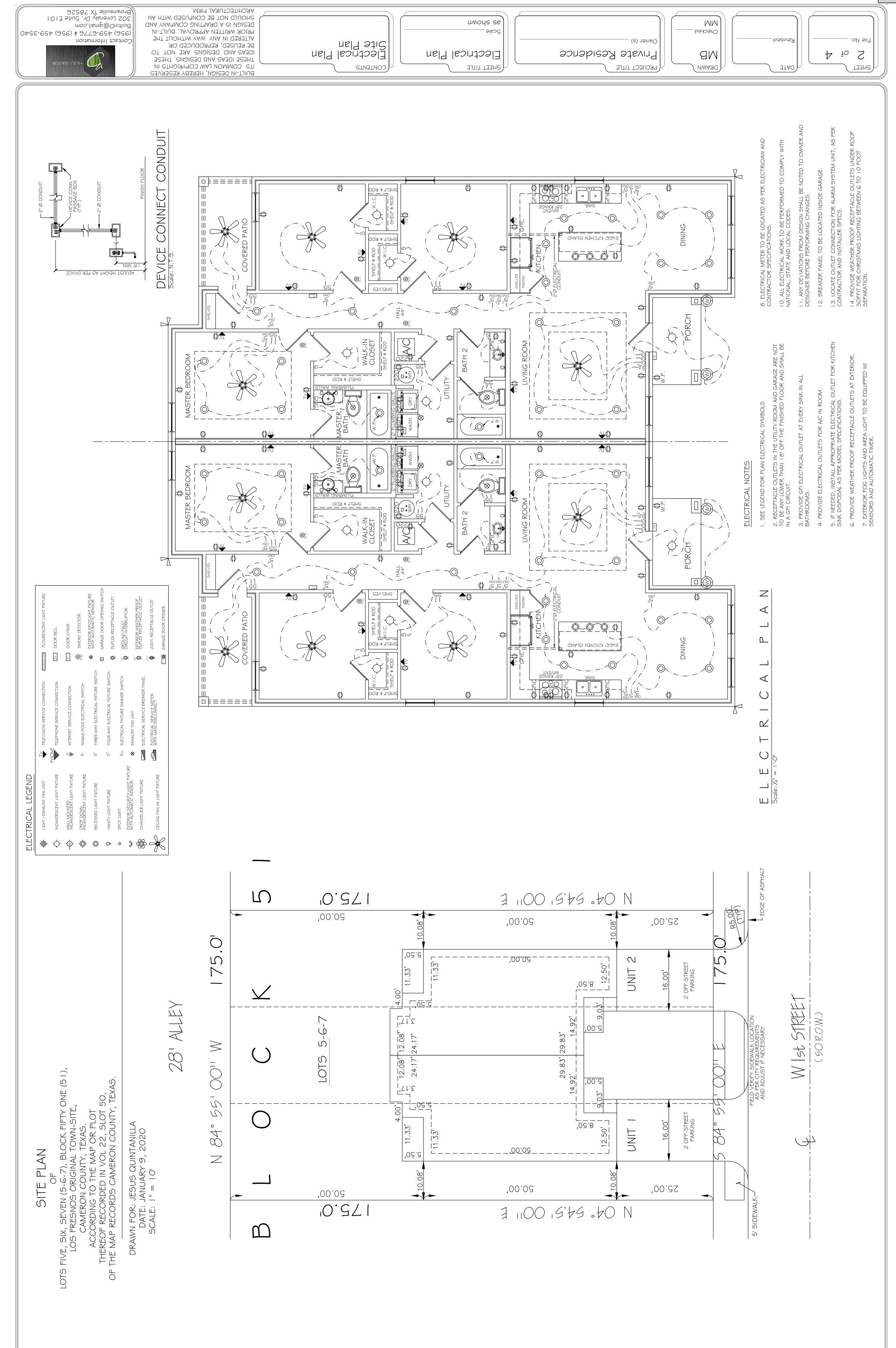

WHEREAS, the Issuer intends to reimburse itself, within eighteen months from the later of the date of expenditure or the date the property financed is placed in service (but in no event more than three years after the original expenditures are paid), for the prior lawful capital expenditure of funds from the proceeds of one or more series of tax-exempt obligations (the *Obligations*) that the Issuer currently contemplates issuing in the principal amount of not to exceed \$3,627,000 to finance a portion of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, under the Regulations, to fund such reimbursement with proceeds of the Obligations, the Issuer must declare its expectation ultimately to make such reimbursement before making the expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer hereby finds and determines that the reimbursement for the prior expenditure of funds of the Issuer is not inconsistent with the Issuer's budgetary and financial circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby finds and determines that the adoption of this Resolution is in the best interests of the residents of the Issuer; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. This Resolution is a declaration of intent to establish the Issuer's reasonable, official intent under section 1.150-2 of the Regulations and Section 1201.042 to reimburse itself from certain of the proceeds of the Obligations for any capital expenditures previously incurred (not more than 60 days prior to the date hereof) or to be incurred with respect to the Project from the Issuer's General Fund or other lawfully available funds of the Issuer.

SECTION 2. The Issuer intends to issue the Obligations and allocate within 30 days after the date of issuance of the Obligations the proceeds therefrom to reimburse the Issuer for prior lawful expenditures with respect to the Project in a manner to comply with the Regulations.

SECTION 3. The reimbursed expenditure will be a type properly chargeable to a capital account (or would be so chargeable with a proper election) under general federal income tax principles.

SECTION 4. The Issuer intends to otherwise comply, in addition to those matters addressed within this Resolution, with all the requirements contained in the Regulations.

SECTION 5. This Resolution may be relied upon by the appropriate officials at the Office of the Attorney General for the State of Texas and establishes compliance by the Issuer with the requirements of Texas law and the Regulations.

SECTION 6. With respect to the proceeds of the Obligations allocated to reimburse the Issuer for prior expenditures, the Issuer shall not employ an abusive device under Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-10, including using within one year of the reimbursement allocation, the funds corresponding to the proceeds of the Obligations in a manner that results in the creation of "replacement proceeds", as defined in Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1, of the Obligations or another issue of tax-exempt obligations.

SECTION 7. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Governing Body.

SECTION 8. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

SECTION 9. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

SECTION 10. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the Governing Body hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

SECTION 11. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 12. This Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

The Council asked me to get with TxDot to conduct a speed survey on the west side of the City since Wal-Mart as well as tons of other development has occurred in the last few years. It has taken them about 2 years to get it done. The yellow is what is proposed to be added. The red is what is proposed to be deleted. I have a map that I will share to show specific speeds for the study. In summary from O'Reilley's Auto Parts to just past Tapia's Cafe, it is proposed to be 45 miles per hour and from that point to the west city limits it is proposed to be 55 miles per hour.

The other sections that show changes are just cleaning it up to make it easier to understand.

The City of Los Fresnos Code of ordinance Chapter 42, Article I, Section 42-6 Speed Limits is amended to reflect as follows:

A. Beginning at 53' East of Edgewater Isle (Los Fresnos West City Limits) to 607' West of Longhorn Lane, the maximum speed limit shall be 55 mph. From 607' West of Longhorn Lane to 58' West of Mesquite Street, the maximum speed limit shall be 45 mph. School zone will be beginning at 359' West of Holly Lane to 158' East of FM 1575 (Old Alice Rd.) and will be 35 mph when flashing and all other times be 45 mph. The maximum speed limit shall be 30 miles per hour on that portion of SH 100 within the city limits beginning 58' West of Mesquite Street at the west city limits line, east to the intersection of S.H. 100 and FM 1847 a point for the east city limits shall be 30 miles per hour. However, that the maximum speed limit on that portion of S.H. 100 from a point on S.H. 100, the point being 27 feet east of the centerline of Mesquite Street and proceeding east to a point 190 feet west of the centerline of Olmo Street, the maximum school speed limit shall be 20 miles per hour when the flashing school speed limit signs are in operation and 30 miles per hour at all other times. The maximum speed limit on that portion of S.H. 100 beginning at a point of the intersection of S.H. 100 and F.M. 1847 going east on S.H. 100 proceeding east to Retama Street right-of-way, the maximum speed limit shall be 35 miles per hour. The maximum speed limit from approximately Retama Street right-of-way proceeding east 0.250 miles the maximum speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour, the maximum speed limit from

that point proceeding east 0.903 miles shall be 60 miles per hour and then the next 0.170 miles shall be 65 miles per hour. Provided

- B. The maximum speed limit on that portion of FM 1847 within the city limits from the north city limits line, south to a point for the south city limits line shall be according to posted signs 30 miles per hour, except that the maximum speed limit on F.M. 1847 beginning 83 feet south of the centerline of First Street and proceeding north to a point 225 feet north of the centerline of Canal Street shall be 20 miles per hour when the flashing school speed limit signs are in operation and 30 miles per hour at all other times.
- C. The maximum speed limit on that portion of FM 2480 within the city limits from the northeast city limits line southwest to a point for the intersection with FM 1847, shall be 30 miles per hour.
- D. The maximum speed limit on all streets within Cuates Resaca Village Subdivision shall be 30 miles per hour.
- E. The maximum speed limit on that portion of Henderson Road inside the city limits shall be 30 miles per hour.
- F. The maximum speed limit for Hisbiscus Street from the beginning of the street where it connects to Arroyo Boulevard to the eastward most end of Hibiscus Street shall be ten miles per hour.
- G. The maximum speed limit on Mesquite Street beginning at the point of entry onto Mesquite Street at the intersection of Mesquite Street at the north side of S.H. 100 and extending northward on Mesquite Street to the intersection of Canal Street and the same distance in the opposite direction from the intersection of Canal Street and Mesquite Street southward to the intersection of Mesquite Street at the north side of S.H. 100 shall be 20 miles per hour.
- H. The maximum speed limit on Alamo Street within the city limits beginning at the point of entry onto Alamo Street at the intersection of Alamo Street and State Highway 100 and extending southward on Alamo Street to the intersection of West 10th Street and Alamo Street and the same distance in the opposite direction from the intersection of Alamo Street and West 10th Street northward to the intersection of Alamo Street and State Highway 100 shall be 20 miles per hour.
- I. The maximum speed limit on Canal Street beginning at the point of entry onto Canal Street at the intersection of Canal Street and F.M. 1847 and extending westward on Canal Street to the intersection of Mesquite Street and Canal Street and the same distance in the opposite direction from the intersection of Canal Street and Mesquite Street eastward to the intersection of Canal Street and F.M. 1847 shall be 20 miles per hour.

This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and upon the placement of the appropriate signs by the Texas Department of Transportation.

A violation of this ordinance or any part here of shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine up to \$500.00 per violation.

The City Secretary of the City of Los Fresnos is hereby authorized and directed to cause the contents of section 1 herein to be published, added and or deleted in the appropriate section of the Code of Ordinance of and for the City of Los Fresnos.

The City Secretary of the City of Los Fresnos is hereby authorized and directed to cause the caption of this ordinance to be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

If any part of this ordinance shall be declared to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such invalidity shall not affect the remaining parts of this ordinance and the balance of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect to the extent this ordinance is considered severable.

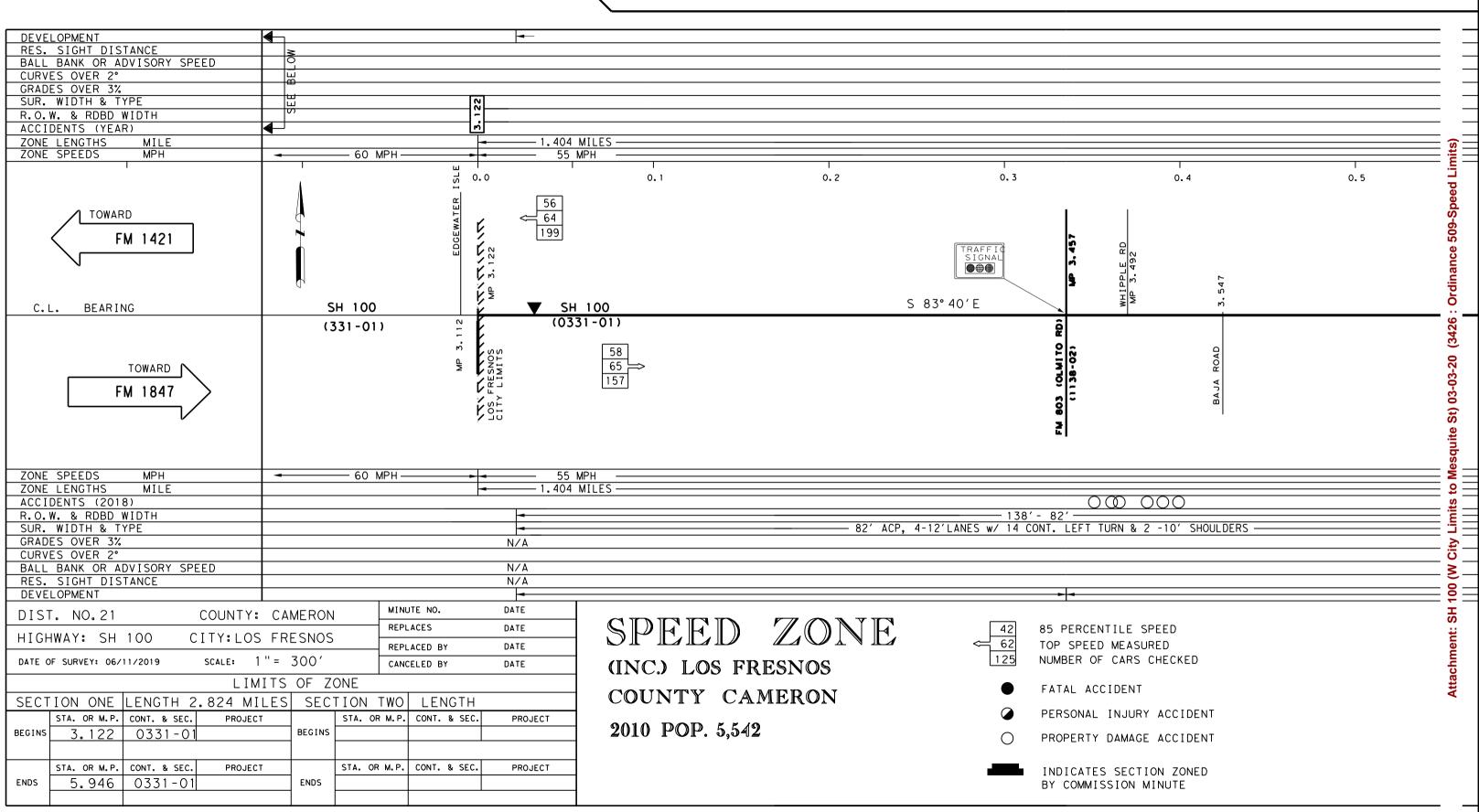

A. Wastewater Update - TWDB says we will be able to start the bidding process in the next month for the Chlorrine Contact Basin Project and the Headworks Project. We continue to work on the funding with TWDB to apply for the \$1,600,000 for wastewater to fix 3 lift stations, run sewer service to the new annexed areas on West Highway 100, replace some old manholes and replace some old sewer lines. Hanson Professional Services has the documents ready for us to advertise, bid, award contract and begin construction for the Whipple Road Wastewater Extension project. The City has to acquire the easements prior to that.

B. Water Update - We continue to work on the funding through TWDB to get the upgrades done on the water plant and distribution lines for \$3,700,000. We were able to qualify for a reduced interest rate of 1.65%. Once the final approval is received we will know the actual interest rate.

C. Nature Park - We have approximately \$67,040.30 in remaining funds available to complete the bird blind, the drip station and do some habitat restoration. Due to the extensive Brazilian Peppers that are not good for the area, we are working on getting them all removed. We are not sure the process we will take but we will coordinate with Texas Parks & Wildlife and possible some volunteer groups to make it happen. That needs to be the first order of business before we work on any bird blinds for bird watching or butterfly areas. The CDC approved funding so we can begin work on removing the Brazilian Peppers and work on installing plants and constructing blinds for the birding area and butterfly area. It is on this agenda for your approval.

D. Hike & Bike Trails - Half Associates and Carlos and I have gone over the documents one last time for a final review. We will send to TPW so they can give their final approval. Then we can bid.

E. CDBG Disaster Grant - The \$350,000 grant to pave East Tenth Street and part of Whipple Road is continuing. Hanson is working on the plans and specs.

F. Henderson Road Project - After meeting with Cameron County Irrigation District Number 6 we were able to reduce some sizes of the large boxes which will reduce the overall cost. We should have a schedule and begin actual work in the next few weeks.

G. Street Project - Most of the street work is complete. They will pave Brazil, Second and California Road this week to complete the project. Work looks terrific.

H. Census Committee - The Census committee is working on many things to get the word out to our residents. The school district is very involved and will provide a ton of help with this. We will push this hard once the 3/12/2020 comes since that is the first day folks can complete the Census.

I. Update Planning & Zoning Ordinance - Jackie and I are working on different options. Hopefully we can have a proposal by May. All we find currently is one that is approximately \$150,000. I feel that is too expensive. While ours needs updating, I don't believe it needs updating that much. We will continue to look.

J. Drainage Update - I have received easements from the owners of Pederson Construction and Community of Christ Church for the drainage ditch behind their properties. I am still waiting on Zarsky Lumber. Cameron County Drainage District # 1 will assume maintenance on the ditch to keep it clean. The owner on the north side of that drainage ditch that is the developer for Valle Alto will initially clean the ditch and create a larger detention area. This is all positive for that area. One of the drainage projects that was approved by the Council has begun. Hanson is working on the other. There is a proposal on this agenda to engineer the drainage for Resaca Escondida. If we can get the engineering part done we can then try to apply for some grants. We have sent a proposal to TWDB for possible funding for drainage work.

K. 75 Year Anniversary Celebration - We had a meeting last week. Attendance besides staff was low due to Election Day and the Boys Basketball Playoff. We will meet again on March 31.

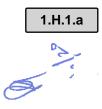

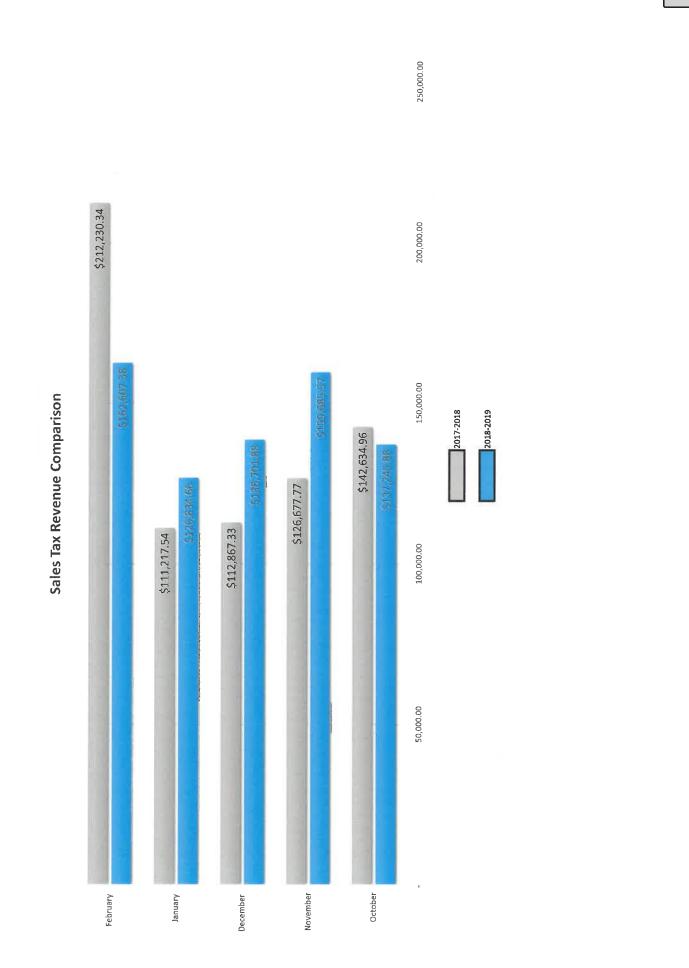

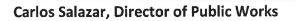
