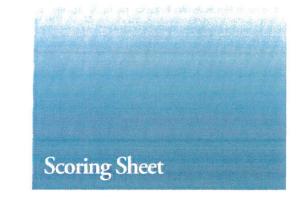

Mr. Milum explained that Cameron County had sent this resolution that is sponsored by Senator Lucio and Representative Olivera. They would like the City to support the creating of a hospital district to help fund healthcare. If passed by the legislature it would be on the November ballot for voter consideration. It would be a maximum of \$0.25 per \$100 valuation of property. History would indicate that you should plan on the maximum. As indicated in the documentation most districts have a maximum tax rate of \$0.75 per \$100 valuation of property.

Councilmember Real stated he felt that our citizens are already being taxed enough. Councilmember Jones and Mendez also stated they were not in favor of the resolution.

Mayor Narvaez stated he sees the need for the hospital district for healthcare.

Mr. Milum answered questions from the Council.

There are two phases of the project. Phase 1 is to determine the needs and the estimated costs of 2 different options. This includes City Hall, Police Department (in new facility or stay in existing facility) and the Fire and Ambulance building. The cost for this will be \$19,800. Once a plan is decided upon Phase 2 will begin which will actually put plans and specifications together to get bids and start construction. The cost on Phase 2 will be between 8% and 12% depending on the decisions made in Phase 1. The smaller project will be closer to 12% and the larger project will be close to 8%.

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS TO ESTABLISH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF PET SOLID WASTE, SO AS TO PROTECT PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE; TO PRESCRIBE PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY; AND TO ESTABLISH AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS:

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- Immediate shall mean that the pet solid waste is removed at once, without delay.
- b. Owner/Keeper shall mean any person or persons, firm, association, partnership, LLC or corporation having temporary or permanent custody of, sheltering or having charge of, harboring, exercising control over, or having property rights to a pet, or in the case of a person under the age of 18, the person's parent or legal guardian. A pet shall be deemed to be harbored if it is fed or sheltered for three (3) or more consecutive days.
- c. Pet a domesticated animal (other than a disability assistance animal) kept for amusement or companionship.
- d. Pet Solid Waste waste matter expelled from the bowels of the pet; excrement.

- e. Public Property shall mean town-owned parks, recreation areas, playing fields, school grounds, sidewalks, easements, rights-of-way, and the traveled portion of public streets and roads.
- f. Private Property of Another shall mean property of any person or persons, firm, association, partnership, LLC or corporation, other than property of the owner or of the owner's family.
- g. Proper Disposal placement in a designated waste receptacle, or other suitable container, and discarded in a refuse container which is regularly emptied by the municipality or some other refuse collector; or disposal into a system designed to convey domestic sewage for proper treatment and disposal.

SECTION 2. REQUIREMENT FOR DISPOSAL:

If any pet shall defecate (pet solid waste) upon any public property, or the private property of another, the owner/keeper of said pet shall immediately remove or cause to be removed from the property (proper disposal) all feces (pet solid waste) deposited by said pet. If such feces (pet solid waste) are not removed (proper disposal), then the owner of the said pet shall be deemed in violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. EXEMPTIONS:

The provisions of this Ordinance do not apply to a disability assistance animal when walked by an unaccompanied blind person.

SECTION 4. ENFORCEMENT

The provisions of this ordinance shall be enforced by the Los Fresnos Police Department of the City of Los Fresnos.

SECTION 5. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTY:

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY:

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such potion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

Phase 1 has a cost of \$12,600 for the above mentioned fees. Phase 2 has a cost of \$10,500 for the above mentioned fees. The total so fare is \$23,100. There will be additional fees as the development continues in the 20 acre parcel.
