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



AN ORDINANCE PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE HOME-RULE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS, PROPOSING TO AMEND SECTION 2.01 COMPOSITION OF COUNCIL; SECTION 2.03 COUNCIL QUALIFICATIONS; SECTION 2.04 FORFEITURE OF OFFICE; SECTION 2.07 VACANCIES IN THE CITY COUNCIL; SECTION 2.15 FINANCIAL LOSS BY ELECTED CITY OFFICIALS; SECTION 12.03 REMOVAL AND VACANCIES; AND SECTION 13.09 POWER OF RECALL; ORDERING THAT THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS AT A REGULAR ELECTION; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the city of Los Fresnos, Texas has adopted a home-rule charter under Article II, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution;

WHEREAS, the City of Los Fresnos, Texas has authority to amend its home-rule charter under Article II, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has not amended the city's home-rule charter since 2012 and now proposes to amend said charter:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Council proposes the the home-rule charter of the City of Los Fresnos, Texas be amended as follows:

1) That Article II, Section 2.01. Composition of council of the existing City Charter be amended by removing "each in the same position on the City Council as a Council Person" and inserting:

"A Council Member that has completed three (3) full consecutive terms of three (3) years in one position (place) is eligible to run for another position (place) in the next regular general election, after sitting out 1 year. A Mayor that has completed three (3) full consecutive terms of three (3) years, is eligible to run for a Council Member position (place) in the next general election, after

sitting out 1 year. A Council Member is eligible to run for Mayor immediately at any time. The time served as a Council Member is separate from the time served as Mayor."

2) That Article II, Section 2.03. Council qualifications subsection (g) of the existing City Charter be amended by removing "If the Council determines that any member of the Council has ceased to possess any of those qualifications set forth in Section 2.03 then that member shall immediately forfeit their office and have their office declared forfeited and vacant by the City Council." and inserting:

"If any two (2) members have proof a member of the Council has ceased to possess any of the qualifications set forth in Section 2.03 or violated section 2.04 or any other section of the Charter, they can request in writing to the City Secretary for an action item to be placed on the next regular Council meeting. Evidence must be presented from both sides with a vote to determine corrective action if any to be taken. Evidence for both sides will be presented and voted upon by the Council and Mayor with majority vote."

- **3**) That Article II, Section 2.04. Forfeiture of office of the existing City Charter be amended by adding subsection (g) "A Council or Mayor can be removed from office by majority vote for incompetency, official misconduct or intoxication.
- 4) That Article II Section 2.07. Vacancies in the city council: how filled of the existing City Charter be amended by removing "If a vacancy occurs in the office of Mayor or on the City Council on or before one hundred twenty (120) days before a regular election for City Council, the vacancy shall be filled at a special election for that purpose. At its next regular meeting after the occurrence of the vacancy, the City Council shall call for a special election to be held on a date that conforms with the uniform election dates set out in the Texas Election Code, as amended, if a uniform election date occurs within the one hundred and twenty (120) day period for the special election shall be set within one hundred twenty (120) days from the date the vacancy occurred; and except as otherwise provided in this Charter such special election laws as set out in the Texas Election Code, as amended, shall be applicable to, and control in all such elections" and inserting:

"If a vacancy occurs in the office of Mayor or the City Council, election laws as set out in the Texas Election Code, as amended, shall be applicable to, and control all such elections.

5) That Article II, Section 2.15 Financial loss by elected city officials; Compensation of the existing City Charter be amended by removing "Compensation of members of the City Council shall be determined by an affirmative vote of all members of the Council by ordinance, but no increase in such compensation shall take effect until commencement of the terms of any Council member elected or reelected at the next regular election." and inserting:

"There will be no compensation of members of the City Council."

6) That Article XII Section 12.03. Removal and vacancies of the City Charter be amended by inserting:

Attachment: ORDINANCE NO 523 charter amendments(3976:Ordinance 523- Charter Amendments)

"A board member shall forfeit their office if they fail to attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings or six (6) meetings in any calendar year without being excused by the council."

7) That Article XII, Section 13.09. Power of recall of the City Charter be amended by removing "In the case of the Mayor, such power may be exercised by filing with the City Secretary a petition signed by currently qualified voters of the City equal in number to at least twenty five (25) percent of the total number of currently qualified voters registered to vote at the last regular municipal election demanding the removal of such elected officer In the case of a Council Person, such power may be exercised by filing with the City Secretary a petition signed by currently qualified voters equal in number to at least twenty five (25) percent of the total number of at least twenty five (25) percent of the total number of currently qualified voters equal in number to at least twenty five (25) percent of the total number of currently qualified voters registered to vote at the last regular municipal election demanding the removal of a least twenty five (25) percent of the total number of currently qualified voters registered to vote at the last regular municipal election demanding the removal of such elected officer." and inserting:

"In the case of a Council Person or Mayor, such power may be exercised by filing with the City Secretary a petition signed by currently qualified voters equal in number to at least ten (10) percent of the total number of currently qualified voters registered to vote in the last regular municipal election demanding the removal of such elected officer."

<u>Section 2</u>. The proposed amendments shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Los Fresnos, Texas as separate propositions, at the general election of November 2, 2021, where the qualified voters may vote "for or "against" the proposed amendments.

<u>Section 3</u>. The qualified voters may approve or disapprove any one or more amendments without having to approve or disapprove all amendments.

<u>Section 4</u>. The amended charter shall be adopted when it is approved by a majority of the qualified voters who vote at the election on which the amendments appear on the ballot, and after all other requirements of law have been fulfilled.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be published in accordance with Section 8.09 of the City Charter.

This agreement was approved between Bayview Irrigation District Number 11 and the City. The second agreement is a license agreement that allows the city to place Hike & Bike Trails along the easement once the canal is placed underground. The city can also use this area to put underground drainage. Both of these will be of great benefit to the City.

As mentioned earlier, this is the same agreement that was already approved with Bayview. Now it will be all 3 entities.

This agreement is made pursuant to TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE Chapter 791, by and between:

- **CAMERON COUNTY IRRIGATION DISTRICT NUMBER 10,** having its office at 30952 Briza Drive. Los Fresnos, TX [mailing address, 30952 Briza Drive, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566] (hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT 10"), acting by and through its governing body, and
- **BAYVIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT NUMBER 11,** having its office at 110 South San Roman Road. Los Fresnos, TX [mailing address, 110 South San Roman Road, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566] (hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT 11"), acting by and through its governing body, and
- CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, having its office at 520 E Ocean Blvd, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566 (hereinafter referred to as "CITY"), acting by and through its City Council.
- 1. SITUATION UNDERGROUND IRRIGATION OR PIPE
 - 1.1. DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY want to pipe (place underground) the "Connecting Canal," an open irrigation canal, that runs from a point on Highway 100 in the City of Los Fresnos (near O'Reilly Automotive) through the City to the eastern city limits to District 11's main canal near Bayview, Texas, a distance of approximately 7.4 miles. See Map 2.
 - 1.2. Approximately 1.4 miles of the Connecting Canal is within the limits of CITY. CITY's extra-territorial jurisdiction extends one (1) mile beyond it limit. See Map 3.
 - 1.3. DISTRICT 11 has engaged Patty Alexander to prepare grant applications: Fee is \$4,000.
 - 1.4. DISTRICT 11 has engaged Moore Land Surveying to prepare cost estimates and technical data information for grant applications: Fee is \$5,000. DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY agree to utilize Moore Land Surveying for engineering to design Phase 1.
 - 1.5. CITY has paid \$9,000 to DISTRICT 11 to cover the costs in 1.3 and 1.4, allowing CITY to participate in the project.
 - 1.6. Funding has been secured as follows:

Texas Water Development Board - \$200,000 U.S. Bureau of Reclamation - \$300,000 CITY - \$150,000 DISTRICT 10 - \$6,250 DISTRICT 11 - \$6,250 CITY - \$12,500 Moore Land Surveying - \$25,000 all for engineering.

The total funding to date is \$700,000.

- 1.7. CITY is willing to pay (a) the cost of preparation of the plans for piping all of the Canal that is not covered by the grant, and (b) the cost of piping the canal in the segment designated by the CITY that is not covered by the grant depending on available funds. This will be done in phases, in which case, DISTRICT 10 and/or DISTRICT 11 shall apply for additional grant funding.
- 2. SITUATION CITY DRAINAGE UNTIL THE CONNECTING CANAL IS PIPED
 - 2.1 During significant rain events, the City is authorized to use the Connecting Canal as a drain to transport storm water from one or more points in the city to one of Cameron County Drainage District Number 1's drains east of Arroyo Boulevard (FM 1847).

- (a) At the most westerly point the storm water enters the Connecting Canal, a gate shall be installed in the Connecting Canal to prevent the back flow of storm water.
- (b) At each point the storm water enters the Connecting Canal, there must be a gate that must remain closed until DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 authorize the opening of the gate(s).
- (c) At the point the storm water shall be discharged into Cameron County Drainage District Number 1's drain, a gate shall be installed in the Connecting Canal to prevent storm water from flowing past the diversion point. Put another way, the diversion structure must be designed so that (a) when DISTRICT 10 and/or DISTRICT 11 is using the Connecting Canal, the flow of water in the Connecting Canal is unimpeded and no irrigation water flows into Cameron County Drainage District Number 1's drain.
- (d) At the diversion point, a gate or other control structure shall be installed to prevent water from being discharged from the Connecting Canal until DISTRICT 10 of DISTRICT 11 authorize the release of water from the Connecting Canal.
- 2.2 CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall prepare the plans and specifications for all necessary gates and other facilities and structures. Plans must be approved by DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 prior to getting bids for construction.
- 2.3 CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall pay for construction costs or any other related costs. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 must approve project once construction is complete.
- 2.4 Depending on the quality of the storm water and/or the capacity of DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11's system to accept the storm water, DISTRICT 10 and/or DISTRICT 11 may be willing to accept part or all of the storm water.
- 2.5 The gates in the Connecting Canal must remain open at all times for normal irrigation water flow unless approved by DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11.
- 2.6 The gate on the inlet(s) and outlet(s) for the significant rain event drain must remain closed at all times unless approved by DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11.
- 2.7 DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY shall be responsible for establishing the protocol regarding the opening and closing of the gates, including who opens and closes the gates.
- 2.8 CITY assumes all maintenance and liability in connection with the CITY drainage.
- 3. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 have entered into a License Agreement with CITY for a Hike & Bike Trail and Drainage Improvements.
- 4. This document constitutes the entire agreement between DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY and no representations, warranties, express or implied, inducement, promises, and agreements, oral or otherwise, between the parties not embodied herein, or in a duly adopted amendment hereto or Interlocal Cooperation Contract between DISTRICT and CITY shall be of any force or effect.

LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN CAMERON COUNTY IRRIGATION DISTRICT NUMBER 10, BAYVIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT NUMBER 11 AND CITY OF LOS FRESNOS

- GRANTOR: **CAMERON COUNTY IRRIGATION DISTRICT NUMBER 10,** having its office at 30952 Briza Drive. Los Fresnos, TX [mailing address, 30952 Briza Drive, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566] (hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT 10"), acting by and through its governing body.
- GRANTOR: **BAYVIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT NUMBER 11,** having its office at 110 South San Roman Road. Los Fresnos, TX [mailing address, 110 South San Roman Road, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566] (hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT 11"), acting by and through its governing body.
- GRANTEE: **CITY OF LOS FRESNOS**, having its office at 520 E Ocean Blvd, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566 (hereinafter referred to as "CITY"), acting by and through its City Council.

SITUATION - UNDERGROUND PIPED AREA UTILIZED BY CITY

- 1.1 DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY plan to pipe (place underground) the "Connecting Canal," an open irrigation canal, that runs from a point on Highway 100 in the City of Los Fresnos (near O'Reilly Automotive) through the City to the eastern city limits to District 11's main canal near Bayview, Texas, a distance of approximately 7.4 miles. See Map 2. Approximately 1.4 miles of the Connecting Canal is within the limits of CITY. CITY's extra-territorial jurisdiction extends one (1) mile beyond it limit. See Map 3. CITY wants to use all the of the surface area of the Connecting Canal right-of-way that is piped for a Hike & Bike Trail and/or other recreational purposes. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 grant a license for this purpose to CITY subject to the terms and conditions stated below.
 - (a) CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall prepare the plans and specifications for Hike & Bike Trails. Plans must be approved by DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 prior to getting bids for construction.
 - (b) CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall pay for construction costs or any other related costs. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 must approve project once construction is complete.
 - (c) CITY will have the use of, and maintain, all of the surface of the Connecting Canal right-ofway on which the Hike & Bike Trail is constructed (that is, if the right-way is 100 feet wide, CITY shall have the use of the 100 feet) once the Hike & Bike Trail is complete. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 will maintain the portions of the Connecting Canal or Piped Underground Canal that do not include the Hike & Bike Trail (and storm drainage, as discussed below).
 - (d) DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 retain superior right to repair and if necessary, replace the underground pipe. Damages to the Hike & Bike Trail will be the responsibility of the CITY. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 will take all efforts necessary to not damage the Hike & Bike Trail or other improvements.
- 1.2 CITY wants to use for storm drainage the Connecting Canal right-of-way that is piped. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 grant a license for this purpose to CITY subject to the terms and conditions stated below.
 - (a) CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall prepare the plans and specifications for the storm drain. Plans must be approved by DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 prior to getting bids for construction. The storm drainage shall be underground and shall not conflict with the piped segment of the Connecting Canal.

- (b) CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall pay for construction costs or any other related costs. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 must approve project once construction is complete.
- (c) To the extent, if any, that the storm drainage is in a segment of Connecting Canal that is not being used and maintained by CITY pursuant to 1.1(c) above, CITY will maintain the storm drainage and surface of the Connecting Canal right of way that is being used for storm drainage once the storm drainage is complete. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 will maintain portions of the Connecting Canal or Piped Underground Canal that do not include CITY storm drainage and Hike & Bike Trail.
- (d) DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 retain superior right to repair and if necessary, replace the underground pipe. Damages to the CITY drainage will be the responsibility of the CITY. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 will take all efforts necessary to not damage the CITY drainage.
- (e) CITY agrees to release, indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 from any and all liability with CITY drainage.
- 2. DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 have no record or knowledge of any utilities having been buried in the right-of-way for the canal. CITY assumes the risk of encountering any utilities buried in the right-of-way.
- 3. It is understood that future maintenance and/or improvements of its irrigation system may include the widening of the canal. DISTRICT 10 and District 11 will not be responsible for any cost or expense of any modification of the Hike & Bike Trail which may be necessary as a result of widening or otherwise improving the canal.
- 4. City will not block the passage of District 10 and District 11 vehicles and equipment over the right-ofway for the canal. City may not erect fences or gates on or across the canal right-of-way.
- 5. CITY agrees to assume all risks related to the Hike & Bike Trails, its use by the public and CITY drainage. CITY agrees, to the extent allowed by law, to indemnify, save and hold harmless DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 from any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, suits, debts, sums of money, accounts or accountings, reckonings, variances, trespasses, damages, judgments, executions or other liabilities including attorney's fees, at common law, in equity, statutory, or otherwise, whether based upon tort, contract or any other legal theory, arising out of the use of the hike and bike trails and CITY drainage.
- 6. CITY shall file this agreement in the Real Property Records of Cameron County, Texas. Upon return after recording, CITY shall mail a copy of the recorded agreement to DISTRICT 10 and DISTRICT 11 at the address stated above.
- 7. This document constitutes the entire agreement between DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY and no representations, warranties, express or implied, inducement, promises, and agreements, oral or otherwise, between the parties not embodied herein, or in a duly adopted amendment hereto or Interlocal Cooperation Contract between DISTRICT 10, DISTRICT 11 and CITY shall be of any force or effect.







BUILDING INSPECTION

Existing Services: Minimal services provide by Cameron County

Services to be Provided: Building Inspection will be provided by the City of Los Fresnos upon annexation. This includes issuing building, electrical and plumbing permits for any new construction and all remodeling activities as well as enforcing all other applicable codes which regulate building construction within the City of Los Fresnos. This also includes set back, parking and sign requirements. The current city staff is adequate to cover these services.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Existing Services: Emergency medical services are provided by the Los Fresnos Ambulance Service through the Cameron County Emergency Services District.

Services to be Provided: The Los Fresnos Ambulance Service currently provides emergency medical services to the City of Los Fresnos. The Los Fresnos Ambulance Service will continue to provide emergency medical services to the area upon annexation. Current contract amounts are sufficient at this time. Adjustments will be made to funding in future years as needed. The Los Fresnos Ambulance Service has more than adequate equipment and personnel to serve the area.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES/CODE ENFORCEMENT/HEALTH

Existing Services: Minimal services through Cameron County Health Department

Services to be Provided: Environmental services will be provided by the Los Fresnos Police Department upon annexation. Some of the items included are weeded or rubbish lots, abandoned or junked vehicles, animal control, garage sales, loud music, food service permitting and health regulations. This also includes the regulation of certain types of businesses. The City provides regular mosquito control as needed. The current city staff is adequate to cover these services.

FIRE

Existing Services: Fire services are provided by the Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department through the Cameron County Emergency Services District.

Services to be Provided: The Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department currently provides fire services to the City of Los Fresnos. The Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department will continue to provide fire services to the area upon annexation. Current contract amounts are sufficient at this time. Adjustments will be made to funding in future years as needed. The Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department has more than adequate equipment and personnel to serve the area.

LIBRARY

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The Ethel L. Whipple Memorial Library will provide free library services to anyone residing in the area upon annexation. Some of these services include books, E books, DVD's, internet access and reading programs. Other services that require fees are faxes, copies and computer print outs. These services can be provided within the current budget appropriation.

PLANNING AND ZONING

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The Planning and Zoning Commission's responsibility for regulating development and land use through the administration of the City of Los Fresnos Zoning Ordinance will extend to this area upon annexation. The property will also continue to be regulated under the requirements of the City of Los Fresnos Subdivision Ordinance. These services can be provided within the current budget.

POLICE

Existing Services: Cameron County Sheriff's Department

Services to be Provided: The City of Los Fresnos will extend regular and routine patrols as well as investigative services to the area upon annexation. The Command Staff, Investigative Services, Communications Staff as well as the Patrol Division are adequate to serve the annexed area. As population increases so will staff.

SANITARY SEWER SERVICE

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: Sanitary sewer service to the area of proposed annexation will be provided by the entity that holds the CCN (Certificate of Convenience & Necessity). The City of Los Fresnos holds the CCN in this area. The service will be provided in accordance with applicable codes and departmental policy. When additional property develops in the adjacent areas, sanitary sewer service shall be provided in accordance with the present extension ordinance. Extension of service shall comply with applicable codes and ordinances. Developer will fund all sewer services to serve this area.

SOLID WASTE SERVICES

Existing Services: Allied Waste provides solid waste services to the unincorporated areas of Cameron County.

Services to be Provided: The City of Los Fresnos will provide solid waste services to the area upon annexation through its existing contract with Allied Waste. Service shall comply with existing City policies, beginning with occupancy of structures. Customers with existing contracts will be allowed to continue with their current contract and service until each contract expires. Allied Waste, in negotiation with the City of Los Fresnos will determine the collection days. Billing will be by the City of Los Fresnos, Allied Waste or a third party.

STORM WATER MANAGEMENT

Existing Services: Cameron County Drainage District Number 1 provides storm water management within the area.

Services to be Provided: Cameron County Drainage District Number 1 will continue to provide storm water management along with the City of Los Fresnos upon annexation. Developers will provide storm water drainage at their own expense and will be inspected by the Engineers of the Drainage District and the City at the time of completion. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

In order to authorize U.S. CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION (CBP), Port of Brownsville, Texas to utilize the CITY OF LOS FRESNOS POLICE DEPARTMENT'S Firing Range, CBP Port of Brownsville and the City of Los Fresnos Police Department agree as follows:

CBP, Port of Brownsville and the City of Los Fresnos Police Department acknowledge that there are certain risks, dangers, and hazards inherent in CBP's use of the Range facilities. CBP, Port of Brownsville agrees to utilize the Range in a safe and responsible manner in accordance with CBP policy and Range rules. This memorandum of understanding does not obligate CBP, Port of Brownsville to any minimum thresholds for the number of CBP officers that will use the Range or for the frequency of CBP, Port of Brownsville's use of the Range.

It is understood by CBP, Port of Brownsville and the City of Los Fresnos Police Department that the United States will be liable to the extent provided by the Federal Tort Claims Act, as amended, (28 U.S.C. § 2671 et seq.) for money damages for injury or loss of property or personal injury or death caused by the negligent act or omission of a CBP employee acting within the scope of his/her employment while using the Range facilities. The parties understand that CBP and its employees are not responsible for lead abatement as a result of their use of the Range facilities but are expected to maintain the premises in substantially the same clean condition encountered prior to its use.

It is understood by CBP, Port of Brownsville and the City of Los Fresnos Police Department that CBP, Port of Brownsville will pay the City of Los Fresnos Police Department a monthly fee of \$15.00 per CBP officer or employee for use of the Range facilities. It is further understood that this memorandum of understanding does not commit the Federal Government to any current or future expenditure of funds in advance of, or in excess of, the availability of appropriations, nor does this memorandum of understanding obligate the Federal Government to spend funds for any particular purpose, even if funds are available, except for the expenditure stated above.

This memorandum of understanding between the City of Los Fresnos Police Department and CBP, Port of Brownsville can be terminated by either party at will and immediately upon written notice to the Parties below.

Model Staff Report in Support of TGS COSA Rate Increase Ordinance

Background

On April 29, 2021, Texas Gas Service Company ("TGS" or "Company") filed for a rate increase pursuant to the Cost of Service Adjustment ("COSA") tariff adopted by the Rio Grande Valley Service Area ("RGVSA") Cities. TGS claimed an entitlement to rate relief under the tariff in the amount of \$4,262,987 on a system-wide basis. Attorney, Thomas Brocato, and consultant, Karl Nalepa, relied upon by the city coalition to review the TGS filing and negotiate a settlement, agreed to recommend a settlement of \$3,842,357 on a system-wide basis.

Purpose of the COSA

The Texas Legislature allows gas utilities to annually adjust rates based on changes to invested capital. That statutory provision is referred to as the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program ("GRIP"). In a GRIP proceeding, cities are not allowed to intervene at the Railroad Commission, cannot challenge the reasonableness of any investment, and may not recover rate case expenses. In 2009, RGVSA Cities negotiated a COSA tariff as a three year experimental substitute for the GRIP process. Finding the COSA process to be mutually beneficial, the COSA process was renewed at the end of the experiment. In 2012, Cities and TGS agreed to a revised COSA tariff. In 2017, Cities and TGS agreed to revise the existing COSA tariff. This is the third filing under the revised tariff.

Resolution of the 2021 Filing

Cities' consultant found that TGS' cost of service calculations were consistent with the terms of the COSA tariff. However, he identified several adjustments that were appropriate. After meeting to discuss the adjustment, the parties were able to reach negotiated resolution of the 2021 COSA.

In summary, the parties agreed to a total revenue requirement adjustment of \$780,364 off of the Company's original request of \$4,262,987. The agreed reductions to the revenue requirement results in a total increase of \$3,842,357.

EXPLANATION OF "BE IT ORDAINED" PARAGRAPHS IN THE ORDINANCE

- Section 1. When rates change, it is critical for the regulatory authority to find existing rates to be unreasonable and for the new rates to be just and reasonable. This section finds that the new rates reflected in tariffs for each customer class attached to the Ordinance are reasonable.
- Section 2. This paragraph authorizes TGS to collect an additional \$3,842,357 in revenue.
- Section 3. This paragraph requires the Company to reimburse the City for consulting and legal costs associated with the requested increase.

- Section 4. This paragraph repeals any prior City action that might be inconsistent with the new tariffs adopted by the Council.
- Section 5. This paragraph recites compliance with the Open Meetings Act.
- Section 6. This paragraph is a typical savings clause, preserving the remaining provisions of the Ordinance should any one provision be determined to be invalid.
- Section 7. Pursuant to the COSA tariff, the new rates are to become effective on or after the first billing cycle of August each year. This paragraph allows the Company to implement the new rates on meter reads that occur on or after July 28, 2021.
- Section 8. This paragraph requires that an adopted and signed copy of the Ordinance be sent to the Company and outside counsel to the City.

RECOMMENDATION

The City staff recommends adoption of the Ordinance and tariffs establishing new rates.



COST OF SERVICE ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE

A. <u>APPLICABILITY</u>

This Cost of Service Adjustment Clause applies to all gas sales and standard transportation rate schedules of Texas Gas Service, a division of ONE Gas, Inc. (the "Company") currently in force in the incorporated areas of the Company's Rio Grande Valley Service Area ("RGVSA"). All rate calculations under this tariff shall be made on a RGVSA system wide basis. If, through the implementation of the provisions of this mechanism, it is determined that rates should be decreased or increased, then rates will be adjusted accordingly in the manner set forth herein. The rate adjustments implemented under this mechanism will reflect annual changes in the Company's cost of service and rate base as computed herein. This Rate Schedule 1-1 is authorized for an initial implementation period of three years commencing with the Company's filing under this rate schedule for the calendar year 2017, effective the first billing cycle of August 2018 and shall automatically renew for successive annual periods unless either the Company or the regulatory authority having original jurisdiction gives written notice to the contrary to the other by February 1, 2021, or February 1 of each succeeding year. Both the cities and the Company retain their statutory right to initiate a rate proceeding at any time.

B. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>

Rate adjustments shall be made in accordance with the procedures described below on an annual basis. The Company shall make its annual filing no later than May 1, with the rate adjustments to be effective for meters read on or after the first billing cycle of August each year. The first filing pursuant to this Rider shall be no later than May 1, 2018 and shall be based on the financial results for the calendar year ending December 31, 2017.

C. <u>COMPONENTS OF THE RATE ADJUSTMENT</u>

Calculation of the rate adjustment will be based on operating expenses, return on investment, and Federal Income Tax. The first \$0.50 of the residential rate adjustment shall be included in the residential monthly Customer Charge of the applicable rate schedules with the excess of that amount applied to the Commodity Charge. The rate adjustment shall be included in the monthly Customer Charge of all other applicable rate schedules. The actual percentage change in total calendar year operating expenses shall not exceed five percent (5%), provided that the costs for the Company to provide public notice and reimburse City and Company rate case expenses as required herein, shall not be included in calculating the five (5%) limitation. The Company shall file with each regulatory authority having original jurisdiction over the Company's rates the schedules specified below, by FERC Account, for the prior calendar year period. The schedules will be based upon the Company's audited financial data, as adjusted, and provided in a format that will allow for the same analysis as that undertaken of a Company Statement of Intent filing, and shall include the following information:

C.1 Operating Expenses - Operating expenses will be those reported as part of our audited financials that are reconciled to the general ledger and assigned to the RGVSA level (either directly or allocated) in a manner consistent with the most recent RGVSA rate case.

The applicable expenses are: Depreciation and Amortization Expense (Account Nos. 403-405) * Taxes Other Than FIT (Account No. 408) ** Operation and Maintenance Expenses (Account Nos. 850-894, excluding any cost of gas related expenses) Customer Related Expenses (Account Nos. 901-916) *** Administrative & General Expenses (Account Nos. 920-932) Interest on Customer Deposits (Account No. 431)

This information will be presented with supporting calculations.

* Based on the last approved depreciation methods and lives.

** Includes Texas Franchise Tax. Excludes City Franchise Fees, Gross Receipts, and any other revenue-based tax.

C.2 Return on Investment - The rate of return will remain constant at the Weighted Cost of Capital authorized in the most recent RGVSA rate case. The return on investment is the rate of return multiplied by the rate base balance for the applicable calendar year.

Supporting information for all rate base items shall be provided to the regulatory authority during the ninety (90) day review period specified in Section D upon request by the regulatory authority.

C.3 Federal Income Tax

Applicable calendar year federal income taxes will be calculated as follows:

Net Taxable Income (applicable calendar-year end rate base multiplied by rate of return from the most recent RGVSA rate case included in Section C.2.)

Less: Interest on Long Term Debt (applicable calendar-year end rate base multiplied by debt cost component of return from the most recent RGVSA rate case)

Multiplied by: Tax Factor (.21 / (1-.21)) or .265823.

The Tax Factor will be calculated using the federal income tax rate(s) in effect during the period revenues from the COSA will be collected, including newly enacted federal tax rates to the extent such new rates are known at the time of the annual filing.

C.4 Cost of Service Adjustment - The amount to be collected through the Cost of Service Adjustment will be the sum of the amounts from Sections C.1, C.2, and C.3 that total to the revenue requirement, less the calendar year actual non-gas revenue and other revenue (i.e., transportation revenue and service charges), adjusted for the revised Texas Franchise Tax described in Chapter 171 of the Texas Tax Code.

The formula to calculate the Cost of Service Adjustment is:

[(C.1 Operating Expenses + C.2 Return on Investment + C.3 Federal Income Tax - Actual Non-Gas and Other Revenues)] ÷ (1 - Texas Franchise Tax statutory rate)

C.5 Cost of Service Adjustment Rate and Cost of Service Adjustment Volumetric Rate

The Cost of Service Adjustment as calculated in Section C.4 will be allocated among the customer classes in the same manner as the cost of service was allocated among classes of customers in the Company's latest effective rates for the RGVSA. The cost of service adjustment for each customer class will then be converted into a per-customer per-month amount to produce the Cost of Service Adjustment Rate. The per customer adjustment will be the Cost of Service Adjustment as allocated to that class, divided by the average number of gas sales customers in each class for the RGVSA. The Cost of Service Adjustment Rate will be this per customer adjustment amount divided by 12 to produce a monthly adjustment amount, either an increase or decrease, which will be included in the gas sales and standard transportation customer charges. For the residential class only, the Cost of Service Adjustment rate will be limited to \$0.50 in any one year, and the remaining portion of the Cost of Service Adjustment allocated to the residential class will be recovered through a Cost of Service Adjustment Volumetric Rate, which will be calculated by dividing the remaining portion to be recovered from residential customers by annual, weather-normalized residential volumes.

C.6 Attestation

A sworn statement shall be filed by the Company's Director of Rates, affirming that the filed schedules are in compliance with the provisions of this tariff and are true and correct to the best of his/her knowledge, information, and belief. No testimony shall be filed.

C.7 **Proof of Revenues**

The Company shall also provide a schedule demonstrating the "proof of revenues" relied upon to calculate the proposed Cost of Service Adjustment rate. The proposed rates shall conform as closely as practicable to the revenue allocation principles in effect prior to the adjustment.

C.8 Notice

Notice of the annual Cost of Service Adjustment shall be provided in a form similar to that required under Section 104.103, TEX. UTIL. CODE ANN not later than the 60th day after the date the utility files the COSA with the regulatory authority. The notice to customers shall include the following information:

- a) a description of the proposed revision of rates and schedules;
- b) the effect the proposed revision of rates is expected to have on the rates applicable to each customer class and on an average bill for each affected customer class;
- c) the service area or areas in which the proposed rate adjustment would apply;

- d) the date the proposed rate adjustment was filed with the regulatory authority; and
- e) the Company's address, telephone number–, and website where information concerning the proposed cost of service adjustment may be obtained.

D. <u>REGULATORY REVIEW OF ANNUAL RATE ADJUSTMENT</u>

The regulatory authority with original jurisdiction will have a period of not less than ninety (90) days within which to review the proposed annual rate adjustment. During the review period, Company shall provide additional information and supporting documents as requested by the regulatory authority and such information shall be provided within ten (10) working days of the original request.

The rate adjustment shall take effect for meters read on or after the first billing cycle of August each year. This Cost of Service Adjustment Rate Schedule does not limit the legal rights and duties of the regulatory authority. The Company's annual rate adjustment will be made in accordance with all applicable laws. If at the end of the ninety (90) day review period, the Company and the regulatory authority with original jurisdiction have not reached an agreement on the proposed Cost of Service Adjustment Rate, the regulatory authority may take action to deny such adjustment or approve a different adjustment. If at the end of the ninety (90) day review period, the regulatory authority takes no action, the proposed Cost of Service Adjustment Rate will be deemed approved.

The Company shall have the right to appeal any action by the regulatory authority to the Railroad Commission of Texas not later than the 30th day after the date of the final decision by the regulatory authority. WHEREAS, on or about April 29, 2021, TGS filed with the City a COSA tariff seeking to increase natural gas rates to all customers residing in the City; and

WHEREAS, the Company requested a system-wide increase of \$4,262,987; and

WHEREAS, the City coordinated a review of TGS' COSA filing and designated attorneys and consultants to resolve issues in the Company's COSA filing; and

WHEREAS, the Company has filed evidence that existing rates are unreasonable and should be changed; and

WHEREAS, independent analysis by the City's rate expert concluded that TGS is able to justify an increase over current rates; and

WHEREAS, the City's attorney and consultant recommend that the City approve the Settlement Agreement reflecting increased revenues of \$3,842,357 on a system-wide basis; and

WHEREAS, the attached tariffs implementing new rates are consistent with the negotiated resolution reached by the City and are just, reasonable, and in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, the negotiated resolution of the Company's COSA filing and the resulting rates are, as a whole, in the public interest; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the City Council finds that the existing rates for natural gas service provided by TGS are unreasonable and the new tariffs implementing this Ordinance, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment A, are just and reasonable and are hereby adopted. Section 2. That a rate increase of \$3,842,357 on a system-wide basis is reasonable.

Section 3. That TGS shall reimburse the reasonable ratemaking expenses of the City in processing the Company's rate application.

Section 4. That to the extent any resolution or ordinance previously adopted by the Council is inconsistent with this Ordinance, it is hereby repealed.

Section 5. That the meeting at which this Ordinance was approved was in all things conducted in strict compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

Section 6. That if any one or more sections or clauses of this Ordinance is adjudged to be unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Ordinance and the remaining provisions of the Ordinance shall be interpreted as if the offending section or clause never existed.

Section 7. That the tariffs attached as Attachment A to this Ordinance shall become effective for meters read on and after July 28, 2021 consistent with the COSA tariff.

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



As discussed with our client, Los Fresnos Development Ltd. Company, yesterday, our client has agreed and/or requested to pay the subdivision park fees for the two above current subdivisions as well as for the future development of remaining developable areas of their land in the Valle Alto East area by granting credit to the City of Los Fresnos an amount equal to the total fee amount from the change order for storm sewer over-sizing cost which was requested by the City and paid by the developer to his contractor to complete the over-sizing.

Attached is a map showing the various areas of current and future development, copies of appraisal district information, and a copy of the change order with itemized costs for the various items of construction related to the over-sizing. The developer has agreed to pay for construction of barricading the temporary inlet at the end of the oversized pipe.

Consideration and ACTION to approve Change Order #1 for the Hike and Bike Trail Project.

There have been 3 issues arise with the Hike & Bike Trail. The first is to assure drainage of the area homes and the end of Huisace Street. It was designed correctly but once we did the field work we can upgrade it to offer us more security with floods and the residents in the cul-de-sac are appreciative of that. The second was a 30 inch drain line was discovered going under the canal that we were not aware of. The inlet on one side and the outlet on the other side was covered up. We were aware of 3 other 24 inch drain lines. This 30 inch drain line, now located in the correct place and active will assist drainage in each of the 6 dead end streets going south off of FM 2480. The last piece was a sewer manhole that was also covered over, broken and way too small. That had to be done to prevent water entering the system and causing backups. This should help issues we have had on East 5th and East 10th Streets. It won't solve the problem but should help. The last 2 items were emergency needs that had to be done immediately. These items were sent to the Council monthly over the last few month in the City Manager Report. This work totaled \$34,682.00. We have the funds to cover this increase due to increase in sales tax revenue. The extension of time is listed as well. The engineer has been tracking this from the beginning in conjunction with the contractor.

Consideration and ACTION to approve an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Brownsville and the City of Los Fresnos regarding Trail Improvements.

The Hike & Bike Trail the city is constructing is located on the north side of the drainage ditch that is between East 10th Street and Alvarez Court (see attachment red line). The City of Brownsville is working on constructing the trail to connect the existing trail ending between Los Fresnos and Brownsville and extending it to the south side of the drainage ditch between East 10th Street and Alvarez Court (see attachment blue line). As you can see, the 2 trails do not connect. To connect we need to extend a little and cross the drainage ditch. The City of Brownsville has worked and expended funds and received grants get the trail this far. The are proposing to pay for the engineering part and once they have it ready for construction, turn it over to us to get it constructed. The estimated cost is just under \$130,000 (see attachment). We would solicit a grant to get this done. I feel strongly we could get a grant to cover at least 75%. Of course we would attempt to have it completely covered by a grant. Even if we had to pay the total we can budget in future years to make this connection. The end results will be Hike & Bike Trails to start at our Nature Park and end in downtown Brownsville and extend into Mexico and many parts of Brownsville. This would be very beneficial to our residents. The proposed agreement gives us up to 10 years to fund it and make it a reality. My goal would be to solicit grants as soon as our current Hike & Bike Trail is complete prior to the end of this year.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BROWNSVILLE, TEXAS AND CITY OF LOS FRESNOS REGARDING TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS

This Interlocal Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Los Fresnos ("Los Fresnos"), a home rule municipality, and the City of Brownsville, Texas, ("Brownsville"), a home rule municipality, regarding the design and construction of a regional trial project under the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code, as the same may be amended from time to time, to be effective as of the date on which the last Party signs this Agreement (the "Effective Date"). The Brownsville and Los Fresnos are collectively referred to herein as the "Parties" and are each a "Party".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City of Brownsville and City of Los Fresnos desire to enter into an Agreement concerning the hike/bike trail improvements and connecting the trails between both cities ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, as amended, titled Interlocal Cooperation Contracts, authorizes contracts between political subdivisions for the performance of governmental functions and services;

WHEREAS, Brownsville and Los Fresnos have determined that the hike/bike trail improvements may be constructed most economically by implementing this Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, Brownsville and Los Fresnos find that this Agreement will benefit the residents of Brownsville and Los Fresnos by providing alternative modes of transportation such as walking and biking between home, work, school, shopping, and mass transit; and

WHEREAS, Brownsville and Los Fresnos find that this Agreement will serve a public purpose by providing alternative modes of transportation and increasing the quality of life for their residents; and

WHEREAS, Brownsville and Los Fresnos are authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Texas Government Code 791.001 et seq., (the "Act") which authorizes local governments to contract with each other to perform governmental functions and services under the terms of the Act.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the sufficiency of which are acknowledged, and subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

I. Findings

1.1 The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein for all purposes and are found by the Parties to be true and correct. It is further found and determined that the Parties have authorized

and approved this Agreement by their respective entities, and that this Agreement will be in full force and effect when executed by all Parties.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES/DUTIES

- 2.1 City of Brownsville will:
 - A. Design the Project, including providing engineering, surveying, geotechnical, environmental and other professional services.
 - B. Participate in the planning for the Project and provide the City of Los Fresnos timely review and approval of the construction plans and specifications.
 - C. Inspect the Project upon completion of construction conformance with approved plans, specifications and City of Brownsville ordinances for public Right-of-way improvements.
 - D. Accept and maintain the portion of the Project within the City of Brownsville right-ofway upon completion of construction in conformance with approved plans, specifications and city ordinances for public right-of-way improvements.
- 2.2 City Los Fresnos will:
 - A. Construct all trail improvements for the Project.
 - B. Manage, oversee, plan and cause the Project to be completed including providing or contracting for acquisition of right-of-way and final construction of the Project.
 - C. Cause the Project to be constructed in general conformance with the Project's Design as submitted by the City of Brownsville.
 - D. Cause the portion of the Project located in the City of Brownsville to be constructed in conformance with City of Brownsville ordinances for public right-of-way improvements, and obtain all applicable permits.
 - E. Provide the City of Brownsville with preliminary and final construction plans and specifications in accordance with City and State standards, and receive approval of the plans from the City prior to bidding construction of the Project.
 - F. Cause the Project to be constructed in conformance with approved plans and specifications, and receive final approval for City acceptance of the City's portion of the Project prior to release of contract retainage.
 - G. Ensure that the Project shall be completed within ten (10) years of the date of this Agreement.

III. Binding Effect; Benefiting Parties

3.1 This Agreement shall bind and benefit the respective Parties and their legal successors, but shall not otherwise be assignable, in whole or in part, by either Party without first obtaining the written consent of the other Party.

3.2 This Agreement inures to the benefit of and obligates only the Parties. No term or provision of this Agreement shall benefit or obligate any person or entity not a Party to the Agreement. The Parties shall cooperate fully in opposing any attempt by any third person or entity to claim any benefit, protection, release, or other consideration under this Agreement.

IV. Governmental Functions; Liability; No Waiver of Immunity or Defenses

4.1 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, this Agreement is a contract for and with respect to the performance of governmental functions by governmental entities.

4.1.1 The services provided for herein are governmental functions, and the **Brownsville** and **Los Fresnos** shall be engaged in the conduct of a governmental function while providing and/or performing any service pursuant to this Agreement.

4.1.2 The relationship of **Brownsville** and **Los Fresnos** shall, with respect to that part of any service or function undertaken as a result of or pursuant to this Agreement, be that of independent contractors.

4.1.3 Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed by the Parties, or by any third party, as creating the relationship of principal and agent, partners, joint ventures, or any other similar such relationship between the Parties.

4.2 Each Party reserves and does not waive any defense available to it at law or in equity as to any claim or cause of action whatsoever that may arise or result from or in connection with this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be interpreted nor construed to give to any third party the right to any claim or cause of action, and neither the **Brownsville** nor **Los Fresnos** shall be held legally liable for any claim or cause of action arising pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement except as specifically provided herein or by law.

4.3 Neither Party waives or relinquishes any immunity or defense on behalf of itself, its trustees, councilmembers, officers, employees, and agents as a result of the execution of this Agreement and the performance of the covenants and agreements contained herein.

V. Notices

5.1 All correspondence and communications concerning this Agreement shall be directed to:

Notices required hereunder shall be hand-delivered or sent by prepaid certified mail, return receipt requested.

VI. Severability

6.1 If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof, but rather this entire Agreement will be construed as if not containing the particular invalid or unenforceable provision(s), and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be construed and enforced in accordance therewith. The Parties acknowledge that if any provision of this Agreement is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, it is their desire and intention that such provision be reformed and construed in such a manner that it will, to the maximum extent practicable, give effect to the intent of this Agreement and be deemed to be validated and enforceable.

VII. Entire Agreement

7.1 This Agreement is the entire agreement between **Brownsville** and **Los Fresnos** as to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any prior understanding or written or oral agreement relative to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument duly approved and executed by both Parties in accordance with the formalities of this Agreement.

VIII. Governing Law; Venue

8.1 All Parties agree that this Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Texas, and obligations under the Agreement shall be performed in Cameron County, Texas. Should the need for dispute resolution arise, venue shall be in Cameron County, Texas.

IX. Term and Termination

9.1 This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect from Effective Date and shall terminate upon the completion of all services and responsibilities mutually performed by Brownsville and Los Fresnos to the written satisfaction each to the other. It is understood that the actual termination date herein may occur on or about the date of final approval and acceptance of all improvements by Brownsville and Los Fresnos and subject to construction contract warranty provisions. The date of Project completion shall not be later than ten (10) years from the Effective Date.

9.2 Brownsville and Los Fresnos may terminate this Interlocal Agreement prior to the completion of the project upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other but in the event of such termination by either party, the Parties shall be entitled to receive compensation for the value of services rendered, construction performed, and termination costs as actually incurred.

X. Current Revenues

10.1 Pursuant to Section 791.001(d)(3), Texas Government Code, each party paying for the performance of governmental functions or services will make those payments from current revenues available to the paying party.

XI. General Terms

11.1 **Execution in Counterparts.** This Agreement may be simultaneously executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall be considered fully executed as of the date first written above, when all Parties have executed an identical counterpart, notwithstanding that all signatures may not appear on the same counterpart.

11.2 **Effective Date.** The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be the date last executed by a Party.



A. Wastewater Update - Construction continues on the Chlorine Contact Basin Project and the Headworks Project. There were some delays receiving equipment due to COVID but all equipment has been received. Work is progressing and should be completed over the next several months.

The loan for \$1,600,000 for wastewater to fix 3 lift stations, run sewer service to the new annexed areas on West Highway 100, replace some old manholes and replace some old sewer lines has closed. We are waiting on TWDB to give us the approval to move forward. We are working on some easements that we need prior to going out for bid.

B. Water Update - The loan for \$3,700,000 for the water plant upgrade and distribution lines has closed. Bid documents have been signed. TWDB has finally approved and we have had the preconstruction meeting. Work started Monday...with mainly ordering items and getting set up. This is a 2 year project ending in June of 2023. The contractor wants to finish in a year and a half. I hope they can.

C. Nature Park - The butterfly viewing and other areas with plants are almost complete. The bill we are pushing with our state senator and representative died with the end of the legislative session. We will try again.

D. Hike & Bike Trails - Half Associates, engineer and Pederson Construction, contractor, are working on the project. You can see the work at the east end of the Nature Park or off of FM 2480 as well as from Highway 100 to the north. The drainage and access that was previously discussed has been completed. The contractor is still working on the irrigation canal crossing. There is quite a bit of work that included not just the box culvert for the crossing but also replacing 3 drain pipes under the canal. Two of them were on the plans but 1 other was discovered during construction so there will be a change order for that. Discovering this will assist in drainage in the area. Not much work has been done in the last month due to the rain and mud. Once it dries they should be able to finish the trail from the Nature Park to the irrigation canal in a few weeks.

E. Henderson Road Project - Issues appear to have been worked out and will be addressed as discussed in our meetings. The contractor is working to be complete by August 17.

Page 1 Packet Pg. 135 F. Drainage Update - Hanson is working on the several engineering designs for help with drainage along Whipple Road (cost \$100,000) as well as Resaca Escondida (\$300,000). Both will help in poor drainage areas. We are looking for grants to assist with costs for the construction. The drainage pipe under the railroad north of Henderson Road is collapsed. I have contacted the UP Railroad to fix it. They are looking into the situation. I contact them about every 2 weeks to remind them and check status but they don't mover very fast on projects.

G. Whipple Road - CCRMA continues to work on the overall project of widening of Whipple Road. They will have some thoughts on what can be done in a couple of months and have been working with Hanson Professional Services since they know drainage plans we have and what they have been working on dealing with the sidewalk on one side of the road. TxDot is reviewing some items that CCRMA have questioned.

H. CDBG 9th Street Lift Station Grant - Work is complete on the new lift station. Startup will occur as soon as AEP hooks up electricity. Once that is done they will decommission the old lift station and remove it. We will then be able to release the easement in the back yard of the property.

I. COVID-19 - We still have not received official word or direction on the new funds that we will be receiving \$1,941,898.48. We will get 50% or \$970,949.24 in August and the other 50% a year later. We will be able to spend up to half once we receive the finds. We are working on a master list of items that include water, sewer, drainage, including water and or sewer to areas we annexed previously and don't have funding yet to complete those. We aren't certain if drainage projects will be allowed. Once we have the information necessary to make decisions we will call a special meeting to go over that. Examples are: Sewer on Henderson Road about \$255,930, Sewer Upgrade on East 10th Street for \$251,775, Sewer Upgrade on East 5th Street for \$74,250 (will have to be done in conjunction with CBDG Funding, Resaca Escondida Drainage for \$195,500, Whipple Road Drainage cost TBD, Water Tank Replacement reguired by TCEQ cost TBD, Sewer West on HIghway 100 we feel we have plenty to cover in TWDB Funding but we will know for sure by the time the other half is available next year, Replace old Sewer Lines cost TBD, Drainage Valle Alto Area cost TBD, Others?

J. TxDot Highway 100 Project - Not much has changed. They are slow and have had lots of weather delays. I am working with TxDot on the next section they will do and trying to keep more lanes open through the summer due to high traffic primarily on the weekends. More lanes can be closed in the fall and winter when there is not as much traffic. Our Police Department continues to manually operate the traffic light at peak times, Friday afternoon, Saturday, Sunday, Holidays, and other times when it backs up. TxDot will not pay to manually operate the traffic light. They say the timing on the light is the best they can do. We are dealing with it the best we can.

K. Pallet Company - The owner of the property continues to haul pallets off slowly. They are hiring a company to bring an incinerator in to get it done quickly. TCEQ and our Fire Marshal have approved this. We are hopeful this will happen in the next month or so.

We continue to provide homework assistance to kids that are struggling at school. With the switch from Power Hour (homework assistance) to Project Learn which in addition to homework assistance, the program also includes other activities such as nature walks, bird study, and educational videos, we have enhanced our program to keep members interested and engaged.

The Club started its summer program this quarter. Our summer curriculum includes bird study, national programs, physical activities, theater arts, arts and crafts, and game room activities. The Club hired seasonal staff to assist with the workload.

The Club's Boxing program has 25 new members, with 6 of them training at competition level. One member competed at the Rio Grande Valley Golden Gloves Championship, winning the 114 lbs. division.

The Club distribute meals thru USDA Food Assistance Program during our afterschool program and thru the Texas Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs during our summer program. As a result, we now average 70 meals a day in our program.

City funds have been instrumental for our Club to stay operational since our main source of income is program based. As part of the Boys & Girls Club Experience, members are offered activities to keep their minds occupied and engaged. We continue our mission to enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens. We would like to thank the City of Los Fresnos for their support thru this hard and volatile times. From our Board of Members, Executive Director, staff and especially the youth we serve, thank you.

Goals and Outcomes of these programs:

Tutoring (spring session):

Goal: Club members are to complete Sylvan Learning tutoring reading classes thru Texas Alliance of Boys & Girls Club and Sylvan Learning.

Outcome: A post-assessment test determined success. All participating members improved their reading skills.

Sports & Fitness:

Goal: Club members learn new, fun activities to keep them fit and make healthy lifestyle choices. Boys and Girls Clubs of America's Triple Play program and our Boxing program are used as tools to develop sports and fitness curriculum.

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
