BUILDING INSPECTION

Existing Services: Minimal services provide by Cameron County

Services to be Provided: Building Inspection will be provided by the City of Los Fresnos upon annexation. This includes issuing building, electrical and plumbing permits for any new construction and all remodeling activities as well as enforcing all other applicable codes which regulate building construction within the City of Los Fresnos. This also includes set back, parking and sign requirements. The current city staff is adequate to cover these services.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Existing Services: Emergency medical services are provided by the Los Fresnos Ambulance Service through the Cameron County Emergency Services District.

Services to be Provided: The Los Fresnos Ambulance Service currently provides emergency medical services to the City of Los Fresnos. The Los Fresnos Ambulance Service will continue to provide emergency medical services to the area upon annexation. Current contract amounts are sufficient at this time. Adjustments will be made to funding in future years as needed. The Los Fresnos Ambulance Service has more than adequate equipment and personnel to serve the area.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES/CODE ENFORCEMENT/HEALTH

Existing Services: Minimal services through Cameron County Health Department

Services to be Provided: Environmental services will be provided by the Los Fresnos Police Department upon annexation. Some of the items included are weeded or rubbish lots, abandoned or junked vehicles, animal control, garage sales, loud music, food service permitting and health regulations. This also includes the regulation of certain types of businesses. The City provides regular mosquito control as needed. The Police Department currently has two full time Environmental Services Officers which is more than adequate to serve this area

<u>FIRE</u>

Existing Services: Fire services are provided by the Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department through the Cameron County Emergency Services District.

MAIL BOX CLUSTERS

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: United States mail delivery inside the city limits is required to be combined into a location or several locations with large developments utilizing cluster boxes. The developer will provide and install the cluster boxes as part of the development. Location of the cluster boxes will be agreed upon by the developer and City.

PLANNING AND ZONING

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The Planning and Zoning Commission's responsibility for regulating development and land use through the administration of the City of Los Fresnos Zoning Ordinance will extend to this area upon annexation. The property will continue to be regulated under the requirements of the City of Los Fresnos Subdivision Ordinance. These services can be provided within the current budget.

POLICE

Existing Services: Cameron County Sheriff's Department

Services to be Provided: The City of Los Fresnos will extend regular and routine patrols as well as investigative services to the area upon annexation. The Command Staff, Investigative Services, Communications Staff as well as the Patrol Division are adequate to serve the annexed area.

SANITARY SEWER SERVICE

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: Sanitary sewer service to the area of proposed annexation will be provided by the City of Los Fresnos. The service will be provided in accordance with applicable codes and departmental policy. When additional property develops in the adjacent areas, sanitary sewer service shall be provided in accordance with the present extension ordinance. Extension of service shall comply with applicable codes and ordinances.

SOLID WASTE SERVICES

Existing Services: Republic Services provides solid waste services to the unincorporated areas of Cameron County.

Services to be Provided: The City of Los Fresnos will provide solid waste services to the area upon annexation through its existing contract with Republic Services. Crews have taken inventory of the wood we have in storage for boarding windows. Sand bags have been filled and generators are on the ready. We have a written agreement to relocate our buses to Roma ISD and we have a plan to keep ten buses here to help the County with evacuation. When evacuation is complete, those ten buses would also be relocated to Roma.

FEMA recommends that we have written Mutual Aide Agreements with Municipalities and Walsh Gallegos prepared one on our behalf.

If approved, I will present it to the City of Los Fresnos for their approval.

MOU Between Los Fresnos CISD and City of Los Fresnos

Emergency Operations Plan mutual aid Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), which calls for both authorities to establish and maintain a coordinated program for enhancing Emergency Operations Planning Response, between Los Fresnos Consolidated Independent School District hereby after known as Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos, acting by and through their respective Board of Trustees, pursuant to authority granted under the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code, as the same may be amended from time to time.

WHEREAS, Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos are subject to danger and damage anytime from flooding, tornadoes, high winds, lightning, hazardous material incident and other part of nature or terrorism; and

WHEREAS, Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos propose this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to establish a formal working Mutual-Aid relationship between Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos in support of Emergency Operation planning, response and recovery programs; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Los Fresnos CISD Emergency Operation's Plan is to administer a campus-based comprehensive emergency management program in partnership with The City of Los Fresnos and its neighboring jurisdictions to safeguard lives and property; and

WHEREAS, in light of their respective common goals to reduce the loss of life and property from natural or man-made emergencies and disasters, Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos recognize the need to maintain a strong coordination at a level that ensures efficient use of all available resources, consistent with the principles of each entity; and

WHEREAS, Los Fresnos CISD and the City of Los Fresnos agree to encourage, coordinate, promote, and support an ongoing relationship between both entities and to hold periodic partnership meetings to focus on, but not limited to, identifying and assessing an all hazards approach and associated risks, particularly as they relate to Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos; and

WHEREAS, Los Fresnos CISD and The City of Los Fresnos would benefit from the development and adoption of the MOU; and

WHEREAS, both parties agree, but not limited to the following:

- Cooperate in all areas of mutual interest as it relates to Emergency Management: sharing data, information, planning, response, recovery, and other operational support programs;
- Enhance and maximize both Emergency Management program capabilities of both Participants for the purpose of protection of the public health and safety, the public school environment, and to preserve and safeguard property.
- The City of Los Fresnos Emergency Management program is designated the primary warning control point for Los Fresnos CISD emergency notification and/or warning devices when a serious external threat exists for the school division;
- Provide a rapid coordinated and effective response with full utilization of all resources of both participant jurisdictions, including any resources on hand or available that are

essential to the safety, care and welfare of those impacted in the event of an emergency or disaster declared by the jurisdiction;

- In the event of a declared emergency, those resources identified in the City of Los Fresnos Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) and held by Los Fresnos CISD will be made available as rapidly as possible without endangering the care, welfare, safety, or security of the students or employees of Los Fresnos CISD.
- Each jurisdiction shall appoint an individual representative to serve as a point of contact for matters relevant to this MOU;
- This MOU becomes effective on the date of execution and shall remain in effect unless terminated by written notification by either jurisdiction to the other;
- This MOU may be amended by written mutual agreement.

Miscellaneous Provisions

- Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, this Agreement is a contract for and with respect to the performance of governmental functions by governmental entities. The services provided for herein are governmental functions, and the Parties shall be engaged in the conduct of a governmental function while providing and/or performing any service pursuant to this Agreement.
- The relationship of the Parties shall, within respect tot that part of any service or function undertaking as a result of or pursuant to this Agreement, be that of independent contractors.
- Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed by the Parties, or by any third party, as creating the relationship of principal and agent, partners, joint venturers, or any other similar relationship between the Parties.
- Each Party covenants and agrees, to the extent permitted by law, that each Party shall be solely responsible, as between said Party and the other Parties to this Agreement, for and with respect to any claim or cause of action arising out of or with respect to any act, omission, or failure to act by said Party or its respective employees, contractors, subcontractors, agents, representatives, o assigns, in the provision of services pursuant to this Agreement.
- The Parties covenant and agree, to the extent permitted by law, to release each other for any claims or cause of action arising out of or with respect to the failure of either party to provide the resources outlined in this Agreement. The Parties agree that this Agreement is only an Agreement to share resources on an as available basis and not an obligation to do so.
- Each Party reserves and does not waive any defense available to it at law or in equity as to any claim or cause of action whatsoever that may arise or result from or in connection with this agreement. This Agreement shall not be interpreted nor construed to give to any third party the right to any claim or cause of action, and neither Party shall be held legally liable for any claim or cause of action arising pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement except as specifically provided herein or by law.
- Neither Party waives or relinquishes any immunity or defense on behalf of itself, its trustees, council members, officers, employees, and agents as a result of the execution of this Agreement and the performance of the covenants and agreements contained herein.

- If any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed void or invalid, such provision shall be severed from the remainder of this Agreement, which shall remain in force and effect to the extent that it does not destroy the benefit of the bargain.
- This Agreement is the entire agreement between the Parties as to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any prior understanding or written or oral agreement relative to the subject matter hereof. Tis Agreement may be amended only by written instrument duly approved and executed by all Parties in accordance with the formalities of this Agreement.
- All Parties agree that this Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Texas, and obligations under the Agreement shall be performed in Cameron County, Texas.
- WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Los Fresnos CISD has considered this Multi-Jurisdictional MOU and has determined that it is in the best interest of the school district to approve such MOU.

South Texas ISD would like to utilize the parking area at Memorial Park to pick up students. Mostly it is a drop off and pick up situation. Once in a while a few cars may be there during the day but that is when the park is not busy anyway so it does not become a problem. These are Los Fresnos area residents, parents and students that will be able to utilize this service. I have visited with the School District and they are great with the City being able to do this. This would be the fourth year we have this agreement.

I recommend approval.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

This memorandum of understanding (herein referred to as "MOU") made on this the <u>day</u> of <u>June 2020</u> will serve as an agreement between the <u>City of Los Fresnos</u> and the **South Texas Independent School District**, herein referred to as "**South Texas ISD**" regarding **South Texas ISD's** use of the <u>parking lot of Memorial Park</u> facilities located on <u>900 N. Arroyo Blvd. Los</u> <u>Fresnos, Tx. 78566</u>.

1. Background

This **MOU** establishes the terms and conditions under which **South Texas ISD** may use the <u>parking lot facilities located on 900 N. Arroyo Blvd. Los Fresnos, Tx. 78566</u>. Attachment A shall describe the dates and times the facility is to be utilized by **South Texas ISD**.

2. Purpose

<u>City of Los Fresnos</u> agrees to allow use of said facility to **South Texas ISD** for the purpose of providing transportation for South Texas ISD students and using the <u>parking lot facilities</u> as a stop.

3. Scope

This scope of <u>this agreement</u> refers to facility use as described in Section 1: Background. If applicable, the scope of agreements for other cooperative arrangements, such as those regarding fares, is beyond this agreement.

This agreement shall be in effect from <u>September 1, 2020</u> to <u>August 31, 2021</u>. Both parties, if so desired, may review and execute an additional annual **MOU** describing the terms and conditions. If both parties are unable to execute an agreement, then **South Texas ISD** must cease using facilities until an agreement can be executed.

4. Duties

(a) **South Texas ISD** may use said facility as a boarding and de-boarding location for its transit system. Vehicles may park in the designated areas, as described in Attachment B in order to board and alight passengers. South Texas vehicles will not remain at said location overnight.

(b) **South Texas ISD** agrees that it will assume all responsibility of their vehicles and shall not hold the <u>City of Los Fresnos</u>, its employees, officials or its affiliates liable for any and all damages.

(c) Any act related to the operation and maintenance of **South Texas ISD** equipment and supplies, such as movement of vehicles, must be performed by **South Texas ISD** personnel.

Attachment: MOU South Texas ISD '20-'21 (3511 : MOU-South Texas ISD)

(d) **South Texas ISD, its employees, agents,** staff and any person acting on behalf of South Texas ISD shall not engage in any reckless, negligent, unsafe, or otherwise illegal or unethical behavior while on the <u>City of Los Fresnos</u> property.

(e) **South Texas ISD**, its employees, agents, staff and any person acting on its behalf shall not modify the <u>City of Los Fresnos</u> facilities in any way. Facilities will be left in exactly the same condition in which they are encountered.

(f) **South Texas ISD's** use of the <u>parking lot</u> facilities must not in any way interfere with the normal operations of the <u>City of Los Fresnos – Memorial Park</u>.

5. Contact Person

For the purposes of this agreement, **South Texas ISD** will coordinate with <u>Mark Milum, City</u> <u>Manager</u>.

6. Notice

South Texas ISD shall provide notice of its schedules and times of pick-up/drop-off of students, names and photos of drivers and other individuals who will have access to the facility. Any change, bussing schedule, or any other important changes must be given at least two (2) weeks in advance. South Texas ISD drivers and other personnel subject to this agreement must possess and maintain appropriate licensure from the State of Texas.

7. Liability

<u>City of Los Fresnos</u> assumes no liability for any lost, damaged, or stolen property. **South Texas ISD** assumes all risk in using the <u>parking lot</u> facilities and agrees to be responsible for any damages caused by the negligence of its personnel or negligent use of its equipment to the extent allowed by law. Nothing in this agreement shall be interpreted or construed to waive sovereign or governmental immunity afforded to South Texas ISD pursuant Texas law.

8. Termination

This agreement may be terminated at any time in writing by mutual agreement of the parties or terminated by either party with ninety (90) days notice, in writing, to the other party.

9. Breach of Obligation

Failure to abide by any provision of this agreement shall constitute a breach. Any party claiming a breach will have the right to terminate the agreement immediately in writing.

10. Authority

We the undersigned hereby attest we have authority on behalf of the <u>City of Los Fresnos</u> and the **South Texas Independent School District**, respectively, to execute and abide by this agreement.

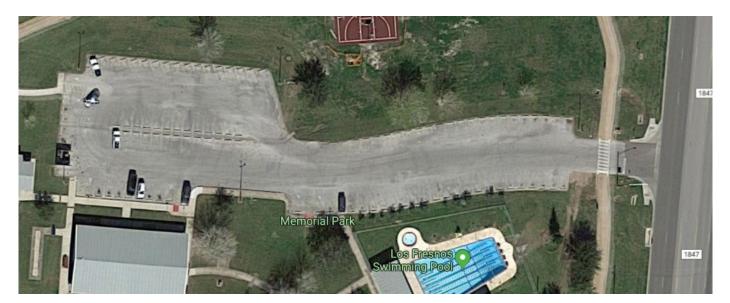

The City Coalition, which the City of Los Fresnos is part of, used attorney, Thomas Brocato and consultant, Karl Nalepa to review and negotiate a settlement with Texas Gas Service on their rate increase filing. The attached information is the outcome of that. It saves our citizens by not having a rate increase as large as it would have been.

I recommend approval.

Model Staff Report in Support of TGS COSA Rate Increase Ordinance

Background

On April 30, 2020, Texas Gas Service Company ("TGS" or "Company") filed for a rate increase pursuant to the Cost of Service Adjustment ("COSA") tariff adopted by the Rio Grande Valley Service Area ("RGVSA") Cities. TGS claimed an entitlement to rate relief under the tariff in the amount of \$1,924,585 on a system-wide basis. Attorney, Thomas Brocato, and consultant, Karl Nalepa, relied upon by the city coalition to review the TGS filing and negotiate a settlement, agreed to recommend a settlement of \$1,893,252 on a system-wide basis.

Purpose of the COSA

The Texas Legislature allows gas utilities to annually adjust rates based on changes to invested capital. That statutory provision is referred to as the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program ("GRIP"). In a GRIP proceeding, cities are not allowed to intervene at the Railroad Commission, cannot challenge the reasonableness of any investment, and may not recover rate case expenses. In 2009, RGVSA Cities negotiated a COSA tariff as a three year experimental substitute for the GRIP process. Finding the COSA process to be mutually beneficial, the COSA process was renewed at the end of the experiment. In 2012, Cities and TGS agreed to a revised COSA tariff. In 2017, Cities and TGS agreed to revise the existing COSA tariff. This is the third filing under the revised tariff.

Resolution of the 2020 Filing

Cities' consultant found that TGS' cost of service calculations were consistent with the terms of the COSA tariff and the costs reflected in the COSA filing were reasonable with two exceptions. TGS has agreed to remove these costs resulting in a reduction to its requested revenue requirement increase.

In addition, in its 2020 COSA filing, TGS is addressing excess revenues caused by the reduction in the federal income tax rate in 2017 under the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. TGS proposes to amortize and return to customers approximately \$5.9 million over a 4-year period.

TGS estimates a first-year customer refund of \$1,854,150. The refund will be made as a one-time bill credit distributed as follows:

TGS will make annual filings to calculate subsequent bill credits until the entire amount is refunded.

In summary, these recommendations result in a total revenue requirement adjustment of \$31,333 off of the Company's original request of \$1,924,585. The agreed reductions to the revenue requirement results in a total increase of \$1,893,252. The first-year refund will essentially offset the increase in rates (\$1,854,150 refund vs. \$1,893,252 rate increase), however, subsequent year refunds will be lower.

EXPLANATION OF "BE IT ORDAINED" PARAGRAPHS IN THE ORDINANCE

- Section 1. When rates change, it is critical for the regulatory authority to find existing rates to be unreasonable and for the new rates to be just and reasonable. This section finds that the new rates reflected in tariffs for each customer class attached to the Ordinance are reasonable.
- Section 2. This paragraph authorizes TGS to collect an additional \$1,893,252 in revenue.
- Section 3. This paragraph authorizes TGS to refund approximately \$5.9 million related to excess tax revenues.
- Section 4. This paragraph requires the Company to reimburse the City for consulting and legal costs associated with the requested increase.
- Section 5. This paragraph repeals any prior City action that might be inconsistent with the new tariffs adopted by the Council.
- Section 6. This paragraph recites compliance with the Open Meetings Act.
- Section 7. This paragraph is a typical savings clause, preserving the remaining provisions of the Ordinance should any one provision be determined to be invalid.
- Section 8. Pursuant to the COSA tariff, the new rates are to become effective on or after the first billing cycle of August each year. This paragraph allows the Company to implement the new rates on meter reads that occur on or after July 29, 2020.
- Section 9. This paragraph requires that an adopted and signed copy of the Ordinance be sent to the Company and outside counsel to the City.

RECOMMENDATION

The City staff recommends adoption of the Ordinance and tariffs establishing new rates.

This project is to re-pave East Tenth Street from Arroyo Boulevard to the Culdesac and a portion of Whipple Road. As you recall the construction contract was approved last meeting in June.

Change Order 1:

This is the change order we discussed when this was approved last meeting that will add an additional 510 feet to the project on Whipple Road making it a total of approximately 1045 feet. This will take it from the railroad to near the church property. The original contract was for \$190,097.28. This will add \$46,487.37 (24.55%) to the contract making it a total of \$236,584.65. This is the most we can increase according to the law. If you recall there was a total of \$271,750 of available construction funds. This leaves \$35,165.35. We will try to determine if they will allow us to utilize the additional funds.

Change Order 2:

This changes the base where the contractor will install a Geogrid system instead of the lime treated subgrade. It provides the soil strength and stabilization needed. We have used this system before (East 6th Street) and is becoming more widely used in many areas. Hanson approves this technology as equivalent or better. The will allow the project to be done quicker which is important due to deadlines of the grant. There is no change in the cost.

I recommend approval of change order number 1 and change order 2.

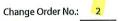

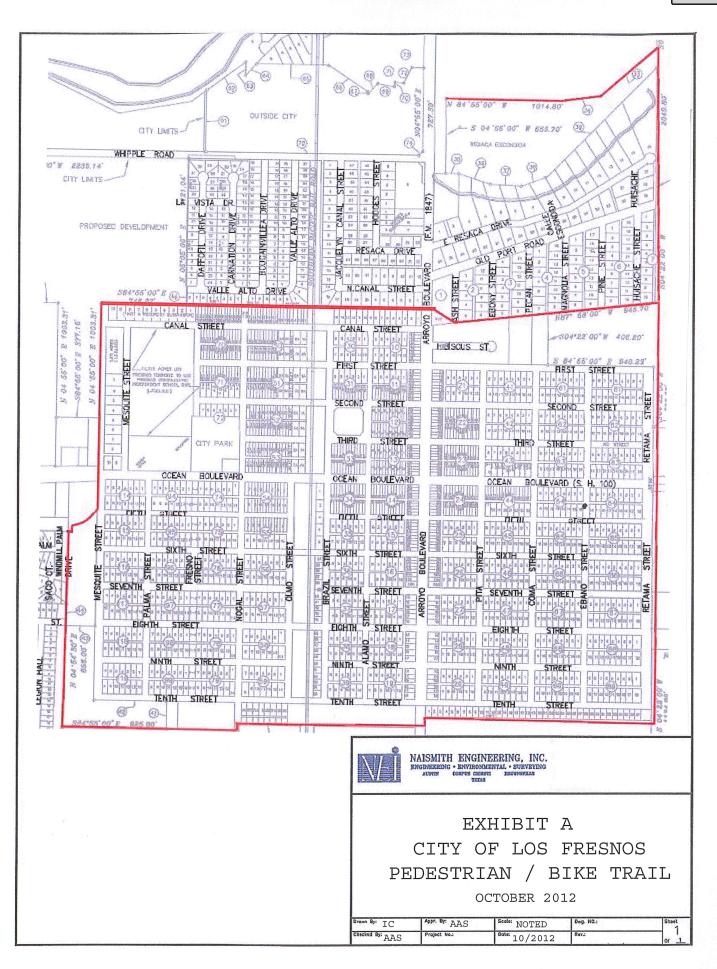

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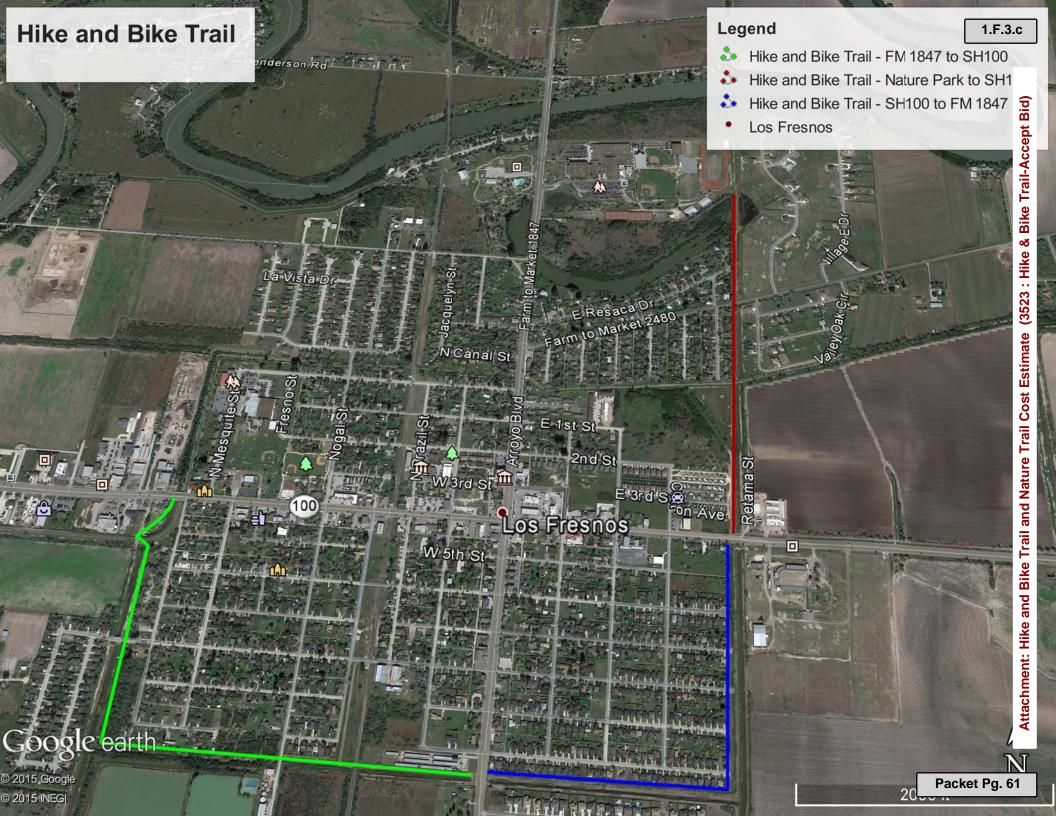

Last meeting an issue was brought up concerning drainage along East Sixth Street and Arroyo Boulevard. I have continued to let TxDot know we feel it is their problem since the poor work was done when TxDot widened the road through the City. You can see where at each street, primarily on the east side, the drains were not installed correctly and are now giving us problems. TxDot continues to say it is a city problem. I will continue to work with them but we can't hold a problem up forever. We have already corrected East Fifth Street with another project. We have contacted a contractor for a quote and can do half of East Sixth Street. It would start almost exactly half way from Pita Street to Arroyo Boulevard and continue to Arroyo Boulevard. We have the funds in the budget to get this done (\$30,000). However, I hate doing a half of a street. In order to do the entire street from Pita Street to Arroyo Boulevard I would need the Council to approve an additional \$35,000.

I recommend approval of funding an additional \$30,000 to repair and re-pave East Sixth Street from Pita Street to Arroyo Boulevard.

We have been working on a policy to handle the individuals that are out due to COVID-19. Attached is the Wage 7 Hour information that is required by law. The other attachment is what we are proposing to place in policy subject to your approval. We have taken information by others as well as what fits our situation.

EMPLOYEE RIGHTS

PAID SICK LEAVE AND EXPANDED FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE UNDER THE FAMILIES FIRST CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE ACT

The **Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA or Act)** requires certain employers to provide their employees with paid sick leave and expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19. These provisions will apply from April 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.

PAID LEAVE ENTITLEMENTS

Generally, employers covered under the Act must provide employees:

Up to two weeks (80 hours, or a part-time employee's two-week equivalent) of paid sick leave based on the higher of their regular rate of pay, or the applicable state or Federal minimum wage, paid at:

- 100% for qualifying reasons #1-3 below, up to \$511 daily and \$5,110 total;
- 3/3 for qualifying reasons #4 and 6 below, up to \$200 daily and \$2,000 total; and
- Up to 10 weeks more of paid sick leave and expanded family and medical leave paid at ²/₃ for qualifying reason #5 below for up to \$200 daily and \$12,000 total.

A part-time employee is eligible for leave for the number of hours that the employee is normally scheduled to work over that period.

ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES

In general, employees of private sector employers with fewer than 500 employees, and certain public sector employers, are eligible for up to two weeks of fully or partially paid sick leave for COVID-19 related reasons (see below). *Employees who have been employed for at least 30 days* prior to their leave request may be eligible for up to an additional 10 weeks of partially paid expanded family and medical leave for reason #5 below.

QUALIFYING REASONS FOR LEAVE RELATED TO COVID-19

An employee is entitled to take leave related to COVID-19 if the employee is unable to work, including unable to **telework**, because the employee:

 is subject to a Federal, State, or local quarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19; has been advised by a health care provider to self-quarantine related to COVID-19; is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and is seeking a medical diagnosis; 	 is caring for his or her child whose school or place of care is closed (or child care provider is unavailable) due to COVID-19 related reasons; or is experiencing any other substantially-similar condition specified by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.
 is caring for an individual subject to an order described in (1) or self-quarantine as described in (2); 	

ENFORCEMENT

The U.S. Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division (WHD) has the authority to investigate and enforce compliance with the FFCRA. Employers may not discharge, discipline, or otherwise discriminate against any employee who lawfully takes paid sick leave or expanded family and medical leave under the FFCRA, files a complaint, or institutes a proceeding under or related to this Act. Employers in violation of the provisions of the FFCRA will be subject to penalties and enforcement by WHD.

COVID-19 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Employees shall report any close contact with known COVID-19 positive individuals or suspected positives, as well as any personal symptoms to Department Heads or City Manager. Complete honesty is required to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Employees will be required to test for COVID-19 if they have symptoms or have been high risk exposed. Symptoms can include cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, diarrhea, or feeling feverish or measured temperature or 100.0 or more.

FACIAL COVERINGS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING IS MANDATORY

It is mandatory for all City employees and members of the public to utilize face coverings while on City premises and cannot maintain social distancing. Face coverings are considered personal protection equipment (PPE) and play a significant role in preventing the spread of COVID-19. Department heads are authorized to discipline employees for failure to comply. A facial covering means a material that extends over the mouth and nose completely. Young children (10 years of age or younger) and persons who are unable to adjust or remove face coverings should not be regarded as suitable candidates for wearing face coverings. In this case, the decision is up to the individual or their parent, guardian or attendant. Social distancing means keeping a minimum of 6 feet of separation in all directions from another individual.

MINIMUM STANDARD HEALTH PROTOCOLS

- 1. An employee that has tested positive for COVID-19 may not return to work until all four of the criteria have been met:
 - At least 3 days (72 hours) have passed without fever (without using fever reducing medication)
 - Individual has improvement in symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, etc)
 - At least seven (7) days have passed since symptoms first appeared; and
 - Is cleared by Cameron County Health Department
- 2. If the Employee has had symptoms that could be COVID-19 and wants to return to work before completing the self-isolation period as seen above, the individual must:
 - Obtain a medical professional's note clearing the individual to return to work based on an alternative diagnosis.
- 3. An employee that has had known low risk (within 6 feet but has face covering, beyond 6 feet but in the general area for less than 10 minutes with no face covering or not exposed to cough or sneeze) close contact with a person who is lab confirmed to have COVID-19 may continue to remain at work and continue normal work schedule.

- 4. An employee that has had known high risk (within 6 feet without face covering, beyond 6 feet gut in the general area for more than 10 minutes with no face covering or exposed to cough or sneeze) close contact with a person who is lab confirmed to have COVID-19 may not report to work until:
 - Get tested for COVID-19 If test results are negative employee can return to work and if test results are positive employee follows the procedures above.
- 5. An employee that has a contact with a person (has no symptoms) who had contact with a person who has tested for COVID-19 or has symptoms, this is not considered an exposure. This is considered a contact of a contact or a third party exposure. The employee can return to work.

A. Wastewater Update - The bids were approved for the Chlorrine Contact Basin Project and the Headworks Project in June. We have the pre-construction conference on July 8. Construction will begin in 2 weeks and they have 210 days to complete.

We continue to work on the funding with TWDB to apply for the \$1,600,000 for wastewater to fix 3 lift stations, run sewer service to the new annexed areas on West Highway 100, replace some old manholes and replace some old sewer lines. Hanson Professional Services has the documents ready for us to advertise, bid, award contract and begin construction for the Whipple Road Wastewater Extension project. The City has to acquire the easements prior to that. TWDB should approve this later in July and funding will happen over the next several months.

B. Water Update - We continue to work on the funding through TWDB to get the upgrades done on the water plant and distribution lines for \$3,700,000. We were able to qualify for a reduced interest rate of 1.65%. Once the final approval is received we will know the actual interest rate. TWDB should approve this later in July and funding will happen over the next several months.

C. Nature Park - We have approximately \$67,040.30 in remaining funds available to complete the bird blind, the drip station and some trails, electricity and water feature. This work will begin in the next few weeks.

D. Hike & Bike Trails - Half Associates has the bids formulated and references checked so a recommendation will be ready for the July 14 Council meeting for approval. The low bid was \$895.152.63. The engineering for the project is \$144,000. The total is \$1,039,152.63. We have \$500,000 from the Valley Baptist Legacy Foundation (VBLF) and \$200,000 from the Texas Parks & Wildlife (TPW) in funding for a total of \$700,000. There is a shortage of \$339,152.63. I have contacted VBLF to see if there is a possibility to get additional funds from them. They will have \$75,000 available. The balance is proposed to be funded 50% by the CDC and 50% by the CIC and 50% by the CIC.

E. CDBG Disaster Grant - We had the pre-construction meeting on July 9. Construction will begin in 2 weeks. This is the redo East 10th Street and a portion of Whipple Road.

F. Henderson Road Project - Construction continues on the Henderson Road Resaca Crossing project. They are working on both sides at this time. Work is progressing.

G. Census Committee - The Census committee has not been able to work due to the Corona Virus. However, the Federal Government extended the deadline into October so hopefully we will have some success when school starts in the fall...if it does. We are utilizing social medial to push folks to fill out the Census. Since we have been focusing on it the last month or so, we have had great increases. The school district not meeting in the regular way is not good for all the plans we had. They are still using social medial and also sending out flyers. We are going to have to get the committee to do some street walking in the future. We still have not delivered flyers to each home but hope to do that soon. We are at 50.8%. That means of all our addresses in the city 50.8% of them have responded already. Cameron County is at 44.7%, the State is at 56.8% and the United States is at 61.9%.

H. Update Planning & Zoning Ordinance - Jackie has located a company to do this. However, since it was not a budgeted item I will feel better if we wait until towards the end of the year. That will tell us how our budget is going and how much the Corona Virus will affect us long term. The cost is \$118,976 which is very low compared to the \$150,000 plus or more that others charge.

I. Drainage Update - I have received easements from the owners of Pederson Construction and Community of Christ Church for the drainage ditch behind their properties. I am still waiting on Zarsky Lumber. Cameron County Drainage District # 1 will assume maintenance on the ditch to keep it clean. The owner on the north side of that drainage ditch that is the developer for Valle Alto will initially clean the ditch and create a larger detention area. This is all positive for that area. Cameron County Drainage District #1 has enlarged the ditch south of the City. This will help additional flow and reduce flooding. Hanson is working on the several engineering designs for help with drainage along Whipple Road as Escondida Resaca. Both will help in poor drainage areas. We are applying for some grants to assist with costs for the construction. We have sent a proposal to TWDB for possible funding for drainage work.

J. 75 Year Anniversary Celebration - Unfortunately due to the Corona Virus we have not been able to meet. Hopefully we can schedule a meeting soon.

K. Whipple Road - The county widened the crossing for the Resaca and will install guard rails soon. I have Hanson Professional Services getting us a Right-of-Way map for Whipple Road so we can see if we can put a sidewalk on one side of the road.

L. CDBG 9th Street Lift Station Grant - Hanson is working on the design of the relocation of the lift station so we can move it out of the back yard.

M. Alley Paving Project and Sign Installation - The last of the alleys should be paved in a few days. Carlos and his staff will then begin installing all the signs. There are a lot of signs. We hope to have them done by the end of July.

N. Audit Agreement

I have wonderful news on the negotiations with CRI (Carr Riggs Ingram) for the audit the next 3 years. One of the items we did not discuss or make clear was the base audit verses the base audit and what is called a Single Audit. The base audit is what is done each and every year. It is what was done the past year that was presented to the Council along with the large binder when our Audit was presented by Quentin Anderson in the last part of March at a special meeting. State and Federal law requires additional information to be done for them in what is called a Single Audit. This is done when a threshold of \$750,000 is met of state and or federal funds. We did not meet that number last year and will not meet it this year either. However, due to the Texas Water Development Board funds that we will be receiving to upgrade the water plant and upgrade some wastewater lines, lift stations and manholes, we will probably meet that number the following year. With this in mind I negotiated to separate these costs. CRI included the Single Audit extra fees in their proposed fees that were originally presented at the Council meeting and again in their next offer. This would have been the price no matter if we needed the "Single Audit" or not. I was able to negotiate these costs to be separated and the City not pay if the Single Audit is not required. I also was able to reduce the cost by a substantial amount. Here is the breakdown.

As you can see the last 2 columns will be the costs. I was able to meet the \$44,000 maximum amount that was voted upon and even less the first 2 years of the agreement and substantially less when we only need the base audit. The City is able to hold the cost on the base audit and pay nominally if a Single Audit is required with the base audit.

I hope this is clear. If not please ask questions. Thanks for all the input from each of you as well as Pablo and Jackie as we have gone through this process. All of the input was utilized to have a great outcome for the City.

O. Sales Tax - We just received the sales tax information for July, which was actually sales and collections in May. We had a 28.77% increase. That brings our annual increase to 7.23%. This is fantastic news for so many things. Our business community overall is doing very well. We have build a solid foundation in our business community to overcome tough times. This has been a combined effort from the Council, CDC Board, Planning & Zoning Board, Park Board, all of our Staff, the Chamber and reall our entire community.

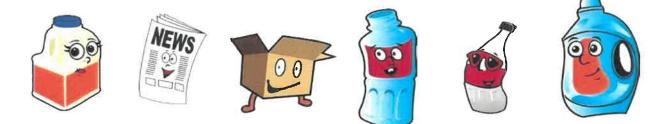

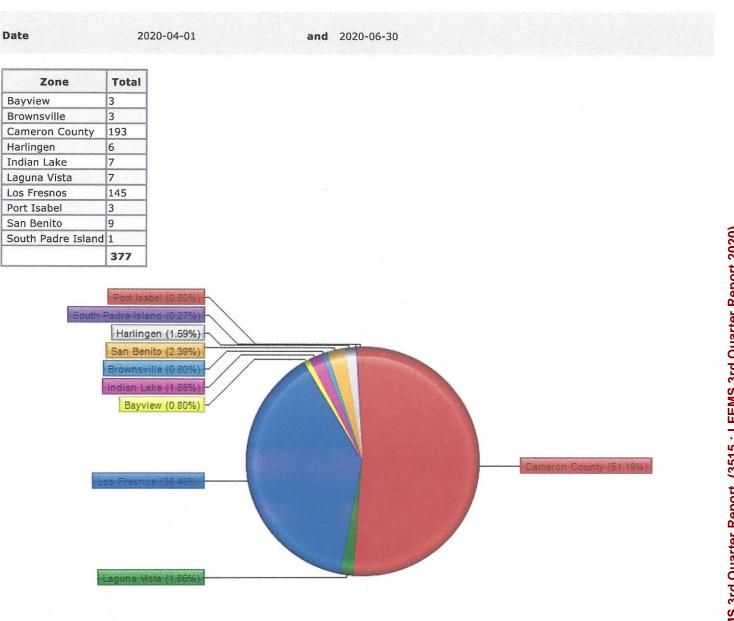
