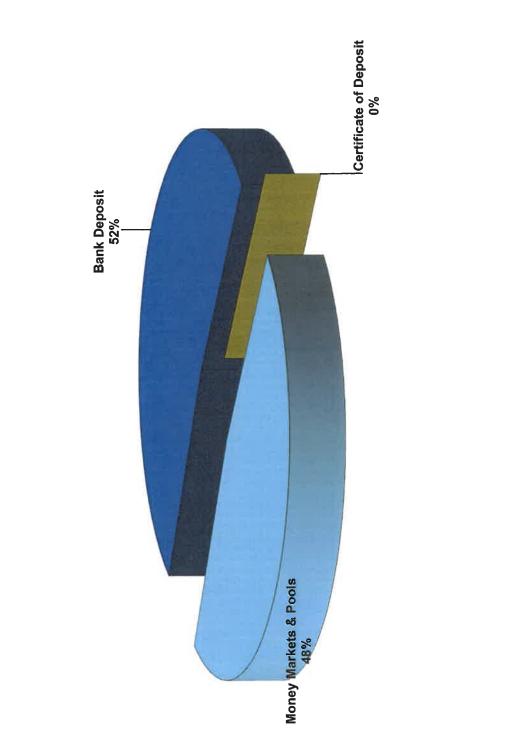

This can quickly pay for itself in as little as 1 service call in a year. This includes upgrades to the system as well as general maintenance.

# Consideration and ACTION to approve the write off of bad debt for the utility accounts and garbage for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

Once a year we write off debt for water, sewer and garbage that is not collectable. As is always the case we don't like to write off any but it is relatively small compared to what is billed in a given year. The total bills of water, sewer and garbage for 2017-2018 was \$2,306,941.57. The total write off of garbage, penalties, water and sewer fees is \$10,463.99 or less than half of 1% (0.45%). We do all we can to collect. These amounts and names actually are kept in the system and if they appear again to open an account we can collect.

Garbage - \$2,287.77 Water - \$4,654.84 Sewer - \$3,521.38

**ACTION ITEM (ID # 3553)** 

### Consideration and ACTION to recommit the funding match for grants and engineering to place the main feed irrigation canal underground through Los Fresnos.

In December 2018 and January 2019, the City and Bayview Irrigation District agreed to an interlocal agreement to explore opportunities for grants to place the irrigation canal underground beginning at O'Reilly Auto Parts to hopefully Arroyo Boulevard or as far as grant funds will go. As part of the agreement, the City can utilize the existing canal during emergencies to drain water if necessary, of course with the approval of the water district at the time. It also allows the City to utilize the area left over (after their canal is in place) for drainage if necessary and to place a hike and bike trail over the canal. In exchange the City agreed to provide match of \$150,000 for a grant request of \$150,000. The grant was approved. Additionally they received a grant for \$300,000 totaling \$600,000 for construction (\$450,000 in grants and \$150,000 from the city). This is a huge win for all and will change the dynamics of that area. The biggest advantage for the City is increase access to clean existing drainage ditches adjacent to the canal and then us the additional space for other drainage in the future. Very seldom do we end up with more access, more land and better drainage but this is one of those momentous times. The City has the \$150,000 match in the Utility fund in excess this year. Also the City agreed to provide \$12,500 as match to the water district's match of \$12,500 and an in-kind match of \$25,000 for engineering services. This gives \$100,000 for engineering services for design and construction engineering on the project. We have the \$12,500 for engineering fees included in the proposed Utility Fund budget for next year 2020-2021.

I recommend approval to fund the \$150,000 match for the project from the 2019-2020 Utility Fund and the \$12,500 engineering match for the project from the 2020-2021 Utility Fund.

Dear Mr. Milum:

I am pleased to advise you that BVID11 and Cameron County Irrigation District #10 (CCID10) are in the final stages of resolving the issue of ownership and control of the main feed canal through Los Fresnos. Therefore, we would like to present this final agreement to the city board for the purposes of proceeding with Phase 1 of the Main Canal Pipeline Conversion.

Most of the Phase 1 funding has been secured through a \$300,000 award from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and \$200,000 from the Texas Water Development Board. Los Fresnos planned to contribute \$150,000 for construction and \$12,500 for surveying and engineering. With that, the BVID11 and CCID10 will provide \$12,500 in funding for engineering and Moore Land Surveying will contribute the remaining \$25,000 in engineering service as an in-kind gift. The \$700,000 total will complete Phase 1 and begin Phase 2.

The purpose of this letter is to request the funds originally budgeted to the project from the City of Los Fresnos. I understand that we will need to present this to the City Commission for a new approval. To remain on schedule with the Bureau of Reclamation grant I hope that BVID11 and CCID10 can make this joint request at a meeting in August.

I look forward to discussing this with you. Thank you for your partnership.

### Consideration and ACTION to utilize excess funds from 2019/2020 Fiscal Year to purchase a patrol vehicle, digital fingerprint system and computer equipment.

Through conservative budgeting, conservative spending and increased revenues throughout COVID-19 times, we have surplus funds this year to be able to make some necessary purchases now instead on trying to fit them in the budget next year.

A patrol vehicle is needed. The one needing to be replaced is 2015 model with a little over 160,000 miles. It is having some major problems but has served well and due to a great job by the PD has lasted past its normal life for a patrol vehicle. It is time to replace it. The cost is estimated at \$48,000 which includes, new cage, lights, siren, radio installation, striping, etc.

The PD's fingerprinting process in antiquated. It has moved to a digital type system. Fingerprint and palm prints are captured electronically instead of the old ink and paper. Once this is done electronically results are verified and returned within hours of transmission instead on days and weeks. It is time to upgrade to 2020. The cost is \$10,000.

There are computer & technology purchases that can be made as well not to relieve next year's budget. We will purchase a server for PD (\$18,000), Rack Mount UPS (\$4,600), Tower for PW (\$2,000), 2 Storage Servers (\$3,200), and IP KVM (\$2,000), totaling \$29,800 of which half is from the General Fund for \$14,900 and the other half is from the Utility Fund for \$14,900.

That totals \$87,800.

### Consideration and ACTION to acknowledge the calculations of the City's no-new-revenue and voter-approval tax rate for tax year 2020 and for fiscal year 2020/2021.

The no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. The no-new-revenue tax rate is \$0.680752 per \$100 valuation. This means that to get the same revenue as last year, the tax rate would be \$0.680752 per \$100 valuation instead of our actual rate of \$0.715 per \$100 valuation. This brings an increase in revenue of \$75,313.49.

The voter-approved tax rate is the highest tax rate the City can adopt without holding an election. The voter-approved tax rate is \$0.731151 per \$100 valuation.

I recommend approval.

#### 2020 Property Tax Rates in CITY OF LOS FRESNOS

This notice concerns the 2020 property tax rates for CITY OF LOS FRESNOS. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual tax rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. #### STEP 2: Voter-Approval Tax Rate

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that a taxing unit may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate. The voter-approval tax rate is split into two separate rates:

1. Maintenance and Operations (M&O) Tax Rate: The M&O portion is the tax rate that is needed to raise the same amount of taxes that the taxing unit levied in the prior year plus the applicable percentage allowed by law. This rate accounts for such things as salaries, utilities and day-to-day operations.

2. Debt Rate: The debt rate includes the debt service necessary to pay the taxing unit s debt payments in the coming year. This rate accounts for principal and interest on bonds and other debt secured by property tax revenue.

The voter-approval tax rate for a county is the sum of the voter-approval tax rates calculated for each type of tax the county levies. In most cases the voter-approval tax rate exceeds the no-new-revenue tax rate, but occasionally decreases in a taxing unit s debt service will cause the NNR tax rate to be higher than the voter-approval tax rate.

### **ACTION ITEM (ID # 3557)**

## Consideration and ACTION to propose a tax rate for tax year 2020 take a record vote, if proposed tax rate exceeds the lower of the no-new-revenue or voter-approval, and set dates for public hearings, if necessary.

The proposed 2020-2021 fiscal year budget will keep the ad valorem tax rate at \$0.715 per \$100 valuation just as it has been for the last 13 years. This will be the 14th year in a row the ad valorem tax rate is at \$0.715 per \$100 valuation. The no-new-revenue tax rate for 2020-2021 is \$0.680752 per \$100 valuation. Remember, the no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. Leaving the tax rate at \$0.715 per \$100 valuation means we will receive more in revenue in the new budget than we currently are getting when comparing the same properties. Since we are leaving the ad valorem tax rate at \$0.715 per \$100 valuation, we will need to hold 1 public hearing because we will receive more revenue than last year when you compare the same properties. The amount received will be approximately \$75,313.49 more than last year.

I recommend the ad valorem property tax rate of \$0.715 per \$100 valuation for the 2020-2021 fiscal year budget setting the 1 public hearing for Tuesday, August 18 at 6:00 pm at City Hall.

A. Wastewater Update - Construction has begun for the Chlorrine Contact Basin Project and the Headworks Project or at least ordering of all the materials and getting things lined up has begun. Actual work. They have 210 days to complete.

TWDB has approved the \$1,600,000 for wastewater to fix 3 lift stations, run sewer service to the new annexed areas on West Highway 100, replace some old manholes and replace some old sewer lines. Don Gonzales will be present at the meeting to present information.

Hanson Professional Services has the documents ready for us to advertise, bid, award contract and begin construction for the Whipple Road Wastewater Extension project. The City has to acquire the easements prior to that.

B. Water Update - TWDB has approved the upgrades done on the water plant and distribution lines for \$3,700,000. Don Gonzales will be present at the meeting to present information.

C. Nature Park - We have approximately \$67,040.30 in remaining funds available to complete the bird blind, the drip station and some trails, electricity and water feature. This work was delayed due to COVID-19 surge and Hurricane Hanna. Work will begin soon.

D. Hike & Bike Trails - Half Associates, engineer and Pederson Construction, contractor, will have the pre-construction meeting prior to our meeting. The project will probablly not begin until the contractor has finished Henderson Road. The low bid was \$895.152.63. The engineering for the project is \$144,000. The total is \$1,039,152.63. We have \$500,000 from the Valley Baptist Legacy Foundation (VBLF) and \$200,000 from the Texas Parks & Wildlife (TPW) in funding for a total of \$700,000. There is a shortage of \$339,152.63. I have contacted VBLF to see if there is a possibility to get additional funds from them. They will have \$75,000 available. The balance was approved to be funded 50% by the CDC and 50% by the City.

E. CDBG Disaster Grant - Construction has been completed on East 10th Street and a portion of Whipple Road. There are some funds remaining and we are trying to get them to allow us to utilize them to complete an additional 400 to 500 feet on Whipple Road.

F. Henderson Road Project - Construction continues on the Henderson Road Resaca Crossing project. Work is progressing. Once the headwalls are in things will begin to move more quickly.

G. Census Committee - The Census committee has not been able to work due to the Corona Virus. However, the Federal Government extended the deadline into October so hopefully we will have some success when school starts in the fall...if it does. We are utilizing social medial to push folks to fill out the Census. Since we have been focusing on it the last month or so, we have had great increases. The school is still using social medial and also sending out flyers. We are going to have to get the committee to do some street walking in the future. We still have not delivered flyers to each home but hope to do that soon. We are at 52.6%. That means of all our addresses in the city 52.6% of them have responded already. Cameron County is at 46.4%, the State is at 58.0% and the United States is at 63.1%.

H. Update Planning & Zoning Ordinance - Jackie has located a company to do this. However, since it was not a budgeted item I will feel better if we wait until towards the end of the year. That will tell us how our budget is going and how much the Corona Virus will affect us long term. The cost is \$118,976 which is very low compared to the \$150,000 plus or more that others charge. We have funds in the CDC budget for this but will have to come up with other funding to be able to get this done.

I. Drainage Update - Overall we did well during the 9 inches of rain during Hurricane Hanna. We have some flooding of streets but none in homes or vehicles that we are aware of. We identified some additional areas of concern that we will be working on in the future for better drainage. I have received easements from the owners of Pederson Construction and Community of Christ Church for the drainage ditch behind their properties. I am still waiting on Zarsky Lumber. I discussed with their attorney and they will be sending a proposal. Cameron County Drainage District # 1 will assume maintenance on the ditch to keep it clean. The owner on the north side of that drainage ditch that is the developer for Valle Alto will initially clean the ditch and create a larger detention area. This is all positive for that area. Hanson is working on the several engineering designs for help with drainage along Whipple Road as Escondida Resaca. Both will help in poor drainage areas. We are applying for some grants to assist with costs for the construction. We have sent a proposal to TWDB for possible funding for drainage work.

J. 75 Year Anniversary Celebration - Unfortunately due to the Corona Virus we have not been able to meet. Hopefully we can schedule a meeting soon.

K. Whipple Road - The county widened the crossing for the Resaca and installed the guard rails. CCRMA continues to work on the overall project of widening of Whipple Road. Hanson Professional Services is working on design to place a sidewalk on one side of the road.

L. CDBG 9th Street Lift Station Grant - Hanson is working on the design of the relocation of the lift station so we can move it out of the back yard.

M. Alley Paving Project and Sign Installation - The last of the alleys are done. Carlos and his staff will then begin installing all the signs. There are a lot of signs. We have been delayed due to Hurricane Hanna and mosquito spraying. We simply have not had personnel available to work on that. We hope to have them done soon.

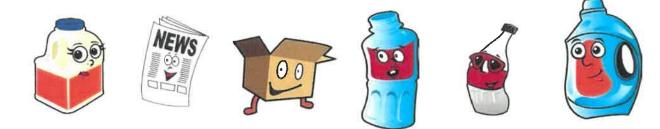
