Mr. Milum explained that the Council had approved in prior meeting to bid the project out for a basketball court at Memorial Park. At that time the Community Health Program Grant agreed to pay \$50,870 toward the project. The increased amount is shown as a revenue of \$21,266 and an expenditure for the same amount on the budget amendment. The project was bid and the low bid is \$73,100. The difference from the bid price and what the Community Health Program has agreed to pay is \$15,999 and is shown as 2 line items on the budget amendment. The amount can be funded with increased sales tax revenue we did not budget and is reflected on the budget amendment for revenue. We have asked if they would be willing to put additional funds toward the project but have not heard back from them. The project must be complete by September 30th.

The first change is to do away with developing lots with 50 feet in width and 5,000 square feet which is what the zoning calls for in R-1A. Lots already developed or in the process with the R-1A zoning will be grandfathered. Any new development will follow the zoning of R-1 which calls for a minimum lot width of 60 feet and 6,000 square feet.

The second change is for RLB which is Residential Limited Business to increase from lots 50 feet wide to 60 feet wide.

The last change is requiring garages to be a minimum of 11 feet wide by 24 feet long for a one car garage and 22 feet wide by 24 feet long for a two car garage. Additionally 2 vehicles must fit on the property without having to move a vehicle to meet the requirement of 2 parking spaces.

Mr. Milum explained that the effective ad valorem tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. The effective ad valorem tax rate is \$0.688065 per \$100 valuation. This means that to get the same revenue as last year the tax rate would be \$0.688065 per \$100 valuation instead of our actual rate of \$0.715 per \$100 valuation.

The rollback ad valorem tax rate is the highest tax rate the City could have before taxpayers would be able to start rollback procedures. The rollback ad valorem tax rate is \$1.084908 per \$100 valuation.

Mr. Milum explained that the proposed 2015-2016 tax rate is \$0.715 per \$100 valuation just as it has been for the last 8 years. The effective ad valorem tax rate for 2015-2016 is \$0.688065 per \$100 valuation. The effective ad valorem tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. Since we are proposing to leave the tax rate at \$0.715 per \$100 valuation we will have to hold 2 public hearings as we will receive more revenue than last year. The additional amount we will receive is \$99,596 with \$69,203 going towards the increase in debt and \$30,393 for operations.

Mr. Milum stated the Republic Services has presented the City with an option to extend our contract by 5 years. There is currently 1 year left on the contract. Republic Services will freeze costs this year if we extend contract. They are asking that the City increase the cap that we currently have from 4% to 5%. Overall they have done well with a few problems here and there but all have been worked out.

Mr. Omar Rodriguez and Mr. Damian Saenz from Republic Services were present. Mr. Rodriguez stated that the changes are to keep the residential cart, brush/bulk collection, commercial and commercial brush/bulk waste and roll off rates the same for one year until October 1, 2016. To update CPI calculation language to 100% water sewer trash only. Increase the CPI to 5% and extend contract for 5 more years.

Mr. Milum, Mr. Rodriguez and Mr. Saenz answered questions from the Council.

Please place on your September or October agenda an action item that will name your nominee for Cameron Appraisal District Director and submit the nominee's name to our office before **October 15, 2015**. Your current representative is **Mr. Ricardo Morado**. Pursuant to Texas Property Tax Code Sec.6.03(g), each taxing unit entitled to vote may <u>nominate by resolution adopted by its governing body one candidate</u>. The Chief Appraiser will then deliver a ballot to your governing body by **October 30<sup>th</sup>** so that the ballot can be placed on your meeting agenda. Ballots must then be returned to our office by **December 15, 2015**.

Pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Texas Property Tax Code, the requirements for eligibility to serve on an appraisal district board of directors are as follows:

- 1. The individual must have resided in the district for at least two years immediately preceding taking office.
- 2. An employee of a taxing unit that participates in the district is not eligible to serve on the board unless the individual is also a member of the governing body or an elected official of a taxing unit that participates in the district.
- 3. An individual is ineligible to serve if the individual is related within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity to an individual who is engaged in the business of appraising property for compensation for use in proceedings under this title or of representing property owners for compensation in proceedings under this title in the appraisal district.
- 4. An individual is ineligible to serve if related to an employee of the appraisal district within the second degree by affinity or within the third degree by consanguinity unless the employee resigns.
- 5. An individual is ineligible to serve if the individual or a business entity in which the individual has a substantial interest is a party to a contract with the appraisal district or a taxing unit that participates in the appraisal district.
- 6. An individual is ineligible to serve if the individual owns property on which delinquent taxes have been owed to a taxing unit for more than 60 days after the date the individual knew or should have known of the delinquency unless the delinquent taxes and penalties are being paid under an installment payment agreement or the taxes are deferred or abated under Tax Code Section 33.06 or 33.065.

(TCAP) to negotiate an electric supply agreement for three years for deliveries of electricity effective January 1, 2018; authorizing TCAP to act as an agent on behalf of the City to enter into a contract for electricity; authorizing City Manager to execute an electric supply agreement for deliveries of electiricity effective January 1, 2018 and committing to budget for energy purchases in 2018 through 2020 and to honor the City's commitments to purchase power for its electrical needs in 2018 through 2020 through TCAP.

As I mentioned during the budget meeting in August, our electric contract expires December 31, 2017. Our current rate is .07485 per KWH. In 2012-2013 our electricity costs were \$225,190.98 (\$18,766 per month). In 2013-2014 our electricity costs were \$277,430.20 (\$23,119 per month). So far in 2014-2015 through 10 months our electricity costs are \$235,890.70 (\$23,589 per month).

The resolution is a 3 year agreement for us to get power for no more than 4.3 cents. There will also be an opportunity to maybe get a lower rate in the first quarter of 2016. Of course with any wait there is also a possibility rates will increase. Experts say that is unlikely during this time. I believe it would be to our advantage to wait to see the 3 different alternatives that will be available in early 2016 and make a decision then.

I recommend the resolution be rejected.

RE: TCAP Future Supply Options and Opportunities

The electric supply agreement for TCAP members expires on December 31, 2017. The TCAP Board of Directors wants to make options available to all members in the near future and have the 2018 prices locked down before the Summer of 2016. The current wholesale market is reflecting prices that for the first time match prices that were available when the deregulated retail market opened in 2002. TCAP members will have two different opportunities to contract for electricity to be provided upon expiration of the existing contract. The first opportunity will be this Fall. The second opportunity will be next Spring.

#### Supply Options discussed with TCAP members

Over the past two months, TCAP's Executive Director, consultants and general counsel have met in the offices of about 35 TCAP members to explain exciting plans regarding future supply options and to obtain feedback on the preferences of individual members. Based on those visits, in the first quarter of next year, TCAP is likely to offer all members a choice of three supply options. Each member will be able to select the option that best suits their needs and culture. In early 2016, all TCAP members will be requested to pick one of three supply options. The size of load for each option will be defined by resolutions passed by each member's governing body. The options will most likely include:

- 1. A full requirements, fixed price option (with all consumption priced the same regardless of type of load or time of day), similar to the current TCAP contract, except at a significantly reduced price. The benchmark price will be around 4 cents per kWh, depending on zone.
- 2. A fixed price for peak usage and a variable price for off-peak usage that relies upon the spot market where prices have been historically low. This option may offer some savings over option 1, but with some monthly volatility in price.
- 3. A fixed price for base load usage and reliance on renewable energy (probably solar) for some portion of peak usage and additional reliance on the spot market. This option may provide savings greater than option 2, but with additional volatility in price.

While the options to be presented early next year are an exciting development, the TCAP Board recognized that many TCAP members are being approached by brokers and REP agents claiming that there is an urgent need to lock-in future prices. Wholesale electricity prices are largely dependent upon the supply and price of natural gas which is the marginal fuel for generation of electricity within ERCOT. There is a glut of natural gas and the current pricing environment for electricity is unlikely to change significantly anytime soon. Any broker or agent that visits you must deal through a Retail Electric Provider (REP), who in turn must buy power in the wholesale market from some other entity. Under Texas law REPs cannot own generation resources. TCAP on the other hand is a political subdivision corporation that is authorized to contract in the wholesale market. Remember that TCAP is a non-profit entity that is owned by cities and controlled by city employees for the benefit of cities.

#### The Fall Solicitation

TCAP consultants believe that current wholesale energy prices will persist at least through the first part of next year, and may even be lower than current levels in the coming months. Prices for 2018 load have declined slightly since we started meeting with city members several months ago. However, the TCAP Board is sensitive to the fact some members, particularly smaller cities that we have not had an opportunity to visit, are anxious about future prices. Therefore, the Board has authorized a load solicitation to take place ahead of the offering planned for early next year. In the near future, you will receive a draft resolution for your governing body to consider which will authorize someone (i.e., the mayor, city manager, executive director or TCAP Board President) to sign a three-year contract covering the period January 1, 2018 thru December 31, 2020 at a fixed price not to exceed 4.3 cents. Each member will be given six weeks to act on the resolution, but should do so only if the governing body is uncomfortable waiting until early 2016 to contract for 2018 or is so risk adverse that there is no desire to consider alternative supply options other than a full requirements, fixed price contract. TCAP's wholesale supplier will be given several months to lock-in a load (below the threshold price) necessary to serve the members who adopt the early resolution. Options 2 and 3 referenced above will not be available with the Fall offering. Additionally, since a number of members have mentioned that they would like to see a five-year extension rather than a threeyear deal, next Spring's resolution will authorize a two-year extension of the three-year term prior to its expiration. The Fall option will not contain that provision.

WHEREAS, the City of <u>Los Fresnos</u>, Texas (City) is a member of Texas Coalition For Affordable Power, Inc. (TCAP), a non-profit, political subdivision corporation dedicated to securing electric power for its more than 160 members in the competitive retail market; and

WHEREAS, TCAP has unique rights under Texas law to negotiate directly in the wholesale market and arrange separate contracts for power supply and retail services which provides TCAP leverage to achieve contract provisions that single city negotiations with a Retail Electric Provider (REP) would be unlikely to produce; and

WHEREAS, TCAP's geographic diversity across all four ERCOT zones produces an aggregated peak load that is lower than the single peak load profile of the vast majority of individual TCAP members, allowing price benefits in the wholesale market that are not likely to be available to any given TCAP member alone; and

WHEREAS, TCAP and its predecessor organizations, Cities Aggregation Power Project, Inc. (CAPP) and South Texas Aggregation Project, Inc. (STAP), negotiated favorable contract terms that resulted in rebates from the wholesale supplier and reasonable commodity prices for delivered electricity since 2002 resulting in stable budgets for electricity for members; and

WHEREAS, commodity prices for electricity experienced significant volatility between 2002 and 2009, with prices ranging from 4 cents to over 13 cents per kWh, causing CAPP and STAP members to welcome a five year contractual commitment that came close to cutting the 2008 prices in half, with that contract being extended until December 31, 2017, with a negotiated price reduction of about 1 cent per kWh; and

**WHEREAS,**TCAP has become a forceful voice for consumer protections and market reform to benefit the public and well as cities and other political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, TCAP s owned by its members and shares everything according to relative load size of members and is controlled by a 15 member Board of Directors, all of whom must be city employees of members who represent diversity in size and geography; and

WHEREAS, wholesale power prices within the deregulated Texas market are largely determined by the NYMEX gas futures prices for natural gas which are currently low and relatively stable, but which change daily; and

United Way used to fund sports programs for them but now they only fund educational items. This is the reason they have not been able to continue with the sports programs we desire. Currently there will not be volleyball or basketball. Another grant they received to work with teens requires them the use half of the gym floor for sofas, recliners, computers, etc. Basically they have a gym that can't really be utilized they way it needs to be. They are checking with the school to see if their facilities can be used for volleyball and basketball. I'm not confident anything can be done. Flag football is not being discussed at this time. For them to do the programs we desire will take lots of funds and I don't think it is wise to give them that kind of money as their track record is not great. I did ask if they would allow the City to take over the Club and we make it a department within the City. I believe that would be the only way to fund the programs.

The first agreement is the one we have used in the past but they have not met the items in the agreement. We have paid only the first quarter of the agreement (\$500) since they did not sign it or comply with the items included. I believe the right thing to do is to adjust the agreement to fit what is being done as some good things are occurring. Then we can pay the balance of the agreement. The \$2,000 was never intended to fund any particular program but be an overall supplement for them. As you can figure out \$166.67 per month is not a substantial amount to cover much. The items in the new agreement will be beneficial to the kids they serve and to utilize the facility during our City events at Memorial Park.

I recommend approval.

The City further agrees to provide for the length of the contract worker's compensation insurance coverage, at the City's cost, to all members of the Provider while they are acting in the course and scope of their duties as fire fighters hereunder. The City further agrees to provide insurance coverage to the Provider under the City's existing insurance policies, and the Provider agrees to reimburse the City for all insurance premiums incurred and paid as a result of or on behalf of the Provider's assets, property, and equipment. The City further agrees to assist the Provider with a donation procedure by placing an option on each monthly water bill to each water customer of the City. Each customer may choose to donate \$1.00 or more per month to the Provider. The City will collect such donations and remit them to the Provider each quarter on the following dates: October, November and December on January 15, January, February, and March on April 15, April, May, and June on July 15, and July, August, and September on October 15. The City will provide 24 hours, 7 days per week dispatching through the City's Police Department. The city will provide water for firefighting services as well as water and sewer to the fire station.

### IV. REPORTS

It is agreed that the Provider shall provide a written report every quarter summarizing said services rendered to the City during that period, with said report listing all calls by date, location, and nature of call. The report shall be due January 5, April 5, July 5, and October 5.

### V. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this agreement shall be for one (1) year, beginning October 1, 2015, and ending September 30, 2016, but as renewable as provided hereunder.

### VI. TERMINATION OF RENEWAL

If the City does not intend to renew this Agreement, the City shall provide the Provider written notice of its intent to terminate by United States Mail, return receipt requested, dated not later than July 1, 2016.

Such insurance needs include, without limitation and as examples only, Worker's Compensation, General Liability, Vehicle Liability, and Error & Omissions.
