Mr. Milum:

Attached is Change Order No. 4 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Headworks Improvements. The change order is for additional labor equipment and material to upgrade and repair one of the clarifiers, the sludge bed water return lift station and the installation of a new flow meter at the discharge point of the plant. In addition to the upgrades and repairs is an extension to the contract days by 120 calendar days to account for additional time required for delivery and installation of the new skirt for the clarifier and the new pumps and controls for the lift station. The change order reflects an increase to the contract amount by \$119,200.00 for the addition of the Clarifier skirt, pumps and controls for the lift station, the new flow meter, and an additional 120 calendar days extension to account for delivery and installation of the new equipment.

We recommend approval of Change Order No. 4 to increase the contract amount by \$119,200.00. This work includes, installing a new flow meter, upgrading and repairing the clarifier and lift station, revising the contract amount to \$1,270,950.00 and for the additional 120 calendar days revising the total contract time to 515 calendar days as proposed by Ferguson Service Systems, Inc.

CITY OF LOS FRESNOS

FIRE PROTECTION SERVICE CONTRACT

This is a Contract and Agreement made and entered into on the date set forth preceding the signatures of the parties herein and the parties herein mutually agree as follows:

I. CONTRACT

The parties to this Agreement are the **City of Los Fresnos, Texas**, a municipal corporation located in Cameron County, Texas and the **Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department, Inc.**, a non-profit corporation located in Cameron County, Texas. The City of Los Fresnos, Texas is hereinafter referred to as "City", and the Los Fresnos Volunteer Fire Department, Inc. is hereinafter referred to as "Provider".

II. PROVISIONS OF CONTRACT

During the term of this Agreement, the Provider agrees to furnish fire fighting services defined as the use of personnel and equipment to extinguish and suppress fires or to handle "hazardous incidents" or "confined space rescue", or rescue operations including vehicle accident extrication, and bee attacks only, but not the prevention of fires or related training, education, maintenance, communications, or administration and other related matters to the City. In performing its obligations under this Agreement, the Provider agrees to answer all calls referred to it by agents or representative of the City and/or any resident or tenant of the City who may be in need of fire fighting or rescue service which the Provider undertakes to provide by this Agreement.

III. COMPENSATION

The City agrees to pay the Provider the sum of \$115,000 for the fiscal year 2021-2022 for said services. The City agrees said sum is to be paid in quarterly installments of \$28,750 each on the following dates: December 1, March 1, June 1, and September 1.

The City further agrees to provide for the length of the contract worker's compensation insurance coverage, at the City's cost, to all members of the Provider while they are acting in the course and scope of their duties as fire fighters hereunder. The City further agrees to provide insurance coverage to the Provider under the City's existing insurance policies, and the Provider agrees to reimburse the City for all insurance premiums incurred and paid as a result of or on behalf of the Provider's assets, property, and equipment. The City further agrees to assist the Provider with a donation procedure by placing an option on each monthly water bill to each water customer of the City. Each customer may choose to donate \$1.00 or more per month to the Provider. The City will collect such donations and remit them to the Provider each quarter on the following dates: October, November and December on January 15, January, February, and March on April 15, April, May, and June on July 15, and July, August, and September on October 15. The City will provide 24 hours, 7 days per week dispatching through the City's Police Department. The city will provide water for firefighting services as well as water and sewer to the fire station.

IV. REPORTS

It is agreed that the Provider shall provide a written report every quarter summarizing said services rendered to the City during that period, with said report listing all calls by date, location, and nature of call. The report shall be due January 5, April 5, July 5, and October 5.

V. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this agreement shall be for one (1) year, beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022, but as renewable as provided hereunder.

VI. TERMINATION OF RENEWAL

Should either party intend to renegotiate this Contract, it shall notify the other in writing dated not later than August 1, 2022 and each succeeding year. If such negotiations have not been completed on or before the beginning of that fiscal year, both parties expressly agree to act in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract for a period of thirty (30) days. If during such time both parties fail to negotiate a new Contract, the negotiation period shall terminate at the end of the thirtieth day of said period. However, the Contract obligations of both parties shall be extended an additional sixty (60) day period beyond the end of the negotiation period to allow the City to secure alternate services. At the end of this second period, this Contract shall terminate.

In the event neither party notifies the other of its intention not to renew this Contract, the parties may assume that this Contract will be renewed at the same terms and conditions as presently agreed upon in this Contract with the rate of \$115,000 per year.

The Provider shall provide the City with an annual audit within a reasonable time.

VIII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Contract shall comprise the entire agreement between the parties hereto and any amendment shall be enforceable only after being reduced to writing, mutually executed by the parties hereto and attached hereto.

The City of Los Fresnos, Texas is hereinafter referred to ad "City", and the Los Fresnos Ambulance Service is hereinafter referred to a "Provider".

II. PROVISIONS OF CONTRACT

During the term of this Agreement, the Provider agrees to furnish emergency medical services to the residents of the City within the limits of the City. The service will include non-emergency services. The Provider will be the exclusive provider for emergency and non-emergency medical services. In performing its obligations under this Agreement, the Provider agrees to answer all calls referred to it by agents or representatives of the City and/or any resident or tenant of the City who may be in need of medical services which the Provider undertakes to provide by this Agreement.

III. COMPENSATION

The City agrees to pay the Provider the sum of \$160,000 for the fiscal year 2021-2022 for said services. The City agrees said sum is to be paid in quarterly installments of \$40,000 each on the following dates: December 1, March 1, June 1, and September 1.

The City further agrees to provide for the length of the contract insurance coverage to the Provider under the City's existing insurance policies, and the Provider agrees to reimburse the City for all insurance premiums incurred and paid as a result of or on behalf of the Provider's assets, property, and equipment. Such insurance needs include, without limitation and as examples only, Worker's Compensation, General Liability, Vehicle Liability, and Error & Omissions. The City will provide 24 hours, 7 days per week dispatching service through the City's Police Department. The City will provide water and sewer to the EMS station.

IV. REPORTS

It is agreed that the Provider shall provide a written report every quarter summarizing said services rendered to the City during that period, with said report listing all calls by date and nature of call. The report shall be due January 5, April 5, July 5, and October 5.

V. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall be for one (1) year beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2022, but as renewable as provided hereunder.

VI. TERMINATION OF RENEWAL

Should either party intend to renegotiate this Contract, it shall notify the other in writing not later than August 1, 2022 and each succeeding year. If such negotiations have not been completed on or before the beginning of that fiscal year, both parties expressly agree to act in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract for a period of thirty (30) days. If during such time both parties fail to negotiate a new contract, the negotiation period shall terminate at the end of the thirtieth day of said period. However, the Contract obligations of both parties shall be extended an additional sixty (60) day period beyond the end of the negotiation period to allow the City to secure alternate services. At the end of this second period, this Contract shall terminate.

In the event neither part notifies the other of its intention not to renew this Contract, the parties may assume that this Contract will be renewed at the same terms and conditions as presently agreed upon in this Contract with the rate of \$160,000 per year.

VII. FINANCIAL REPORTS AND AUDITS

The Provider shall provide the City with an annual audit within a reasonable time.

VIII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Contract shall comprise the entire agreement between the parties hereto and any amendment shall be enforceable only after being reduced to writing, mutually executed by the parties hereto and attached hereto.

Executed in duplicate by the Mayor of the City and the President of the Provider, both of who are duly authorized to represent and bind said parties to the terms and conditions of the contract, as set forth.

SERVICE AGREEMENT

This is an agreement between the City of Los Fresnos, hereinafter called "CITY" and the Los Fresnos Area Chamber of Commerce, hereinafter called "CHAMBER".

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a development program between the City and the Chamber to encourage and promote an expanded business development. The City supports the Chamber's efforts to promote tourism, commercial and industrial development within the City. The City recognizes the substantial economic contribution from the local businesses and industrial establishments deriving from sales tax, economic development sales tax and property taxes.

This agreement will begin on the 1st day of October 2021 and will be for a one (1) year period and will be reviewed by the City Council to consider extending agreement or not. Payment for this agreement shall be monthly.

Therefore, it is agreed that the Chamber will develop programs and perform the following duties:

- 1. Establish, maintain and share information base of all business listings of Chamber members.
- 2. Share City related statistics and Economic Development programs to be used for promotion and expansion of businesses and industrial developments.
- 3. Encourage expansion of existing business and encourage development of new businesses and industry within the City.
- 4. Maintain a visitor's information center.
- 5. Promote, develop and assist the City in producing festivals, celebrations and events for the community and to attract visitors to the community to increase business for the local commercial establishments in addition to recreational activities for the citizens.
- 6. The Chamber will establish and maintain a website and allow the City to link to the website. The Chambers website will have the City's statistics and any other information that the City supplies to the Chamber.
- 7. Provide directory assistance for specific services and events.
- 8. Promotion of city events, school events and ministry events through social media.
- 9. Provide promotional services to any and all non-profit organizations.
- 10. Work on maintaining a community calendar.
- 11. To present quarterly reports to Council.

Therefore, the City will contribute \$2,850 per month for a total of \$34,200 to the Chamber for a one (1) year period and then will reconsider agreement. The City will assist the Chamber in accomplishing its goals of increasing tourism, commercial and industrial development.

The Chamber must submit Audited Financials from a Certified Public Accountant. A Form 990 to the IRS is sufficient.

This agreement is effective upon the approval of both parties.

CITY OF LOS FRESNOS AGENCY SERVICES AGREEMENT

This agreement, between the City of Los Fresnos ("City") and the Boys & Girls Club of Los Fresnos ("the Agency"), constitutes the official and exclusive agreement between the City and the Agency for the delivery of the below stated services, during the agreement period from October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022. Funds provided by the City to the Agency for services rendered are to be considered payment for these specific services, and are not to be construed in any manner as a contribution or donation. The amount to be paid for these services during the service period shall be \$60,000 to be paid on a quarterly basis of \$15,000 per quarter in December, March, June and September. The Agency must furnish a report of their activities for the quarter in January, April, July and October. In addition, the Agency must submit Audited Financials from a Certified Public Accountant. A Form 990 to the IRS is sufficient.

The following services shall be rendered by the Agency during the agreement period:

- 1. Tutoring
- 2. Arts & Crafts
- 3. Sports & Recreation (flag football, basketball, and volleyball

Additional services provided shall be stated on attached addendum.

This young lady will receive a scholarship from the Rodeo Committee to continue her education. The 2021 LFPRCA Queen was Miss. Celeste Villarreal who represented Highland Hustlers. The Rodeo graciously honored their scholarship to her this year at one of their meetings.

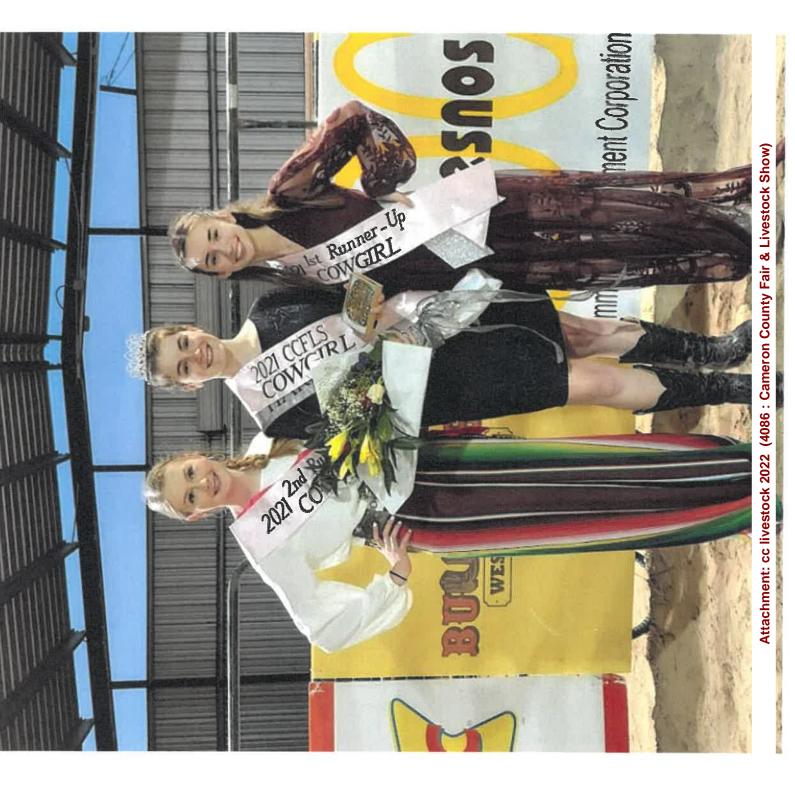

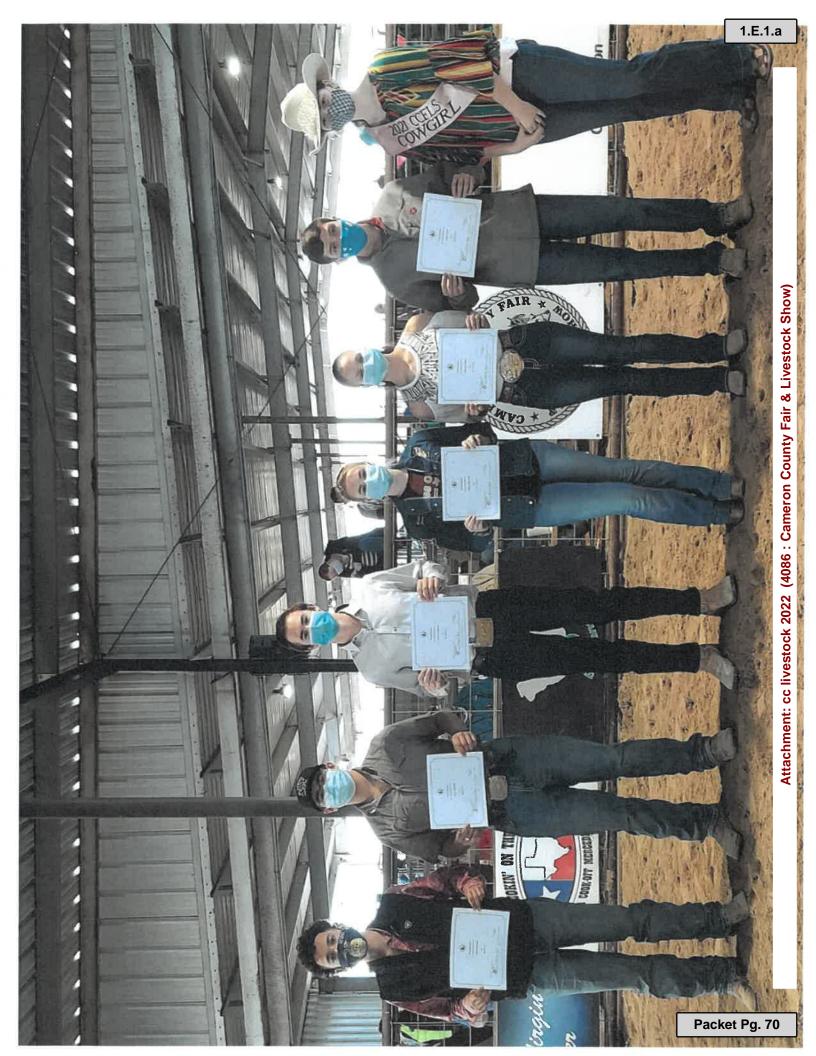

<u>SCOPE</u>

The Rodeo Committee shall extend to and include all communities in the surrounding area of Los Fresnos and the rodeo committee shall be located in Los Fresnos, Texas

OBJECTIVES

The purpose of the Rodeo Committee is to support and promote agriculture and oldwest heritage in the Lower Rio Grande Valley through education, entertainment, scholarships and community involvement. Our annual flagship event is focused on accomplishing these goals by creating a family-friendly educational environment that showcases the old-west and agriculture ways of life through events such as the Rodeo and Livestock Show. We further promote our purpose by supporting like-minded organizations and awarding the youth of our region with scholarships and sponsorships to further their education with an emphasis in an agricultural related field.

Los Fresnos Committee is registered as a 501(c)(3) Non Profit Organization

In the last 31 years the Los Fresnos Rodeo has grown from a very small rodeo to the "Biggest Little Rodeo In Texas". One of our goals was to bring family friendly entertainment to the citizens of Los Fresnos and the surrounding areas. We are now one of the largest little rodeos in Texas in the number of contestants and number of fans that participate in our three day event. Many of the restaurants and business in Los Fresnos tell us that they look forward to the rodeo since it brings considerable amount of business for them. They have told us that they have to prepare in advance to make sure they are stocked up with goods for the rodeo. We are very proud that the rodeo brings a big boost to our local business.

The rodeo committee has also added another event to bring entertainment to the folks in the Los Fresnos area. This event is the Los Fresnos Cowboy Cook-Off. We will be having our 3rd annual event this year and from the feedback we are getting this year should be the largest cook-off since initiating the event. Along with the cook-off we will be having local bands including some of the Los Fresnos high school groups that will provide live music. We are also having a classic car show, market place, pony rides and food trucks for the folks to partake. Mr. Lopez requested this information. There are 2 areas that we need to complete to bring services to that area.

One area is along West Highway 110 from past Walmart to FM 1575 and then north on FM 1575 to Escalante Road. That area has been worked on with TWDB funds through a planning grant and loan we started in 2014. Once the planning part (engineering) was complete we immediately applied for a loan to construct. That was finally approved and we will receive bids at the end of this month. It will then have to be approved by TWDB. Construction should start in a few months and complete by the end of the year of first of 2022.

The other area is 4 homes along north Whipple Road. Engineering has been completed. We have not secured all the easements. We have not received a clear direction if all the owners want service. I have proposed to use funding from the Coronavirus Recovery funds to complete this project.

Consideration and ACTION to approve projects for funding with the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

The good news is we have \$970,949.24 in Coronavirus Recovery Funds available now and the same amount will be available in 1 year for a total of \$1,941,898.48. The bad news is we have more needs than will cover these items. The first page of the attachment shows all potential needs at this time.

Gene Daniels, EMS Director wanted me to include either debt payoff for their building or a remount unit to replace an older ambulance. The remount keeps the "box" and provides a new vehicle, cab and chassis. There are cities doing this but Pablo and I do not see that this meets the criteria. If there is a need maybe the city would want to fund this through the general fund.

The next 4 items deal with pay for employees. Many cities, and Cameron County have done this for employees since all of our employees worked throughout the entirety of COVID at their normal place while many other businesses were able to allow employees to work from home for safety. I am usually in favor of any way we can show appreciation to our employees but I believe at this time we need to utilize these funds to help with basic infrastructure needs, not pay.

We have prices for sewer improvements on East 5th Street (\$101,750) and East 10th Street (\$325,275). These are issues that we have when we have lots of rain and the sewer system in overwhelmed, it backs up in these areas. While this would help these areas, it does nothing to fix the actual cause of the problem and would only possibly move the problem to another area. That would be wasting \$427,000 on something that will not directly address the problem. I propose we use the funds in this first year cycle to try to fix the actual problem which would resolve the issues on 5th Street and 10th Street. If after this is done, there is still a problem, we can use the 2nd year funds to do this or even local funds from the normal utility fund.

We have been notified by TWDB that we are potentially in line for a \$418,550 grant and a \$1,255,650 zero percent interest loan to handle all of the drainage items listed here including a city wide drainage plan. This funding is not 100% guaranteed at this time but we will know in the next year. With that in mind I recommend we hold off to make a decision on drainage with the year 2 funding. We will have a clear picture at that time. Additional reasons for this are as follows. Whipple Road drainage is being looked at with the widening of Whipple Road and that larger project. Halff Associates through CCRMA are working on that. We will have more information in the next year and most likely the drainage will be included in widening of the road. The Resaca Escondida drainage is not something that is critical. During heavy rains we utilize a large pump to pump the water from the dead Resaca to the drainage ditch. Last month the Council funded buying 2 more of these pumps so we have plenty to do all we need during a large rain event. Water will increase in the Resaca and possibly get a small amount on the road but we can immediately pump it off like we did last time where we had no traffic problems. With the irrigation canal being placed under ground in the next year, it will allow for easier

cleaning and maintaining of the drainage ditch from Valle Alto to Highway 100. I recommend we not include drainage in the first year of Coronavirus Recovery Funding.

I believe the sidewalk on Whipple Road should wait until the larger project that is being worked on to widen Whipple Road is done. The sidewalks will be done in conjunction with that. If we do it now, the sidewalk will probably be torn out when the road is widened. That would be a waste. I know there is a concern with kids that walk on the roadway. However, it is illegal to walk on the roadway so it is their responsibility. They should be walking off the roadway.

Sewer Manhole Rehabilitation: Quite of few of these will be done in the sewer project we have funded that will also extend sewer service to west Highway 100 and up FM 1575. We don't have a cost estimate because we feel most will already be done. Once that project is over we can determine the number left that need to be done and fund in year 2 or through our general budget each year.

This leaves us with some items I recommend we fund in the first year. This is seen on page 2 of the attachment.

Project 1: We need to replace our 125,000 ground water storage tank. This has been indicated on our annual inspection and TCEQ is requiring it be done soon. The cost is estimated to be \$173,000.

Project 2: Extend sewer service to the 4 homes on north Whipple Road that was annexed a few years ago. Plans are complete and ready to go out for bids. The estimated cost is \$257,050.

Project 3: Sewer Line Replacement 1's & 2's: I will have a map showing the lines that need to be replaced and how it will help resolve the issues we are having on East 5th Street and East 10th Street. Part of engineering work already done a few years ago was utilizing a camera to determine old sewer lines that have leaks or cracks. This will replace all the ones that were the worst. The study identified and rated each one from a 1 being the worst to a 5 being the better of the ones that need to be replaced. We have replaced a few lines with our regular budget funds. We have also included some lines to be replaced in the project to extend sewer service to west Highway 100 and up FM 1575 as well as our next CDBG grant funding. This will put us in great shape. The cost estimate is \$507,500 plus engineering.

As you can see, these 3 projects will utilize all the funds available now. I recommend these 3 projects for the year 1 funding of the Coronavirus Recovery Funds.

Dear Mr. Flores:

Please place on your September or October agenda an action item that will name your nominee for Cameron Appraisal District Director and submit the nominee's name to our office before <u>October</u> <u>15, 2021</u>. Your current representative is <u>Mr. Ricardo Morado</u>. Pursuant to Texas Property Tax Code Sec.6.03(g), each taxing unit entitled to vote may <u>nominate by resolution adopted by its</u> <u>governing body one candidate</u>. The Chief Appraiser will then deliver a ballot to your governing body by <u>October 30th</u>.

Section 6.03, Tax Code, is amended by amending Subsection (k-1)

This subsection applies only to an appraisal district established in a county with a population of 120,000 or more. The governing body of each taxing unit entitled to cast at least five percent of the total votes must determine its vote by resolution adopted <u>at the first or second open meeting</u> of the governing body that is held after the date the chief appraiser delivers the ballot to the presiding officer of the governing body. The governing body must submit its vote to the chief appraiser <u>not later than the third day following the date the resolution is adopted</u>.

Pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Texas Property Tax Code, the requirements for eligibility to serve on an appraisal district board of directors are as follows:

- 1. The individual must have resided in the district for at least two years immediately preceding taking office.
- 2. An employee of a taxing unit that participates in the district is not eligible to serve on the board unless the individual is also a member of the governing body or an elected official of a taxing unit that participates in the district.
- 3. An individual is ineligible to serve if the individual is related within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity to an individual who is engaged in the business of appraising property for compensation for use in proceedings under this title or of representing property owners for compensation in proceedings under this title in the appraisal district.
- 4. An individual is ineligible to serve if related to an employee of the appraisal district within the second degree by affinity or within the third degree by consanguinity unless the employee resigns.

- 5. An individual is ineligible to serve if the individual or a business entity in which the individual has a substantial interest is a party to a contract with the appraisal district or a taxing unit that participates in the appraisal district.
- 6. An individual is ineligible to serve if the individual owns property on which delinquent taxes have been owed to a taxing unit for more than 60 days after the date the individual knew or should have known of the delinquency unless the delinquent taxes and penalties are being paid under an installment payment agreement or the taxes are deferred or abated under Tax Code Section 33.06 or 33.065.

NOTE: The following section becomes effective January 1, 2022. Any prior service does not count as part of the 5 term limitation. (SB 63)

- 7. An individual is ineligible to serve if the person has served as a member of the board of directors for all or part of five terms, unless (A) the individual was the county assessor-collector at the time the individual served as a board member; or (B) the appraisal district is established in a county with a population of less than 120,000.
- 8. An individual is ineligible to serve if the person has engaged in the business of appraising property for compensation for use in proceedings under this title at any time during the preceding three years.
- 9. An individual is ineligible to serve if the person has engaged in the business of representing property owners (for compensation) under this title in the appraisal district in the preceding three years.
- 10. An individual is ineligible to serve if the person has been an employee of the appraisal district at any time during the preceding three years.

A. Wastewater Update - Construction continues on the Chlorine Contact Basin Project and the Headworks Project. There were some delays receiving equipment due to COVID but all equipment has been received. Work is progressing and is mostly completed. If we add the items included in this agenda it will continue for a few months.

The loan for \$1,600,000 for wastewater to fix 3 lift stations, run sewer service to the new annexed areas on West Highway 100, replace some old manholes and replace some old sewer lines has closed. TWDB has given us the approval to move forward so we are getting bids this month. We are meeting with property owners getting permission to connect. Finally some great progress.

B. Water Update - The loan for \$3,700,000 for the water plant upgrade and distribution lines has closed. Work has started and moving along. This is a 2 year project ending in June of 2023. The contractor wants to finish in a year and a half.

C. Hike & Bike Trails - Work has been slow. Contractor has problems like others getting individuals that want to work. They will begin installing the curbs up to Highway 100. I have stressed the importance of getting a crew on the project and getting it complete.

D. Henderson Road Project - The contractor again has committed to return & begin work on Monday September 13 provided rain does not halt the present work or there are no supply delays or COVID delays. I have been told this for about 6 weeks now so I will believe it when work has begun. The remaining work on Henderson Road should be completed within 5 weeks, 2 to 3 weeks on the west end and 2 to 3 weeks on the east end.

E. Drainage Update - We are waiting on possible grant and zero percent interest funding. The drainage pipe under the railroad north of Henderson Road is collapsed. I have contacted the UP Railroad to fix it. They are looking into the situation. I contact them about every 2 weeks to remind them and check status but they don't mover very fast on projects.

F. Whipple Road - CCRMA continues to work on the overall project of widening of Whipple Road. They will have some thoughts on what can be done in a couple of months and have been working with Hanson Professional Services since they know drainage plans we have and what

they have been working on dealing with the sidewalk on one side of the road. TxDot is reviewing some items that CCRMA have questioned.

G. COVID-19 - We still have not received official word or direction on the new funds that we will be receiving \$1,941,898.48. We just received 50% or \$970,949.24. We will receive the other 50% next August or September. We can spend what we received now. The potential projects are on the agenda for your approval.

H. TxDot Highway 100 Project - Not much has changed except they did finish the one side they initially started on and moved to the next section. They are slow and have had lots of weather delays. They also admitted they pulled the contractor off the project to complete some other projects that have deadlines. We were able to get them to pave where the bad spots were but more continue to show up. We talked to them Thursday to fix some more areas. Our Police Department continues to manually operate the traffic light at peak times, Friday afternoon, Saturday, Sunday, Holidays, and other times when it backs up but we aren't having to do that as much. TxDot will not pay to manually operate the traffic light. They say the timing on the light is the best they can do. We are dealing with it the best we can. Hopefully work can start moving faster.

I. Pallet Company - The owner of the property hired a company to bring an incinerator in to get the pallets removed quickly. TCEQ and our Fire Marshal have approved this. They have had some delays but are still working on making this happen.

J. Stanford Road & FM 1575 Drainage & Sewer - Drainage, TxDot and the County are still dragging their feet on cutting the drain ditches along the road. We keep pressing but have no control.

Sewer - The contractor has completed all the work on the manholes we identified as the greatest problem. We think this will help tremendously. We will continue to monitor and see what else needs to occur.

NOTE A – NATURE OF ACTIVITIES

The Boys and Girls Clubs of Los Fresnos, Inc., (the "Organization") is a not-for-profit corporation incorporated May 13, 1996 in the state of Texas, being exempt from federal and state income tax.

The Organization's purpose is to provide guidance and promote the education, social health, vocational and character development of the young boys and girls, between the ages of five (5) years and eighteen (18) years of age, irrespective of race, color, creed, or national origin; to receive, invest and disburse funds; and to hold property for the purpose of the Organization. The Organization is funded primarily from allocations from the United Way of Southern Cameron County, membership dues, governmental and individual contributions and fundraising activities. The following is a summary of the significant accounting reporting policies.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT REPORTING ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Codification

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) is the single official source of authoritative, nongovernmental U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP)

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Organization have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

Classification and Reporting of Net Assets

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Accounting Standards Codification Not-for-Profit Entities topic 958, ASU 2016-14. Under ASU 2016-14, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to two (2) classes of net assets: Net Assets without Donor Restriction and Net Assets with Donor Restriction. As permitted by this statement, the Organization does not use fund accounting.

The Organization has adopted SFAS No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made. Contributions received are recorded as Net Assets without Donor Restrictions and Net Assets with Donor Restriction depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

- Net Assets without Donor Restriction
 - The portion of net assets of the Organization that is neither permanently restrictive nor temporarily restricted by donor-imposed stipulations.
 - o Free from any external restrictions and available for general use.
 - o Expendable funds available for support of the Organization.
 - o Funds invested in plant, including the Organization's buildings.
 - Funds which represent unrestricted resources designated by the Board of Directors ("the Board") for specific purposes.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT REPORTING ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

- Net Assets with Donor Restriction
 - Contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the Organization is limited by donorimposed stipulations that either expire by the passage of time or can be fulfilled and removed by actions of the organization pursuant to those stipulations.
 - o Expiration: Reclassified to unrestricted net asset
 - Stipulated time restriction ends.
 - Purpose restriction is accomplished.
 - Reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.
 - Assets that are received and used in the same year are classified as unrestricted.
 - Contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the organization is limited by donorimposed stipulations that neither expire by the passage of time nor can be fulfilled and removed by actions of the Organization pursuant to those stipulations.
 - May also include, on certain contributions, as stipulated by the donor:
 - realized and unrealized gains
 - interest
 - investment income

Revenue Recognition

- Grant Revenue is recognized:
 - When received if there are no stipulations.
 - o Reimbursable grant revenue when invoiced.
 - When invoiced at period end if the grant is a reimbursable grant.
- Contribution Revenue is recognized when received if there are no stipulations.

Services Donated Requiring Specialized Skills

Under SFAS No 116 Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made, the Organization recognizes services requiring specialized skills, such as those provided by accountants, attorneys, marketing consultants, and other professionals, if the services would need to be purchased if not donated. Contributions of donated services that create or enhance non-financial assets or that require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased, if not provided by donation, are recorded at their fair values, in the period received.

Services donated not requiring specialized skills are not recognized.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT REPORTING ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Use of Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenditures during the period. The Organization's management evaluates estimates and assumptions based on historical experience, various factors and circumstances. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

- Depreciation in based on Class-Life
- Donations In-Kind on M.V. of food single & bulk prices.
- Donations In-Kind were not completely recorded when received and used. Estimates were applied.
- Expenses by function: Direct payroll expense which is allocated by an analytical study annually of estimated time and effort per individual

Liquidity

Assets are sequenced according to their nearness to conversion to cash and liabilities according to their nearness of their estimated maturity.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and Cash Equivalents include all monies in banks and highly liquid investments with maturity dates of less than three (3) months. The carrying value of the cash and cash equivalents approximate fair value due to the short maturities of that financial instrument.

Investments

The Organization has no investments.

Credit Risk

Custodial Credit Risk refers to the risk that in the event of a bank failure, the deposits may not be returned. The Organization's policy maintains and demands time deposits through local depository banks that are members of the Federal Reserve System.

Accounts maintained at financial institutions insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) still bear credit risk.

Acquired Property

Property consists of two (2) buildings, at cost, or at estimated market value at the date of receipt from donor, less accumulated depreciation. However, state-funding sources may maintain equitable interest in the property purchased with grant monies as well as the right to determine the use of any proceeds from the sale of these assets. The State has a reversionary interest in those assets purchased with its fund of a cost in excess of \$5,000.

Expenditures, for property, are capitalized at cost. Property purchased with a cost greater than \$2,500 are expensed if purchased with grant monies. Depreciation is computed on a straight-line basis over the useful lives of the related assets.

Assets donated with explicit restrictions, regarding their use and contributions of cash that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as donor restricted. Absent donor stipulations regarding how long those donated assets must be maintained, will report expiration of donor restrictions when the donated assets are placed in service as instructed by the donor.

Pass through Probation Fees and Court Mandated Donations

- Pass through Probation Fees are received from the Cameron County Supervision & Corrections in return for allowing probationers to complete their community service at the Organization's facilities.
- Court mandated donations from various individuals, ordered by local courts, to donate a portion or all their court fines to local not-for-profit organizations.

NOTE C – REVENUES (continued)

Contributions and Promises to Give

The Organization adopted SFAS No. 116, which describes a contribution as an unconditional transfer of assets or settlement of liabilities in a voluntary nonreciprocal transfer. They are too measured at their estimated FMV and reported as an increase in net assets immediately, either as:

- Net assets without donor restrictions
- Net assets with donor restrictions

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires, (that is when a stipulation time restriction ends, or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Special Events:

Contributed Services: The Organization received a substantial amount of services donated primarily by municipals' Community Service appointees, coaches, and the Organization's members in carrying out the Organization's mission. No amounts have been reflected in the financial statements for those services since they do not meet the criteria for recognition under SFAS No. 116.

Endowments: The Organization will follow the Endowments of Not-for-Profit Organizations: Net Asset Classification of Funds Subject to an Enacted Version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, and Enhanced Disclosures for all Endowment Funds guidance of the Codification if applicable. This pronouncement provides guidance on the net asset classification of donor restricted endowment funds for a not-for-profit organization that is subject to an enacted version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act of 2006 (UPMIFA). UPMIFA is a model act approved by the Uniform Law Commission (ULC, formerly known as the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws) that serves as a guideline for states to use in enacting legislation. This guidance also requires disclosures about an Organization's endowment funds (both donor-restricted endowment funds and board-designated endowment funds), whether of not the Organization is subject to UPMIFA.

NOTE D – DONATED PROPERTY

Donated Property

Donated property is recorded at estimated FMV in net assets as

- Net assets without donor restrictions
- Net assets with donor restrictions

The Organization benefits throughout the year from numerous volunteers that provide hundreds of hours of service for Organization's activities. In addition, numerous volunteers and businesses donated items for use or sale for fundraising activities. Those contributed services are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements, as they did not meet the criteria for recognition under SFAS No. 116.

NOTE E – EXPENDITURES

Expenditures for Program and Supporting Services

SFAS No. 117 requires all not-for-profit organizations to provide information about expenditures reported by their functional classifications either the statement of activities or in notes to the financial statements.

Program Service Expenditures: Direct and indirect costs related to providing a not-for-profit organization's programs or social services; the costs of the activities for which purpose the organization exits (i.e., salaries, rent, transportation, and supplies of individual programs).

Management and General: overall direction, including expenditures for activities of the governing board, business management, general record keeping, and budgeting.

Fundraising: the cost, of activities that constitute an appeal for financial support, incurred to induce others to contribute money, securities, time, materials, or facilities. Including costs of personnel, professional consultants, rent, printing, postage, telephone, direct mail lists, direct contact solicitations, and unsolicited merchandise sent to encourage contributions.

Membership Development: According to SFAS No. 117, paragraph 28; membership development expenditures should include any expenditures relating to "solicitation" of new members and membership dues, membership relations, and similar Expenditures. Audit Guide, par. 13.41: if there are no significant benefits or duties from the membership, the membership development expenditures may be fundraising expenditures.

NOTE F - CONTINGENCIES

The Organization participates in programs that are sponsored by grants. Expenditures financed by grants are subject to audit by appropriate grantor agencies. If program expenditures or support claims are disallowed due to noncompliance with grant program regulations, the Organization may be required to reimburse the grantor. The Organization believes it has substantially complied with applicable laws and regulations and any subsequent examinations will not have a material effect on any of the individual governmental resources or the overall position of the Organization.

Accordingly, no reserves have been made. For the year ended June 30, 2020, there are no contingencies.

The future operation is contingent upon continual funding from the United Way of Southern Cameron County and contributions from the members of the community.

NOTE G - FIXED ASSETS

Buildings are recorded at cost if purchased, fair value if donated. All land and buildings are capitalized. All equipment is expensed.

NOTE I – REVENUES FROM GOVERNMENT AND NON-GOVERNMENT GRANTS

SFAS No. 116 requires recognition of contribution revenue upon the transfer of an economic benefit, usually the receipt of either the contribution (cash or other economic benefit) or a pledge (a promise to make a contributior in the future). Restrictions may be permanent, such as the establishment of an endowment in perpetuity, or they may be temporary, such as for next year's operations or a specific project.

The underlying concept of SFAS No. 116 is that receipt of restricted contributions does not amount to incurring a liability, but merely accepting limits on the future use of the contributions. The concept is based on the belief that adequate disclosure of donor-imposed restrictions and properly stated liabilities is more important than matching revenue and expenses.

Therefore, under SFAS No. 116, contributions with donor-imposed restrictions are reported as restricted revenue, which increase Net Assets with Donor Restrictions. For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020, the were no governing board designations from net assets.

NOTE N – LEASES AND AGREEMENTS

The Organization has a written agreement with the City of Los Fresnos, Inc. whereby the City of Los Fresnos, Inc. donated the Organization the use of land that the recreational building is built on in return for services provided by the Organization.

The written agreement can be terminated by either party by giving thirty (30) days' notice. The legal implications of termination by either party have not been determined. The City of Los Fresnos, Inc. currently pays the building's electricity and water.

The Organization has no leases.

NOTE O -- REVENUE CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS

Revenue Contracts

- The State of Texas #girlstrong: A state funded contract with the Office of the Governor fiscal year 2020. As a sub-contractor, the Organization will be reimbursed \$6,120 per year for serving 15 youth per year through SMART Girls & NetSmatz. \$5,100 was received for the year ended June 30, 2020.
- USDA (passed thru the State of Texas) Food Program: USDA provides food and snacks to the members of the Organization for the Organization's After School Program. The Organization pays 15% of the revenues collected to FP, a contractor that manages the monies. Reimbursement funding, of previous month expenditures, is received a week after notice of amount to be reimbursed is received. The contract is effective from October 1, 2019 until terminated. \$46,518 was received for the year ended June 30, 2020.

NOTE O - REVENUE CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS (continued)

Revenue Agreements

- AIM (Texas Academic Innovation & Mentoring): AIM will provide training, ongoing consultation, and monitoring of the Texas AIM program. The Organization will partner with Sylvan Franchisee, according to AIM's criteria. The agreement was signed September 1, 2019 and may be renewed as agreed upon by all parties and subject to the Alliances re-procurement process and is subject to Texas Educational (TEA) appropriation. \$6,948 was received for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020.
- City of Los Fresnos Agency Services Agreement: during the agreement period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020, for the delivery of Tutoring, Arts & Crafts, Sports & Recreation services, an amount of \$60,000 will paid on a quarterly basis. \$60,000 was received for the year ended June 30, 2020.
- City of Los Fresnos Facility Use Agreement: The Organization has agreed to allow the use of the Organization's building for the City of Los Fresnos Community Health Program's exercise classes for the term of January 7, 2020 through February 28, 2020. \$648 was received for the year ended June 30, 2020.
- Cameron Country Community Service Probation (CCCS&C): The Organization was put on a list of twenty (20) for one (1) year to receive probationers' fines and fees of Cameron and Willacy County. \$19,133 was received for the year ended June 30, 2020.

NOTE P – DONOR RESTRICTED REVENUE USED IN THE SAME YEAR AS RECEIVED

Any donor restricted revenues received, that were expended in the same fiscal year, are not considered donor restricted.

NOTE Q - ORGANIZATION'S FINANCIAL ASSETS AS OF JUNE 30, 2020.

The Organization is in compliance for the year ended June 30, 2020. The position of accounting for income taxes is recognized in the financial statements, if applicable. The Organization had no income tax for the year ending June 30, 2020.

NOTE V – PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENT

During fiscal year 2019 the Organization overstated deferred expenditures by \$1,183 and overstated accounts payable by \$57. The net effect of these adjustments decreased beginning net assets by \$1,126.

NOTE W – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management evaluated subsequent events through April 16, 2021, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued and determined there are no subsequent events that impact the financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2020.

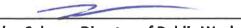
