Mr. Milum reported on the following to the Council:

A. Wastewater Plant Upgrade - Naismith Engineering will have a description and cost estimates for the proposed work to be done by the middle of October so I can send to TWDB to get approval to proceed.

B. Water Plant Issues - We are waiting for the last bids to come in on removing the sludge and will get work done immediately within a few weeks. The filters have been analyzed and it was determined all of the coal in the 5 filters is not sufficient. The filter company will be here no later than December to replace some gaskets that are leaking causing us to lose the coal. This is what is causing the Turbidity levels to be higher than acceptable. We are closely monitoring it and making it work until then. They have begun work on upgrades on all the TCEQ suggestions that we can do in house. Guzman & Munoz Engineering is working on the more expensive and detailed items that need to

be done by a contractor to include as part of the study he is doing so we can hopefully get funding through TWDB.

C. Water & Wastewater Engineering Study - Guzman & Munoz Engineering continues to work on design, surveying, easements or property required for east and west Highway 100 as well as north on FM 1575. They are also studying all the existing water and wastewater lines in the city to determine which need to be replaced for various reasons.

D. Nature Park - The parking lot construction will begin about October 17. The bids for the restroom and the trails will be brought to you for approval at a special meeting on October 18. The Master Plan for the entire park will be ready to look at on October 18 as well.

E. Hike & bike Trails - We are waiting to hear from property owners on one area where there is not sufficient right-of-way for the trail. Once we get that resolved Halff Associates can finalize the plans.

F. Montes-Castro Park - The Master Plan should be ready for your review on October 18.

G. TxDot Sidewalk Projects - The sidewalks on Arroyo Boulevard from Ocean Boulevard to Alvarez Court on both sides of the road and on Ocean Boulevard from Church's Chicken to Tapia's Cafe will be bid out in November. Once the bids are approved they will begin construction probably sometime in December.

H. CDBG 2015-2016 Grant - Once the contracts get signed and approved by TDA we will begin the process to get the street work designed by Naismith Engineering for East Sixth Street from Pita Street to Coma Street and East Ninth Street from Arroyo Boulevard to Coma Street.

I. CDBG 2017-2018 - The administrative services and engineering services were approved at this meeting earlier in the agenda. Over the next few months we will bring you some options on what we feel are the top priorities that need to be done with the available funds.

J. Welcome sign - the bids have been received and I will take to the CDC Board for approval in November.

K. Hazardous Mitigation Plan - We have the information posted at every cities web side and library for public comments. Once that is complete the plan will be brought to each city for approval. That will occur in either in November or December.

L. TxDot Overlay - Foremost Paving will be working on all lanes of traffic from O'Reilly Auto Parts to the Rodeo Grounds taking off old asphalt and repaving. This will begin October 17 and they have indicated they will do work at night to avoid having so many traffic problems. Light at Walmart - TxDot has begun design on the light to be installed at Ocean Boulevard and Evergreen Street. They have not indicated what the schedule will be yet.

M. November Council Meetings - The November Council meeting on November 8 is election night. It needs to be moved since Pam will be tied up dealing with the election results. I suggest we move it one week to November 15 since we approved the public hearing on the proposed annexation for that date. Then we will need to have another meeting to canvas the results of the election and get the new elected officials sworn in along with having the second public hearing on the proposed annexation.

PARTIES

THIS AGREEMENT, is entered into by and between the LOS FRESNOS C.I.S.D. POLICE DEPARTMENT of the State of Texas, and hereinafter referred to as the District Police and the LOS FRESNOS POLICE DEPARTMENT, a city in the County of Cameron, Texas referred to hereinafter as the City Police Department. This agreement and service is entered into under the Interlocal Agreement Act. Any party paying for the performance of any function or service shall make these payments from current revenues available to the paying party.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to establish an understanding and cooperation between the District Police and the City Police Department.

The Los Fresnos Consolidated Independent School District (Los Fresnos C.I.S.D.) has established and communicated a policy clearly establishing the parameters of the District Police. The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. also understands the need to work with law enforcement agencies having overlapping jurisdiction with the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. Additionally, the City Police Department is equally dedicated to serving the public by coordinating and communicating with the District Police.

III.

AGREEMENT

The City Police Department and the District Police agree to aid each other as may be requested and as each is capable. It is understood that the City Police Department has jurisdiction throughout the City of Los Fresnos and that the District Police have jurisdiction throughout the school

district. It is also understood and agreed that the primary responsibility of the District Police will include law enforcement activities within school campus boundaries of the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. during normal school hours and at other times as may be necessary. The District Police will coordinate after school hours law enforcement activities with the City Police Department.

In anticipation of the need for City jail facilities, prisoner transport to the Cameron County Jail, communication/dispatching services, and 11 radios @ \$10 monthly basic radio channel utilization the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. agrees to pay the City Police Department a sum of FOUR THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY AND NO/100THS DOLLARS (\$4,820.00) per year. Additionally, in anticipation for the need of 4 city police officers to assist with providing added security and traffic control during the 5 home football games (5:45pm to 11:45pm) the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. agrees to pay the City Police Department a sum of THREE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND NO/100THS DOLLARS (\$3,600), and for the anticipation of the need for training facilities, the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. agrees to assist the City of Los Fresnos with improvements to or maintenance of the City Police Department's gun range. Such assistance may be in the form of materials, labor or financial. Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. agrees to pay the City of Los Fresnos Police Department a sum of TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100THS DOLLARS (\$2500) annually in exchange for the use of their facility by the District's Police Department These funds will be paid in March of 2017.

IV.

TERM

The term of this agreement shall be for a twelve (12) month period from the date of this agreement. However, either party upon thirty (30) days written notice may terminate without cause this agreement.

V.

INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

5.1 <u>Governmental Functions</u>. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, this agreement is a contract for and with respect to the performance of governmental functions by governmental entities. The relationship of the City and the District shall be that of independent contractors.

5.2 <u>City Insurance and Indemnification</u>. The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. shall have no liability whatsoever for the actions of, or failure to act by, any officers, employees, subcontractors, agents or

assigns of the City, or for or with respect to this Agreement, and the City covenants and agrees that:

- 5.2.1 The City shall be solely responsible for and with respect to any claim or cause of action arising out of or with respect to any act, omission or failure to act by the City or its agents, officers, employees and subcontractors, while performing any function or providing or delivering any service undertaken by the City pursuant to this Agreement;
- 5.2.2 The City shall be solely responsible for procuring and maintaining in effect any insurance coverage it may, in its sole discretion, deem necessary or appropriate to protect its interests.

5.3 <u>District Insurance and Indemnification</u>. The city shall have no liability whatsoever for the actions of, or failure to act by, any officers, employees, subcontractors, agents or assigns of the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D., or for or with respect to the this Agreement by the District, and the District covenants and agrees that:

- 5.3.1 The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. shall be solely responsible for and with respect to any claim or cause of action arising out of or with respect to any act, omission or failure to act by the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. or its agents, officers, employees and subcontractors, while performing any function or undertaking any use of the Land and this Agreement;
- 5.3.2 The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. shall be solely responsible for procuring and maintaining in effect any insurance coverage it may, in its sole discretion, deem necessary or appropriate to protect its interests.

5.4 <u>Governmental Immunity</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, modify or amend any legal defense available at law or in equity to either the City or Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. nor to create any legal rights or claim on behalf of any third party. Neither the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. nor the City waives, modifies, or alters to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Texas. No provision of this agreement is a consent to suit.

VI.

MISCELLANEOUS

6.1 This agreement contains the complete expression of the agreement between the parties hereto, and there are not promises, representations, agreements, warranties, or inducements except such as are made herein and fully set forth. Any party paying for the performance of any function, services, or improvements to the demised premises shall make these payments from current revenues available to the paying party. No alterations of any of its terms, covenants or conditions shall be binding unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties hereto. It is agreed that all of the rights, remedies, and benefits provided by this agreement shall be cumulative, and shall not be exclusive of any other rights, remedies and benefits allowed by law.

6.2 Nothing herein may be construed as the formation of a partnership, joint venture, or other business organization or any description between the parties.

6.3 In the event one or more of the provisions of this agreement shall for any reason be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of the agreement, and this agreement shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been included in the Agreement. This agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement of the Parties to the Agreement and supersedes any prior understanding or written or oral agreements between the Parties respecting the subject matter of this agreement.

6.4 This agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created by this agreement are performable in Cameron County, Texas.

6.5 No party shall be required to perform any term, condition, or covenant in this agreement



Insurance :

Insurance proposals are up once again. We received quite a few proposals. The ones that had large deductibles or did not offer similar coverages we did not include in the comparison except we tried to include a proposal from each different carrier. Fortunately it looks like we can save some funds with decreased cost. I will review each.

2 - Blue Cross Blue Shield - This will give us the exact same coverage as we have now except that it will go down \$17.38 per employee per month. That will be a savings of over \$10,000. We have had great coverage and dealings with them and are happy with them.

3 - Humana - The cost is quite a bit lower but the deductible is higher, out of network deductible is a lot higher and most medicine is higher. Additionally this cost is not final. If we choose them they would have to rate us for a final cost that could be higher.

4 - United Health Care - It is a little higher cost and the deductible is quite a bit more that will require more out of pocket for our employees. Additionally the medicine and out of network is a lot more expensive.

5 - Aetna - The cost is a little lower but the deductible is higher, the out of network deductible is higher and the medicine is higher. Additionally this cost is not final. If we choose them they would have to reate us for a final cost that could be higher. We have had Aetna before and had much difficulty in them covering many items. We were not happy.

6 - TML - The cost is a little lower, the deductible is the same or lower, the out of network deductible is the same or lower, the medicine is a little higher. Additionally this cost is not final. If we choose them they would have to reate us for a final cost that could be higher. Other cities have said they are not happy with their medical TML coverage as it does not have good coverage.

I recommend staying with Blue Cross Blue Shield for health insurance with a reduction from \$563.26 to \$545.88.

Life Insurance:

We received proposals for insurance that we provide for each employee. The best deal is actually Companion Life but we have been with Dearborn for a while and don't know anything about Companion Life. It is only 1 cent different per employee per month so we feel it is wiser to keep the same coverage with the same company Dearborn.

I recommend approval of Dearborn for life insurance.

Consideration and ACTION to approve the first reading of Ordinance 479 amending Chapter 18, Article III, Sections 18-75 through 18-79 of the Code of Ordinances concerning the sale, use and discharge of fireworks in the City of Los Fresnos.

This ordinance attempts to address ongoing issues surrounding fireworks. Historically fireworks have not been permitted to be sold, used, transported or even possessed in the City limits. As you know it is very difficult to enforce all of those except the sales of fireworks. We feel that there needs to be a complete overhaul and new direction concerning fireworks. There is no reason why our residents can not possess fireworks inside the city. We also feel fireworks can be used as long as it is on private property during the proper selling dates within certain hours. Additionally we feel fireworks should be approved to be sold inside the City as well as long as it is in a proper commercial zone just like other businesses. The specific regulations are indicated in the attached information.

I recommend approval.

ORDINANCE NO. 479

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 18, ARTICLE III, SECTIONS 18-75 THROUGH 18-79 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES CONCERNING THE SALE, USE AND DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS IN THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS; AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance was introduced and submitted to the City Council for passage and adoption after the second reading of the Ordinance. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, TEXAS:

Chapter 18, Article III, Sections 18-76 through 18-79 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Los Fresnos, Texas is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18-80. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

FIREWORKS: Means any combustible or explosive composition or any substance or combination of substances, or article or device prepared for the purpose of producing or capable of producing a visible or an audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation. The term "fireworks" shall include, but is not limited to, firecrackers, bottle rockets, sky rockets, roman candles and sparklers. The term "fireworks" does not include automobile flares, paper caps, or plastic caps which contain 0.25 of a grain of explosive content or less per cap which are used with toy pistols, toy canes, toy guns or other similar devices.

Permanent Buildings or Facilities: Fireworks vending locations, are defined as a fireworks vending structure constructed out of brick, masonry, wood and/or metal with permanent foundations affixed to the ground that also provides safe, off-street, all weather paved parking and walking areas with proper curb cuts for safe ingress and egress of vehicles, permanently and

fully-lighted and accessible parking lots for their customers and the public at the location when the location is open to the public.

Portable Building or Facility or Sales Stand: Fireworks vending locations, are defined as nonpermanent structures that are independently transported separately and placed at their location regardless of having been connected to any existing or other placed non-permanent structure that provide for fully-lighted caliche parking and walking area, unless paved areas are already available at a location, which cannot revert to caliche once they are paved, with parking lot lighting on at night at all times that the location is open to the public, that have adequate curb cuts for the proper ingress and egress of vehicles and which portable buildings or sales stands locations were in existence.

Sec. 18-81. USE AND POSSESSION OF FIREWORKS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.

- (A) A person may use or possess fireworks without a permit or authorization from the city within the city limits only under the following conditions:
 - (1) Such use or possession must occur on private property;
 - (2) The person must own the private property on which he or she uses or possesses fireworks or must have received the prior consent of the property owners;
 - (3) There is not a burn ban in effect that applies to the property on which the person uses fireworks;
 - (4) Such use or possession occurs during the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. except on New Year's Eve and hour will be 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. on the days stated by State and County laws.
 - (5) A person may not use fireworks within 100 feet of a place where flammable liquid or flammable compressed gases are stored or dispensed.

Sec. 18-82. USE OF FIREWORKS BY MINOR.

A minor who is under 16 years of age and who uses or possesses fireworks in the manner provided by this chapter may do so only under the direct supervision of an adult who is at least 18 year of age.

Sec. 18-83. SALE OF FIREWORKS IN THE CITY LIMITS.

(A) Storage and sale of fireworks in the City of Los Fresnos will comply with all county and state rules, regulations, and laws, including Texas Occupations Code ch. 2154,

Texas Fireworks Rules for Retail Fireworks Sales and Storage, and all state fire laws applicable to the sale and storage of fireworks.

- (B) Fireworks may be stored in the City of Los Fresnos in the permanent building or facility.
- (C) With the exception of those dates approved by the county and state no fireworks will be on the premises of any portable building, facility or sales stand or adjacent buildings or warehouses located in said premises or property in the City of Los Fresnos. The fire marshal may inspect those locations to confirm that no fireworks are present and any violation shall be cited and subject to fine under this article. The owners and/or operators of those portable building locations that have not been moved in the off-season shall meet the fire marshal at the location in the off-season during normal business hours for inspections and failure to do so shall make the owner subject to fine under this article.
- (D) Permanent fireworks sales buildings must provide restrooms for the public and retail customers and for employees. Portable fireworks sales buildings or stands must provide portable toilets for the public and retail customers and employees at all locations where portable buildings are located. All bathroom facilities must comply with city health code regulations.
- (E) Portable building, facility or sales stand must obtain a permit, on an annual basis, before the buildings are placed at the location for the sale of fireworks. Fire marshal must inspect prior to each selling season.
- (F) Permits will be issued on or about the 31st of January each year.
- (G) Purchasers of fireworks must be at least 16 years of age. A fireworks vendor and/or the employee of said vendor that fails to comply with this requirement shall be subject to citation and possible fine for violation of this article.
- (H) Purchasers of fireworks within the City of Los Fresnos shall be allowed to possess fireworks for transporting purchased fireworks or as allowed in Section 18-81 and shall not be subject to citation for violation of this or any other ordinance of the City of Los Fresnos with regard to possession of fireworks as long as such purchaser is transporting said fireworks and said fireworks are inside bags or other similar container or as allowed in Section 18-81..
- (I) Those businesses operating permanent and portable buildings for the sale of fireworks to the public shall secure a public liability insurance policy with a combined single limit of not less than \$300,000.00 for personal injury, property damage or death of any person arising out of any act or omission on the part of the business or any agent or employee thereof and shall provide the city with a copy of said policy by January 31st of each year and failure to do so will result in a violation of this article and said locations shall not be allowed to sell fireworks until a copy of said policy is provided

to the city. Additionally, the City of Los Fresnos shall be given at least 30 day's notice prior to the cancellation of said insurance policy.

(J) Nothing herein shall prohibit the sale of fireworks at wholesale by a manufacturer residing within the city limits of Los Fresnos, provided such fireworks are shipped directly out of the State of Texas in accordance with United State Department of Transportation regulations by motor, rail, water, or other interstate transportation.

Sec. 18-93. SPECAIL EVENT FIREWORKS PERMIT.

A person who wishes to possess or use fireworks in a manner that differs from the authorizations described in this section may do so upon issuance by the city of a special event fireworks permit.

- (A) A person desiring a special events fireworks permit shall submit an application for such permit using the form provided by the city. Such form will require the name and address of the person(s) owning the property, the name and address of the person seeking the permit, the date and time of the event, estimate of the number of people in attendance at the event, the type of fireworks to be used at the event, any preventative or safety measures being implemented at the event and any other information as requested by the City Manager. Permission and consent of the landowner must be submitted with the application if the application is submitted by someone other than the landowner.
- (B) Prior to the issuance of the permit the city may require that the applicant submit proof of insurance for the event.
- (C) The City Manager shall issue the permit but may impose terms and conditions upon the permit that the city deems necessary for the safety of the public.
- (D) The permit applicant may appeal any special events fireworks permit decision of the City Manager to the City Council.

Sec. 18-94 PENATLY

- (A) A person commits an offense if he or she manufactures, sells, offers to sell, possesses for sale, ignites, detonates or possesses with intent to ignite or detonate any fireworks within the city limits in a manner not permitted by this chapter.
- (B) An offense under this chapter shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$2,000. Each day any violation of this chapter shall continue shall continue as a separate offense.

Sec. 18-95 SEVERABILITY.

Attachment: Ordinance on Fireworks (1995 : Firework Ordinance)

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Los Fresnos that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or section of the Ordinance.

SEC. 18-96 EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication of the caption of this ordinance as required by the City Charter and State law.

As I mentioned when we approved the budget, Republic Services increased garbage rates by 4% as allowed in the contract. The City has not increased rates in several years, absorbing the 4% or close to 4% each year. This has created some prices actually higher that what we charge. Attached is the information. I propose to increase the second garbage cart from \$11 to \$14 but leave the initial cart at \$20. Then I propose to increase the dumpster service to cost plus \$20 for a handling fee. Before we used percentages over the cost. I have always felt that unfair since it costs the City the same to handle an account with a 2 yard container picked up 1 time per week as it does an 8 yard container 5 times per week. I believe the \$20 is fair and easier to explain.

A. Wastewater Plant Upgrade - Naismith Engineering still does not have a description and cost estimates for the proposed work to be done that was promised by the middle of October so I can send to TWDB to get approval to proceed. Hopefully we will get that soon so we can send off. B. Water Plant Issues - We are waiting for the last bids to come in on removing the sludge and will get work done immediately within a few weeks. The filters have been repaired under warranty thanks to hard work by Carlos and his staff as well as Naismith Engineering. They have begun work of upgrades on all the TECQ suggestions that we can do in house. Guzman & Munoz Engineering is working on the more expensive and detailed items that need to be done by a contractor to include as part of the study he is doing so we can hopefully get funding through TWBD. They are also looking to see if there is a less expensive way to install a bypass now that will help tremendously.

C. Water & Wastewater Engineering Study - Guzman & Munoz Engineering continues to work on design, surveying, easements or property required for east and west Highway 100 as well as north on FM 1575. They are also studying all the existing water and wastewater lines in the city to determine which need to be replaced for various reasons. City staff is trying to get all the right of entry for possible easements.

D. Nature Park - The parking lot construction has begun and is going great. The restroom construction is set to begin any day. I will have the approximate cost and the savings for the meeting. The trails bid will be approved on Thursday. The Master Plan for the entire park will be ready to look at on October 18 as well.

E. Hike & Bike Trails - We are waiting to hear from property owners on one area where there is not sufficient right-of-way for the trail. Once we get that resolved Halff Associates can finalize the plans.

F. Montes/Castro Park - The Master Plan has been discussed in this meeting.

G. TxDOT Sidewalk Projects - The sidewalks on Arroyo Boulevard from Ocean Boulevard to Alvarez Court on both sides of the road and on Ocean Boulevard from Church's Chicken to Tapia's Cafe will be bid out in November. Once the bids are approved they will begin construction probably sometime in December.

H. CDBG 2015-2016 Grant - Once the contracts get signed and approved by TDA we will begin the process to get the street work designed by Naismith Engineering for East Sixth Street from Pita Street to Coma Street and East Ninth Street from Arroyo Boulevard to Coma Street. I. CDBG 2016-2017 - The administrative services and engineering services are being approved at this meeting. Over the next few months we will bring you some options on what we feel are the top priorities needed to be done with the available funds.

J. Welcome Sign - The project was approved by the CDC Board on November 7 and is up for your approval at this meeting.

K. Hazardous Mitigation Plan - We have the information posted at every cities web site and library for public comments. Once that is complete the plan will be brought to each city for approval. That will occur in the first quarter of the year.

L. TxDot Overlay - Foremost Paving completed the overlay. All looks great.

Light at Wal-Mart - TxDot has begun design on the light to be installed at Ocean Boulevard and Evergreen Street. They have not indicated what the schedule will be yet.







Hotspot usage for last 28 days V


