Additional soil samples were collected to determine what could be done get the compaction that is needed. The solution will be to dig an additional 8-12 inches deep and add fly ash. This material will dry out the soil and harden. This process would cost \$28,557. The money will be taken from the contingency fund which has a balance of \$100,000.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE LOS FRESNOS C.I.S.D. POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE LOS FRESNOS POLICE DEPARTMENT

THE STATE OF TEXAS

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

COUNTY OF CAMERON '

I. PARTIES

THIS AGREEMENT, is entered into by and between the LOS FRESNOS C.I.S.D. POLICE DEPARTMENT of the State of Texas, and hereinafter referred to as the District Police and the LOS FRESNOS POLICE DEPARTMENT, a city in the County of Cameron, Texas referred to hereinafter as the City Police Department. This agreement and service is entered into under the Interlocal Agreement Act. Any party paying for the performance of any function or service shall make these payments from current revenues available to the paying party.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to establish an understanding and cooperation between the District Police and the City Police Department.

The Los Fresnos Consolidated Independent School District (Los Fresnos C.I.S.D.) has established and communicated a policy clearly establishing the parameters of the District Police. The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. also understands the need to work with law enforcement agencies having overlapping jurisdiction with the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. Additionally, the City Police Department is equally dedicated to serving the public by coordinating and communicating with the District Police.

III. AGREEMENT

The City Police Department and the District Police agree to aid each other as may be requested and as each is capable. It is understood that the City Police Department has jurisdiction throughout the City of Los Fresnos and that the District Police have jurisdiction throughout the school district. It is also understood and agreed that the primary responsibility of the District Police will include law enforcement activities within school campus boundaries of the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. during normal school hours and at other times as may be necessary. The District Police will coordinate after school hours law enforcement activities with the City Police Department.

In anticipation of the need for the following services; use of the city jail facilities, prisoner transport to the Cameron County Jail (\$2,500), Dispatching Services, TCIC/NCIC, and Call Logging (\$7,000), communication services radio trunking usage – [15 radios @ \$10 monthly] \$1,980, and four (5) City Police Officers at the home football games for six (6) hours (5:45pm – 11:45pm) \$5,400, Additionally, in anticipation of the need for the use of the training facilities, and the gun range the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. Police Department agrees to pay the City of Los Fresnos Police Department the amount of two thousand five hundred and no/100ths dollars (\$2,500) annually for the use of these facilities. The total that will be paid to the City of Los Fresnos annually is Nineteenth thousand, three hundred and eighty and no/100ths dollars (\$19,380.00). These funds will be paid in March of 2019.

IV. TERM

The term of this agreement shall be for a twelve (12) month period from the date of this agreement. However, either party upon thirty (30) days written notice may terminate without cause this agreement.

V. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

- 5.1 <u>Governmental Functions</u>. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, this agreement is a contract for and with respect to the performance of governmental functions by governmental entities. The relationship of the City and the District shall be that of independent contractors.
- 5.2 <u>City Insurance and Indemnification</u>. The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. shall have no liability whatsoever for the actions of, or failure to act by, any officers, employees, subcontractors, agents or assigns of the City, or for or with respect to this Agreement, and the City covenants and agrees that:
 - 5.2.1 The City shall be solely responsible for and with respect to any claim or cause of action arising out of or with respect to any act, omission or failure to act by the City or its agents, officers, employees and subcontractors, while performing any function or providing or delivering any service undertaken by the City pursuant to this Agreement;
 - 5.2.2 The City shall be solely responsible for procuring and maintaining in effect any insurance coverage it may, in its sole discretion, deem necessary or appropriate to protect its interests.
- 5.3 <u>District Insurance and Indemnification</u>. The city shall have no liability whatsoever for the actions of, or failure to act by, any officers, employees, subcontractors, agents or assigns of the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D., or for or with respect to the this Agreement by the District, and the District covenants and agrees that:
 - 5.3.1 The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. shall be solely responsible for and with respect to any claim or cause of action arising out of or with respect to any act, omission or failure to act by the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. or its agents, officers, employees and subcontractors, while performing any function or undertaking any use of the Land and this Agreement;
 - 5.3.2 The Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. shall be solely responsible for procuring and maintaining in effect any insurance coverage it may, in its sole discretion, deem necessary or appropriate to protect its interests.
- 5.4 <u>Governmental Immunity</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, modify or amend any legal defense available at law or in equity to either the City or Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. nor to create any legal rights or claim on behalf of any third party. Neither the Los Fresnos C.I.S.D. nor the City waives, modifies, or alters to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Texas. No provision of this agreement is a consent to suit.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

- 6.1 This agreement contains the complete expression of the agreement between the parties hereto, and there are not promises, representations, agreements, warranties, or inducements except such as are made herein and fully set forth. Any party paying for the performance of any function, services, or improvements to the demised premises shall make these payments from current revenues available to the paying party. No alterations of any of its terms, covenants or conditions shall be binding unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties hereto. It is agreed that all of the rights, remedies, and benefits provided by this agreement shall be cumulative, and shall not be exclusive of any other rights, remedies and benefits allowed by law.
- 6.2 Nothing herein may be construed as the formation of a partnership, joint venture, or other business organization or any description between the parties.
- 6.3 In the event one or more of the provisions of this agreement shall for any reason be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of the agreement, and this agreement shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been included in the Agreement. This agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement of the Parties to the Agreement and supersedes any prior understanding or written or oral agreements between the Parties respecting the subject matter of this agreement.
- 6.4 This agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created by this agreement are performable in Cameron County, Texas.
- 6.5 No party shall be required to perform any term, condition, or covenant in this agreement so long as performance is delayed or prevented by force majeure, which shall mean acts of God, strikes, lockouts, material or labor restrictions by any governmental authority, floods, and any other cause not reasonably within the control of the parties and which by the exercise of due diligence the parties are unable, wholly or in part, to prevent or overcome.

VII.

7.1 The parties indicate acceptance of each of the terms of this agreement by the signature of their respective agents below. The agents signing below each represent that they have been authorized by their respective parties to execute this agreement on their behalf. The effective date of this agreement shall be the latest of the dates appearing below.

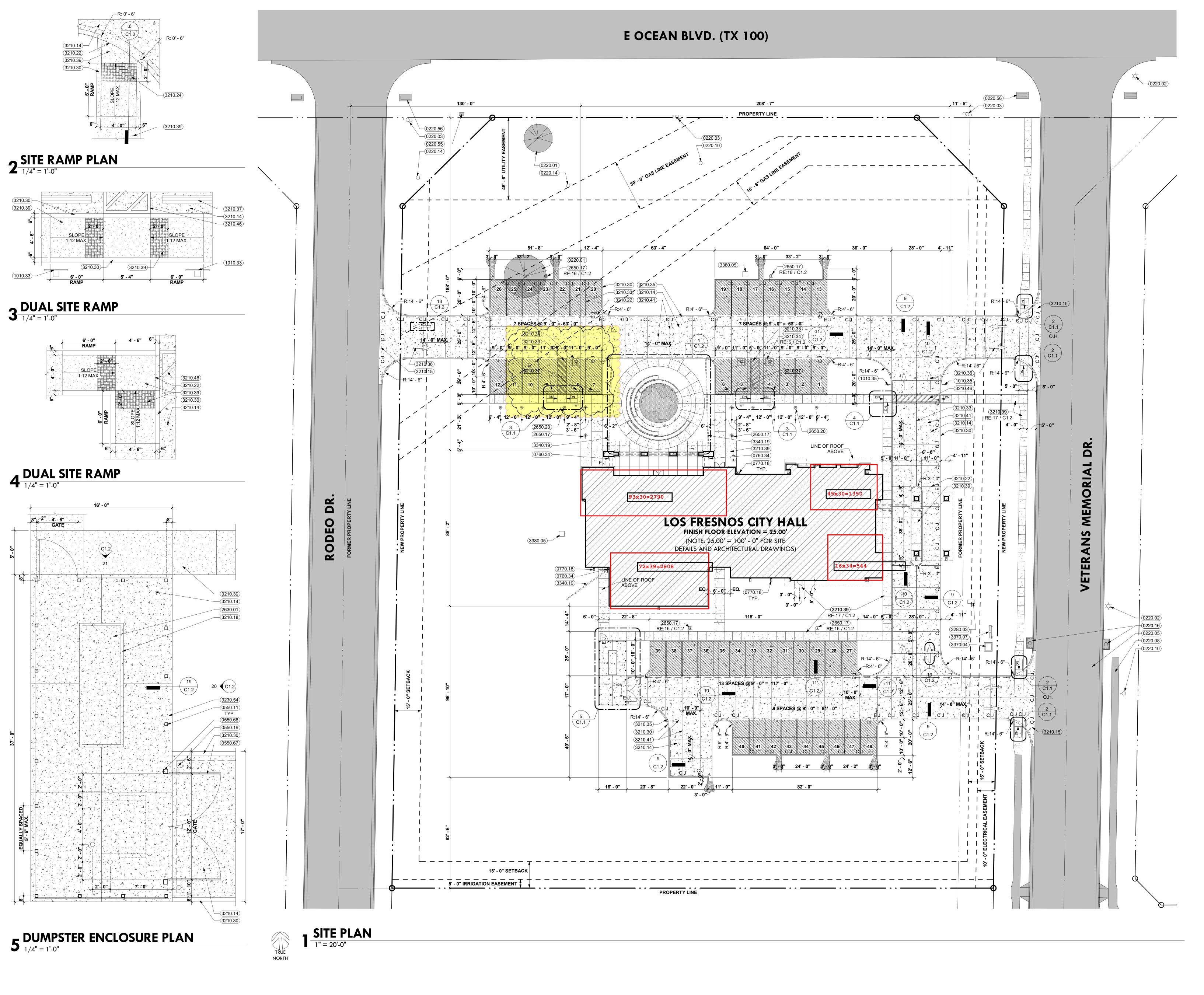

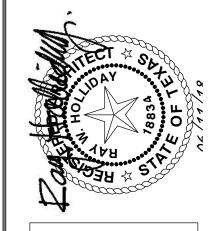

MOBILE AUDIO/VIDEO RECORDING SYSTEMS AND BODY WORN CAMERAS

General Order 49

Hector Gonzalez

Chief of Police

Subject: MOBILE AUDIO/VIDEO RECORDING SYSTEMS AND BODY WORN CAMERAS

Section 49.01 PURPOSE

This policy was created to provide guidelines and procedures for use, maintenance, and management of th mobile audio/video recordings systems and body worn camera equipment.

- A. The Los Fresnos Police Department is dedicated to utilizing body worn cameras in a manne that is fair and equitable to both citizens and employees.
- B. The use of body worn cameras is intended to accomplish the goals of:
 - 1. Enhance Department transparency to the public.
 - 2. Enhancement of officer safety.
 - 3. Enhancement of officer reporting, evidence collection, and court testimony.
 - 4. Enhance officer training.
 - 5. Protection from false claims of impropriety.
 - 6. Provide accurate documentation of events, actions, conditions, and statements mad during arrests and critical incidents.
 - 7. Document the quality of service provided by police officers.
- C. The Body worn camera recordings will be used for legitimate law enforcement purpose only and in accordance with applicable law and Departmental policies.

Section 49.02 POLICY

A. It is the policy of the Los Fresnos Police Department that officers shall activate mobile audio/video recording equipment and body worn cameras when such use is appropriate to the proper performance of their official duties, and that audio/video evidence of

- traffic and other law violations be available to present for prosecution. To this end, officers with properly functioning body worn camera equipment shall record all events surrounding the contact, stop, detention, interview and arrest of suspected violators and maintain this recorded evidence for consideration in criminal prosecution and internal investigations.
- B. All recordings generated on department-owned mobile audio/video recording equipment and body worn camera equipment are the property of the Los Fresnos Police Department. The copying or reproducing of any recordings generated by members of the department for use outside of departmental business is prohibited. A Los Fresnos Police Department supervisor will process requests for copies.
- C. Distribution of any recordings generated by department members in any format or for any purpose must be in compliance with this procedure and legal guidelines. Release of any recording created with a body worn camera by any officer, without the permission of the Los Fresnos Police Department, is a violation of Section 1 701.659 of the Texas Occupations Code, as amended.

Section 49.03 **DEFINITIONS**

- A. <u>Mobile audio/video recording equipment</u>- refers to a device mounted in a vehicle which capable of recording both audio and video.
- B. <u>Body Worn Camera Equipment</u>- refers to a recording device that is capable of recording or transmitting to be recorded remotely, video or audio and worn on the person of a peac officer, which includes being attached to the officers clothing.
- C. <u>Video</u>- refers to both video and audio recorded by either mobile audio/video recordin equipment or body worn camera equipment.

Section 49.04 MAINTENANCE OF EQUIPMENT

- A. All members of the Los Fresnos Police Department shall ensure that mobile audio/video recording equipment and body worn cameras are maintained in a state of operational readiness. Equipment malfunctions will be brought to the attention of a supervisor as soon as possible. Damaged body worn cameras will be returned to his/her supervisor.
- B. Officers shall be issued a body worn camera as well as the device's associated accessories. It will be the officer's responsibility to ensure the body worn camera device is fully charged and operable prior to their tour of duty. Body worn cameras are the responsibility of the individual officer and will be used with reasonable care to ensure proper functioning.
- C. No officer shall alter, modify, reuse, tamper with or disable the body worn camera or associated accessories in any manner. Department body worn camera equipment shall not be connected to an unauthorized computer, nor shall non-department-issued equipment be connected to any department-issued body worn camera device.

- D. Employees shall use departmental equipment in accordance with established departmental procedures and directives. Employees shall not, intentionally or through negligence, abuse, damage, or lose departmental equipment. Loss, theft, or severe damage to body worn camera equipment will be documented by the officers in an incident report and will be immediately reported to a supervisor. The supervisor will ensure that the incident report has been completed, and will draft a memo to the Chief of Police. In this memo the supervisor will make a recommendation regarding whether the officer should be required to make restitution.
- E. Officers who leave the department, or who are reassigned to duties where they will not be utilizing the body worn camera equipment, will return any body worn camera in their possession to a supervisor. The supervisor will ensure that the proper equipment issue form is completed and the placed in the officer's file.

Section 49.05 OFF DUTY USE OF BODY WORN CAMERA EQUIPMENT

Officers working extra employment within our jurisdiction will use their body worn camera while work extra employment if the employment is police- or security-related and approved by the department, but o in compliance with the Los Fresnos Police Department general orders and legal standards. Officers v download all evidence recorded during their off-duty employment no later than during their next regula assigned on-duty shift or when directed by a supervisor.

Section 49.06 BODY WORN CAMERA EQUIPMENT TRAINING

- A. Officers who utilize a body worn camera, and any other personnel who will come into contact with audio/video data obtained from a body worn camera, shall complete an
- contact with audio/video data obtained from a body worn camera, shall complete an agency approved and/or provided training program to ensure proper use and operation.

 Additional training may be required at periodic intervals to ensure the continued effective use and operation of the equipment, performance, and to incorporate changes, updates, or other revisions in policy and equipment.

 MOBILE AUDIO/VIDEO EQUIPMENT PROCEDURES assigned to patrol vehicles equipped with mobile audio/video recording systems shall to the following listed procedures:

 1. The officer shall carry the microphone/transmitter on his/her person and shall ensure that the transmitter and receiver are set to the same frequency and working properly.

 2. Officers will inspect and test the body worn camera prior to each shift in order to verify proper functioning. Officers will also ensure that the clip is in good condition and that the body camera worn camera is securely affixed to the officer's uniform. B. Additional training may be required at periodic intervals to ensure the continued

Section 49.07 MOBILE AUDIO/VIDEO EQUIPMENT PROCEDURES

- A. Officers assigned to patrol vehicles equipped with mobile audio/video recording systems shall adhere to the following listed procedures:

 - that the body camera worn camera is securely affixed to the officer's uniform.
 - 3. Officers shall not intentionally direct a person out of the camera's field of view to avoid having the contact visually recorded or turn off the transmitter while contact is being made.

- 4. Officers shall not erase, destroy, record over, tamper with, make an unauthorized copy, or otherwise alter an audio/video recording obtained from department mobile audio/visual recording equipment.
- 5. Citizens may not view mobile audio/video recordings in the field.
- D. Officers assigned to patrol vehicles equipped with mobile audio/video recording systems shall activate their audio and video recording systems when responding to and under the following conditions:
 - 1. All officer-initiated enforcement and investigative contacts to include traffic an pedestrian stops and field interviews.
 - 2. Anytime the officer's emergency lighting is activated while responding to a call for service.
 - 3. Any criminal investigation where the initial response required the activation (emergency lights and/or siren.
 - 4. Anytime an officer is in contact with a citizen or suspect when it is feasible that th video system may record all or part of the contact.
 - 5. Any officer involved in a fleet collision shall, unless physically unable to, immediate activate their video and audio recording system.
 - Any contact that becomes adversarial after the initial contact in a situation that woul not otherwise require recording.
 - Any situation that the officer believes may be later called into question, or wher mobile audio/video recording equipment footage would aid in the resolution of citizen complaint

Section 49.08 WHEN BODY WORN CAMERA WILL BE ACTIVATED

- A. While no officer shall be required to keep a body worn camera activated the entire shift, officers shall activate their body worn camera to record all contacts that are conducted within the scope of an official law enforcement capacity, including but not limited to:
 - 1. Before any enforcement stop, pedestrian or vehicle, officers will activate the body camera upon exiting the police vehicle. An officer may activate the camera any time prior to exiting the vehicle. If the BWC cannot be activated upon exiting the police vehicle, it will be activated as soon as practical and safe to do so.
 - 2. Upon arrival when on any call for service. Officers may activate the camera whil enroute to a call destination if they deem it necessary.
 - 3. During non-vehicle pursuits (foot, bike, etc.) as soon as the officer can do so safely.
 - 4. During vehicle pursuits in vehicles without in-car DVR systems, as soon as the office can do so safely.
 - 5. Upon arriving to all crime in progress calls as soon as the officer can do so safely.
 - 6. During the execution of a warrant or "knock and talk" operation.
 - 7. When requesting and conducting a consensual search of any type.
 - 8. Before any planned or anticipated arrest.

- 9. During the inventorying of seized narcotics, money, or any high value property.
- 10. During the inventorying of any vehicle that is being impounded.
- 1 1. When conducting the Standard Field Sobriety Test (SFST) or Drug Recognition Expe (DRE) test.
- 12. Any situation where the officer's training and experience causes him/her to believe the incident needs to be recorded to enhance reports, preservation of evidence, and aid is subsequent court testimony.
- 13. Any time an officer deems necessary.
- 14. Any situation that the officer believes may be later called into question, or where box worn camera footage would aid in the resolution of a citizen complaint.
- 15. Any incident or contact that may result in an enforcement action being taken or officire report being generated.
- B. Any decision not to activate the body worn camera because it is unsafe, unrealistic, or impracticable will be based on whether a reasonable officer under the same or similar circumstances would have made the same decision.
- C. If an officer fails to activate the body worn camera, fails to record the entire contact, or interrupts the recording, or in the event of equipment malfunction, the officer will document why a recording was not made, was interrupted, or was terminated in the officer's report, supplemental report, or call for service.

Section 49.09 USE OF BODY WORN CAMERA EQUIPMENT PROHIBITED

Officers are required to be responsible in their use of audio/visual recording devices and to avoid recordin in places where it would be inappropriate or prohibited by law. As such, no officer shall:

- A. Record or monitor another member without the second member having prior knowledge that he/she is being recorded or monitored. However, the Chief of Police or his/he designee may authorize exceptions for just cause or during internal/crimina investigations. Members shall assume that audio and/or visual recording equipment is activated under the following circumstances:
 - 1. While transmitting on a departmental radio channel.
 - 2. While speaking on a departmental telephone.
 - While responding as a cover officer to a call for service, traffic or pedestrian stop
 offense scene or other incident that would require the initial responding officer t
 activate his/her body worn camera.
 - 4. While in the vicinity of a Patrol Vehicle equipped with a video camera system.
- B. Use departmental audio and/or visual recording equipment for his/her personal use.
- C. Intentionally create recordings of themselves or other employees in areas where a reasonable expectation of privacy exists such as locker rooms, restrooms, etc.
- D. Knowingly record undercover officers or confidential informants.
- E. Allow citizens to view the body worn camera recordings in the field.
- F. Allow non-sworn individuals to view body worn camera recordings without permissio from the officer's immediate supervisor. Governmental employees who are directl involved in the investigation and/or prosecution of a criminal case related to the body wor

- camera video or who work in Internal Affairs or IT Services supporting body worn camer are exempt from this provision.
- G. Create recordings in patient care areas of medical facilities unless the recording is for official police business such as a criminal investigation, dying declaration, Horizontal Gaz Nystagmus (HGN) on injured drivers, or a specific call for police service; in compliance with Federal HIPPA regulations.

Section 49.10 DEACTIVATION

Officers may deactivate mobile audio/visual recording equipment or body worn camera, or discontinu recording, under the following circumstances:

- A. When the officer reasonably believes the privacy of the individual being recorde outweighs the needs of the state.
- B. At the conclusion of the precipitating event.
- C. When the event includes an extended contact that is not confrontational (including a interview with a witness or victim).
- D. When the event includes an extended perimeter, or on a prolonged event that is not of a adversarial nature.
 E. In those instances when an officer deactivates mobile audio/video recording equipment c
- E. In those instances when an officer deactivates mobile audio/video recording equipment c body worn camera equipment as described above, they should be mindful to resume th recording as soon as practical if necessary.
- F. Officers shall not discontinue the use of the body worn camera once it is in use if dictate by this policy to record.

Section 49.11 USE OF PERSONAL RECORDING EQUIPMENT WHILE ON DUTY

Members may not use personal audio and/or visual recording equipment while on duty.

Section 49.12 RELEASE OF RECORDINGS

Recordings made using mobile audio/video equipment or body worn cameras pursuant to this policy are department records and may only be released as provided by the Texas Public Information Act or for other authorized legitimate department business purposes. Release of body worn camera recordings shall conform to the guidelines established in Texas Occupations Code 1701 .661.

Section 49.13 DATA STORAGE AND RETENTION

- A. Mobile audio/video recording equipment
- 1. After the creation of a recording, officers shall be responsible for classifying the recording as one of the following:
 - a. Traffic Stop with Citation;
 - b. Traffic Stop with No Citation;
 - c. Arrest;
 - d. Junk/Test;
 - e. Pedestrian Contact;
 - f. Pursuit;

- g. Search/Consent/impound;
- h. Use of Force;
- i. Call for Service; or
- j. FTA / Warrant traffic stop.
- 2. All recordings shall be retained for a period of not less than 90 days.
- Recordings classified as Traffic Stop with No Citation, Junk/Test, Pedestrian Contac Search/Consent/impound, Call for Service, or FTA / Warrant traffic stop shall b purged after 90 days.
- 4. Recordings classified as Traffic Stop with Citation, Arrest, Pursuit, or Use of Force shabe maintained until the conclusion of any legal or administrative investigations.

B. Body Worn Camera Equipment

- 1. Unless authorized by a Corporal or above, body worn camera video shall b downloaded at the conclusion of the officer's shift.
- 2. Officers shall be responsible for classifying each recording as one of the following:
 - a. Traffic Stop with Citation;
 - b. Traffic Stop with No Citation;
 - c. Arrest;
 - d. Junk/Test;
 - e. Pedestrian Contact;
 - f. Pursuit;
 - g. Search/Consent/impound;
 - h. Use of Force;
 - i. Call for Service; or
 - i. FTA / Warrant traffic stop.
- 3. Supervisors shall perform daily checks of uploaded video to ensure that each recordin has been assigned a classification.
- C. In some situations, the supervisor may deem it necessary to take physical custody of the mobile audio/video recording equipment and/or body worn camera hard drive for preservation. It will be the supervisor's responsibility to maintain the integrity of the device(s) once seized and unload the video to the video recording system. These situations may include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Officer involved shootings;
 - In custody deaths;
 - 3. Incidents involving an officer that result in death or serious bodily injury to a person
 - 4. Fleet crashes where the unit is disabled; or
 - Officers otherwise not able to upload their recorded video to the video recordin system.

Section 49.14 SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. Weekly, supervisors will review at least one body worn camera and, if applicable, on mobile audio/video recording for each officer they supervise. Supervisors will record the following in the camera audit log
 - 1. The officer whose camera recording was reviewed;
 - 2. The date of the review;
 - 3. The type of camera recording (body worn camera or mobile audio/video);
 - 4. Incident type; and
 - 5. Supervisor name.
- B. Minor Infractions (not criminal in nature) discovered during the routine review of recorded material should be viewed as training opportunities and not as routing disciplinary actions. Should the behavior or action become habitual after being informally addressed, appropriate disciplinary or corrective action shall be taken.
- C. Supervisory personnel who manage employees using body worn cameras and mobil audio/video recording equipment shall ensure that:
 - Employees shall follow established procedures for the use and operation of bod worn cameras and mobile audio/video recording equipment, handling of vide recordings, and the completion of data transfer and documentation.
 - 2. All videos are uploaded prior to the end of shift. No videos are to be left on a bod worn camera at the completion of an officer's shift.
 - The need for repairs and or replacement of damaged or nonfunctional body wor cameras is reported and actions are taken to repair or replace these pieces of equipment.

Section 49.15 REVIEW OF RECORDINGS

- A. When preparing written reports, officers are encouraged to review mobile audio/visual and body worn camera recordings as a resource to ensure the accuracy and consistent of the report.
- B. Mobile video and body worn camera recordings are not a substitute for required writte reports.
- C. Members shall not retain personal copies of any recordings.
- D. Officers shall be given access to any recording of an incident involving the officer befor the officer is required to make a formal statement.
- E. Supervisors are authorized to review relevant recordings:
 - 1. Any time they are investigating alleged misconduct or reports of meritorious conduct
 - 2. Whenever such recordings would be beneficial in reviewing an officer's performance
 - 3. Periodically, for the purpose of verifying compliance with this policy or legar requirements.
- F. Recorded files may also be reviewed:

- 1. By officers for the purpose of ensuring that recordings are properly categorized for retention.
- 2. Pursuant to lawful process or by court personnel who are otherwise authorized t review evidence in a related case.
- 3. By media personnel with permission of the Chief of Police
- 4. In compliance with the Texas Public Information Act.

Consideration and ACTION to award bid for TxCDBG State Contract 7217269 contingent on TDA approval of Amendment #1.

Bids were received for the drainage project through funding from TDA, TxCDBG. As you can see there are a lot of options. We do this so we can make the best decision with the amount of funding available. The base bid of \$56,410.00 is for the drainage upgrades along the irrigation canal at the end of Ash Street, Ebony Street and Pecan Street. The Additive Number 1 is the drainage upgrades for the flooding issues on East 7th Street from the culdesac back to Ebano Street. The Alternate Number 1 is redoing the entire street instead of patching it thus causing problems later on. We will have a new street. Approving this will leave \$53,543.86 in grant funds available. As soon as TDA approves this we will request the remaining funds to be utilized on the repaving of Ash Street since it is where some to the drainage work will be done on the base bid. Ash Street is in desperate need of being totally redone. The only piece that we will not be able to do because there are not enough funds is the Olmo Street drainage. This would have place the open drainage ditch underground from Eighth Street to past Tenth Street. Being an open ditch does not cause any drainage problems so it is not necessary. The reason to do it would be for better looks, possibly a little safer, but mostly for saving on maintenance on mowing that cost about \$300 per mowing. At a cost of \$216,717.67 we can mow it over 700 times before it cost that much. As it is we probably only need it moved about 4-6 times a year.

I recommend approval of G&T Paving as the low bidder for the base bid in the amount of \$56,410 plus

the Additie Number 1 and Alternate Number 1 for the amount of \$144,046.14 for a total of \$200,456.14. Additionally requesting that Ash Street be approved using the same cost figures as 6th Street to utilize the remaining funds.

Consideration and ACTION to approve or reject an Inter local Agreement with Bayview Irrigation District.

Attached is an agreement with Bayview Irrigation District that will allow us to utilized their canal for drainage during major flood events. This would move water in areas that flood through the canal to the east to a drainage ditch owned by Cameron County Drainage District #1. The Drainage District likes that idea as it helps them as well. Bayview Irrigation District is still wanting to get their canal placed underground. If or when this occurs, the city will be allowed to install an drain pipe underground as well to pipe water to the east utilizing their right-of-way for the canal. Additionally, the City will be able to utilize the top portion of the right-of-way for hike and bike trails. Other benefits will be water loss savings for them and a better and easier maintained right-of-way. As a grant is received the City would be responsible for the match for the work on the area inside the City limits. This would be done in increments that the City can budget for and will come to the Council each time for approval. The first section would be from Highway 100 at O'Reilly Auto Parts going north to at least the turn to go east with a total cost estimate of \$300,000. For that project the 50% match would be \$150,000. For the right to use the canal and right-of-way they are asking the City to pay a 1 time fee of \$9,000.

I recomment approval of the interlocal agreement with Bayview Irrigation District.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION CONTRACT BETWEEN BAYVIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT NO. 11 AND CITY OF LOS FRESNOS

CONNECTING CANAL PIPING PROJECT

DATE:

This contract is made pursuant to TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE Chapter 791, by and between:

BAYVIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT NO. 11, having its office at 110 South San Roman Road, Bayview, Texas [mailing address, 110 South San Roman Road, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566] (hereinafter referred to as "IRRIGATION DISTRICT"), acting by and through its Board of Directors, and

CITY OF LOS FRESNOS, having its office at 200 North Brazil, Los Fresnos, Texas 78566 (hereinafter referred to as "CITY"), acting by and through its City Council.

1. SITUATION.

- 1.1 IRRIGATION DISTRICT wants to pipe its "Connecting Canal," an open irrigation canal, that runs from a point on Highway 100 in the City of Los Fresnos to its Main Canal near Bayview, Texas, a distance of approximately 7.4 miles. See Map 2.
- 1.2 Approximately 1.4 miles of the Connecting Canal is within the limits of CITY. CITY's extra-territorial jurisdiction extends one (1) mile beyond its limit. *See* Map 3.
- 1.3 IRRIGATION DISTRICT is going to apply for a grant to pay for preparation of the plans and the piping. It is likely the grant will require a local match of funds.
- 1.4 IRRIGATION DISTRICT has engaged Patty Alexander to prepare the grant application; her fee is \$4,000.00.
- 1.5 IRRIGATION DISTRICT has engaged Moore Engineering to provide the engineering information, cost estimates, and other technical data required for the grant application; its fee is \$5,000.00. That is, this fee is only for the grant application, and does not include the preparation of construction plans or work done on the project after the award of the grant. If the grant is awarded, Moore Engineering shall prepare the plans and serve as engineer for the project.
- 1.6 If the Connecting Canal is piped, the CITY wants to:
 - (a) Use the surface of the Connecting Canal right-of-way for a hike and bike trail and other recreational purposes. At a minimum, CITY wants to use that part of the right-of-way within the limits of CITY. If possible, CITY wants to use all or part of the right-of-way within its ETJ. If legally permissible, CITY, most likely in partnership with other entities, may want to use all or part of the right-of-way that is beyond the limit of its ETJ for a hike and bike trail and other recreational purposes.
 - (b) Provide drainage relief for that part of CITY north of the Connecting Canal by installing an underground drain pipeline in the Connecting Canal right-ofway to transport storm water to one of Cameron County Drainage District No. 1's drains.
- 1.7 Conceptually, during significant rain events, when IRRIGATION DISTRICT is not transporting water to its customers, the CONNECTING CANAL can accept storm water. Until the CONNECTING CANAL is piped:
 - (a) CITY wants to use the CONNECTING CANAL as a drain to transport storm water from one or more points east of the northwest corner of Block 170,

Fresnos Land & Irrigation Company Subdivision, to one of Cameron County Drainage District No. 1's drains east of Arroyo Boulevard/F.M. 1847, also known as Paredes Line Road:

- (i) At the most westerly point the storm water enters the CONNECTING CANAL, a gate shall be installed in the CONNECTING CANAL to prevent the back flow of storm water.
- (ii) At each point the storm water enters the Canal, there must be a gate that must remain closed until IRRIGATION DISTRICT authorizes the opening of the gate(s).
- (iii) At the point the storm water shall be discharged into Cameron County Drainage District No. 1's drain, hereinafter referred to as "diversion point", a gate shall be installed in the CONNECTING CANAL to prevent storm water from flowing past the diversion point. Put anther way, the diversion structure must be designed so that (a) when IRRIGATION DISTRICT is using the CONNECTING CANAL, the flow of water in the canal is unimpeded and no irrigation water flows into Cameron County Drainage District No. 1's drain.
- (iv) At the diversion point, a gate or other control structure shall be installed to prevent water from being discharged from the CONNECTING CANAL until the IRRIGATION DISTRICT authorizes the release of water from the CONNECTING CANAL.
- (b) Depending on the quality of the storm water and/or the capacity of IRRIGATION DISTRICT's system to accept the storm water, IRRIGATION DISTRICT may be willing to accept part or all of the storm water.
- 1.8 CITY is willing to pay (a) the cost of preparation of the plans for piping all of the Canal that is not covered by the grant, and (b) the cost of piping the canal in the segment designated by CITY that is not covered by the grant, provided that depending on the amount of the grant allocated to the cost of piping the canal, the piping of the CANAL within the segment designated by City may have to be done in phases, in which case, IRRIGATION DISTRICT shall apply for additional grants.

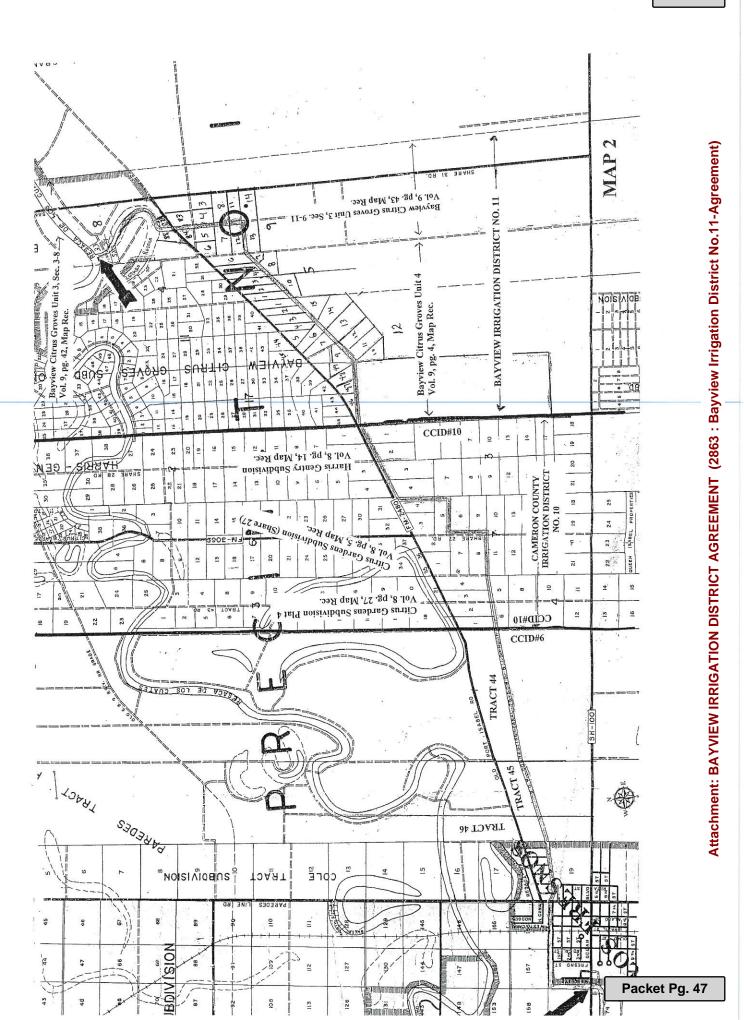

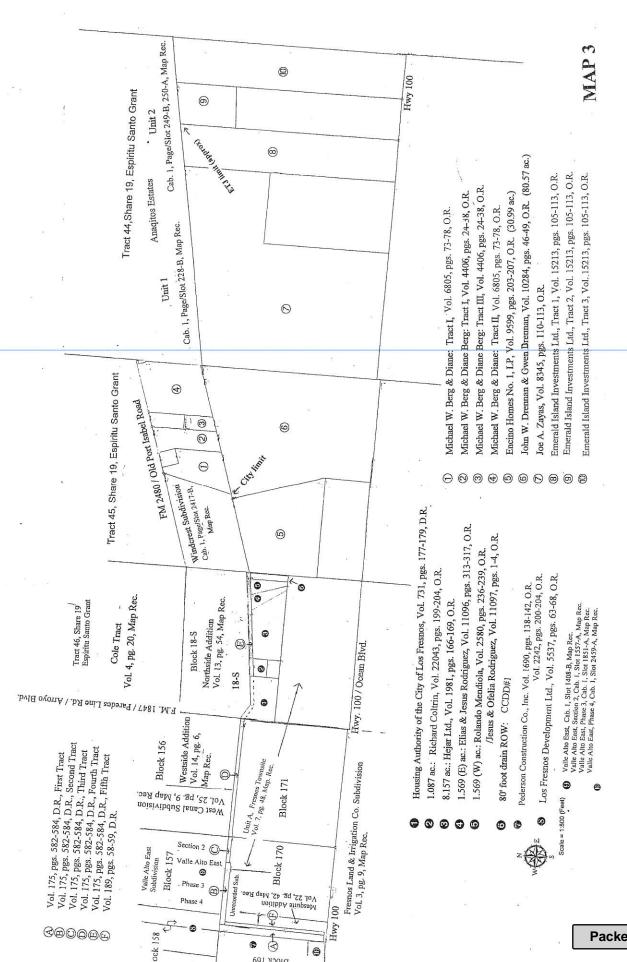
- 2.1 At the time this Interlocal Contract is signed, CITY shall pay to IRRIGATION DISTRICT the sum of \$9,000.00, the payment of which is hereby acknowledged by IRRIGATION DISTRICT.
- 2.2 CITY, at CITY's sole expense, shall determine the feasibility of using a segment of the CONNECTING CANAL as a drain as discussed in Paragraph 1.7. If CITY determines that using a segment of the CONNECTING CANAL as a drain is feasible:
 - (a) CITY, at CITY's sole expense, (i) shall prepare the plans for all necessary gates and other facilities and structures discussed in Paragraph 1.7, and (ii) construct the gates and other facilities.
 - (b) No construction shall commence until IRRIGATION DISTRICT's Board of Directors has approved the plans for the inlet and diversion facilities in writing.
 - (c) Until determined by IRRIGATION DISTRICT's Manager:
 - (i) the gates in the CONNECTING CANAL shall remain open, and (ii) the gates of the inlet(s) and outlet shall remain closed. That is, either after, or simultaneously with, the closing of the gates in the CONNECTING CANAL, the gate(s) in the inlet(s) and outlet can be opened. Provided, if IRRIGATION DISTRICT's Manager determines that IRRIGATION DISTRICT will accept part or all of the storm water, the gate in the CONNECTING CANAL at the diversion point shall remain fully open or shall be partially closed as determined by the Manager. At the conclusion of the storm event, the gates will be returned to the pre-storm event status. The managers of IRRIGATION DISTRICT and CITY shall be responsible for establishing the protocol regarding the opening and closing of the gates, including who opens and closes the gates.

- 2.3 CITY shall designate the segment of the CONNECTING CANAL that it wants piped, and CITY shall pay the cost of piping the segment designated that is not paid/covered by the grant. As discussed in Paragraph 1.8, the piping of the segment designated by CITY can be done in phases.
- 2.4 In consideration for CITY's payment of the costs required by Paragraphs 2.1 and 2.3, above, as each phase of piping is completed in the segment designated by CITY, IRRIGATION DISTRICT shall:
 - (a) convey to CITY the right to use the surface of the piped segment for a hike and bike trail and other recreational purposes:
 - (i) "as is" (there may be encroachments of fences and other improvements); and
 - (ii) subject to IRRIGATION DISTRICT's superior right to repair, and if necessary, replace the pipeline.
 - (b) convey to City an easement for the underground drain pipe discussed in Paragraph 1.6(b), above, as constructed.
- 2.5 This document constitutes the entire agreement between IRRIGATION DISTRICT and CITY and no representations, warranties, express or implied, inducement, promises, and agreements, oral or otherwise, between the parties not embodied herein, or in a duly adopted amendment hereto or Interlocal Cooperation Contract between IRRIGATION DISTRICT and CITY shall be of any force or effect.

he/she should report to a certain military facility for duty, physical exam, etc., then the employee will be paid under his/her own personal sick, annual, or compensatory time leave. If granted military leave, this leave of absence shall be in addition to any other form of leave with pay to which the employee is normally entitled and shall not exceed fifteen (15) working days or days for which the employee would normally receive pay in any one federal fiscal year.

4.11 Other Forms of Leave

- A. Attendance of conferences, schools, etc., on recommendation of Department Heads or on his own initiative, the City Manager may grant leave with pay, together with necessary travel and expense allowance, if deemed proper, in order to permit employees to attend conferences, schools, and similar events designed to improve their efficiency and considered as being beneficial to the interest of the City. Attendance of conferences or schools is to be limited to the financial provisions of each department for such training. (See Section 3.05 for travel guidelines).
- B. Jury and Court Service An employee who is legally summoned to serve on a jury or in court trials shall be permitted absence with pay by his/her Department Head for such duty.

4.12 Rest Breaks

Rest breaks will be fifteen (15) minutes duration, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Employees will arrange their rest breaks in accordance with department procedures to not interfere with City business. Employees will be entitled to this privilege as long as they do not abuse it. The City retains the right to require employees to work through breaks under special or emergency conditions.

4.13 Holidays

- A. Wastewater Plant Update Construction is ongoing for the sludge project. The plans and documents were sent to TWDB on December the 5th for the chlorine contact basin. The plans and documents will be sent to TWDB on December 12th for the headworks project. Once these are approve by TWDB we can advertise for bids. In a perfect world we hope to have bids to approve by the Council by February or at the latest March.
- B. Water Plant Update We have approval from TCEQ and TWDB to proceed with working to get the upgrades done on the water plant and distribution lines. Pablo will be working with our financial advisors, bond council and TWDB to apply for this funding. It is included in the study under C.
- C. Water & Wastewater Engineering Study The water & wastewater portions have been approved by TCEQ and TWDB. The Council approved asking for about \$1,600,000 to fix 3 lift stations, run sewer service to the new annexed areas on West Highway 100, replace some old manholes and replace some old sewer lines. There are no grants available for this but we can probably get a low interest loan. The intent will be to do this with no increase in sewer rates. The amounts we can save on repairs can go towards the loan payment. The Council approved the upgrades needed at the water plant and water system for \$3,700,000. We will look for funding for these 2 projects.
- D. Whipple Road Wastewater Extension Hanson Professional Services has the documents ready for us to advertise, bid, award contract and begin construction. The City has to acquire the easements prior to that. I have not had time to work on these easements. Hopefully that can be done soon.
- E. Nature Park Work is done for phase 2 except for the some signage that we are waiting to be completed. It really looks great. If you haven't gone by to see you should. I'd be glad to go with your. We are working on phase 3 so we can expend the rest of the funds from TPW which is about \$171,000.

- F. Hike & Bike Trails Halff Associates is working on the final design, the timeline and a construction estimate. We are still waiting on TxDOT to get final approval as they have discovered 2 plants that are on an extinct list so we will have to deal with that. Due to this delay Valley Baptist Legacy Foundation has requested that we return the unused funds. We have done that and once the project is cleared environmentally and we bid the project, we can start drawing funds as work is done. This is not a problem as most grants work that way (work is done and they release funds accordingly).
- G. CDBG 2017-2018 Grant This is to upgrade drainage on Ash Street, Ebony Street and Pecan Street along the canal as well as on East Sixth Street and Ebano Street. It also includes placing the drainage underground along Olmo Street from Eight Street to Tenth Street if funding is available. Hanson Professional Services was selected by the Council to do the engineering work. Bids will hopefully approved by Council at this meeting.
- H. Henderson Road Project Ambiotec provided me with exhibits so I can utilize them to meet with each property owner to work out an agreement with them if possible. I have not had time to work on them due to flooding and other projects as well as working on budget for next year. The environmental clearance has been approved by all agencies. Unfortunately some of the requirements may cause the project cost to increase. I asked Ambiotec if they could assist in acquiring the property for us but It will cost \$2,000 per property which would be over \$20,000. I will find time to get it done.
- I. City Hall Project Work is continuing.
- J. Building Inspections We are still working out the details to hire a candidate to handle inspections except the plumbing. It requires very specialized certifications.
- K. Underground Canal Bayview Irrigation District is interested in getting a survey done so estimated can be done for potential grants. They have now mentioned that they could possible allow us to use the canal to move the drainage water to the east to another drainage ditch. I met with the drainage district and they are meeting with their engineer to see if that will work for them. They feel it will be greatly beneficial and relieve so much water in the areas more prone to flood. Bayview Irrigation District also said they can allow us to place drainage in their ROW once the canal is placed underground. If they allow us to do that they would like us to pay \$9,000 for the use. The agreement will be on this agenda.
- L. Dog Park Wal-Mart is interested in moving this project forward. I called there real estate folks again but have not made any progress.
- M. Development & Annexation Plans Will work on this later in the year but annexation costs a lot of money that we don't have so I do not recommend any annexation plans at this time.
- N. Update Planning & Zoning Ordinance I am reaching out to firms that specialize in this work to assist us. Will share information when I get some data.

O. Economic Development - Retail Coach is out promoting the city to different retailers. The have had some good discussions with several potential retailers but nothing firm to report.

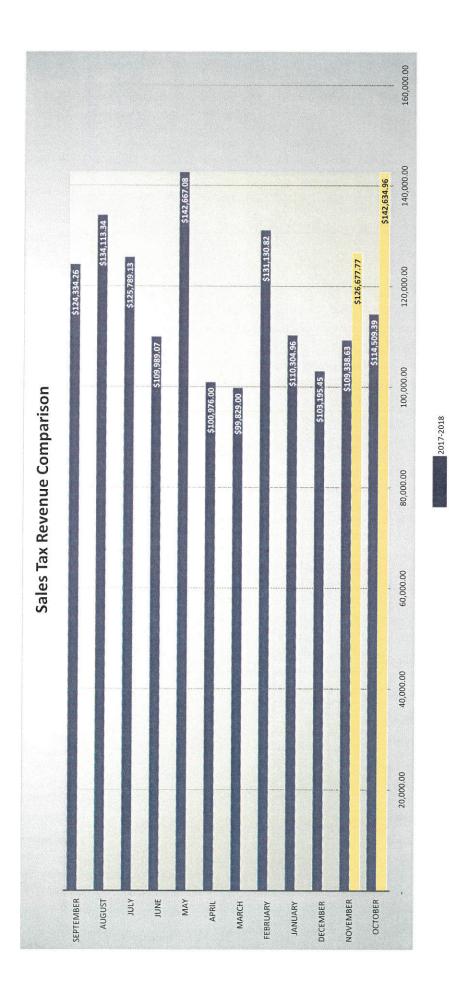
